Parishioner Registration: If you would like to join either of our parishes, please contact the rectory/church office. Registration, the practice of stewardship and regular participation in the sacraments, indicates that a person is an active member of the parish and is eligible to act as a godparent or a sponsor. As a church community seeking to be faith-filled disciples and good stewards, the sacrifice of our time, talent, and treasure is essential for the common good.

<u>Moving or joining a different parish:</u> Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request for the sick or homebound.

<u>Infant Baptism & Christian Initiation of Adults:</u> Call the church office, (814)536-0117.

Marriage: 9-month notice; pre-marital preparation required.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches

<u>Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass?</u> If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message for Fr. Matt. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

<u>Weekly Contributions:</u> If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please *use an offering envelope*. Be sure to write your **name and the amount given** clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

<u>Daily Mass Missals</u>—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

<u>Bulletin Deadline:</u> ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and <u>must include the name of the submitter</u>. Also, when there are multiple layers to an event, bulletin announcements need to be coordinated through the primary event planner to prevent conflicting submissions.


St. Vincent de Paul Conference of St. John Gualbert Cathedral:



St. John Gualbert Rorate Mass:

On Saturday, December 13th at 6:30AM St. John Gualbert Cathedral will be having a Rorate Mass.

As Fr. Canice explains: a Rorate Caeli Candlelight Mass is an Advent devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who yearned for the coming of our Lord. The name of the Mass, Rorate Caeli, reflects

Mary's yearning and ours for Christ's arrival. It originates from the first words of the Introit (Entrance Antiphon) in Latin:

"Rorate caeli desuper, et nubes pluant iustum" ("Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the Just One" – Isaiah 45:8).

On this day, Mass begins in darkness before sunrise, illuminated only by candles. This symbolic gesture reminds us of a world shrouded in darkness and sin, eagerly anticipating the arrival of Christ, the Light of the World. As the Mass progresses, our cry for the Light of Christ to come into our darkness is answered as the church gradually brightens and the rising sun fills it with the radiant light of day. Join us for this beautiful Mass in honor of our Lady, and allow it to deepen your longing for Christ's arrival.

There will be a reception following the Mass at the Activities Center for coffee and donuts.









Theology on Tap - Young Adult Group (18-39):

I'm writing to you today with encouraging news: Our diocese is renewing its efforts to foster vocations to the priesthood! Fr. Peter Crowe, our Vocation Director, has developed a strategic plan to inspire future priests, and we're excited about the path ahead.

Here is an update on how our diocese is working to cultivate vocations:

- We've formed a dedicated team of priests focused on vocation promotion, who are actively
