

The Season of Creation is an international and ecumenical celebration of the goodness of God's work in nature, as we commit to being better stewards of it. Creation and faithful stewardship themes run through our Scriptures and music today.

Godly Play: Young children (ages 4-8) and their parents are invited to come downstairs to the Godly Play classroom, during the first part of the service ("Proclamation of the Word"). Ushers will alert the group to return in time for our annual Back-to-Class Backpack Blessing, following today's Announcements.

When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, `Rejoice with me, for I have

Humble our hearts enough to relate to our fellow creatures in distress, as St Francis named them true brothers and sisters. Give us the courage to act on behalf of those who silently endure injustice, and guide our steps in the way of righteousness and long-lasting peace. Enact in our world your life-giving will, O God, and may peace come to all of nature. For the sake of Jesus we ask,

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing

servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Living among us, Jesus loved us.
