Parishioner Registration: If you would like to join either of our parishes, please contact the rectory/church office. Registration, the practice of stewardship and regular participation in the sacraments, indicates that a person is an active member of the parish and is eligible to act as a godparent or a sponsor. As a church community seeking to be faith-filled disciples and good stewards, the sacrifice of our time, talent, and treasure is essential for the common good.

<u>Moving or joining a different parish:</u> Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request for the sick or homebound.

Infant Baptism & Christian Initiation of Adults: Call the church office, (814)536-0117.

Marriage: 9-month notice; pre-marital preparation required.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches

<u>Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass?</u> If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message for Fr. Matt. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

<u>Weekly Contributions:</u> If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please *use an offering envelope*. Be sure to write your **name and the amount given** clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

<u>Daily Mass Missals</u>—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

<u>Bulletin Deadline:</u> ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and <u>must include the name of the submitter</u>. Also, when there are multiple layers to an event, bulletin announcements need to be coordinated through the primary event planner to prevent conflicting submissions.

From the Rector/Pastor.

I remember growing up, I loved watching Sci-Fi shows and movies. It was interesting to see the different visions people had for what the future might hold. Some were adventure stories like Star Wars, as a new force started to rise in this troubled future world. Others were stories of journey and hope, like Battlestar Galactica (old and new) where a group left their old home to journey to a new one. Some stories, like Star Trek, imagined a utopia where humanity had come to terms with scarcity and now lived in a near perfect world, as they went out to explore and encourage others to accept and grow into a kind of universal peace. What's remarkable though, as I look back, is that nearly every one of those stories had something in common....In the not too distant future from our own time, the whole world collapsed in some apocalyptic nightmare. Then, from the ashes of the old civilization, a new and promising world had come forth.

I don't think I realized it at the time, but in a way, every one of those stories is ultimately modeled after the greatest story of all time, the story of salvation history. Ours is a story of a creator, who loved his people so much, he became one of us, so that at the moment when the powers of the world were at their greatest, they put the author of life to death on a cross...and yet He rose from the dead conquering death forever. That cross, once a symbol of death and fear, became the symbol of a new world.

In the early Church, can we even imagine those who had never heard of Christianity. These Christians met in secret and kept as their symbol, the image of the world's most brutal punishment, crucifixion. When they were caught and arrested, they went willingly to their deaths sharing the good news of this God who had gone before them. They forever transformed a roman word Martyr, which used to simply mean witness into a word that came to mean witnessing with one's very life. As the early Church father Tertullian said, the blood of the Martyrs became the seed of the Church, and soon they converted the whole world, spilling no blood other than their own.


This weekend we celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, it's that very cross that is the symbol for our faith, and the symbol to the world of who we really follow.

Right now, in many ways, our world is beginning to feel like the worlds of those Sci-Fi books and movies just before the great crash. Everywhere, we see senseless violence and a people more willing to lash out than to discuss. When we see the stories of shootings of political speakers, schools, or even churches, the world can feel like it's falling apart at the seams. Everywhere, it can feel like what ought to be political discussions, quickly devolve into shouting matches that end up dehumanizing whoever happens to be the "other" until the only solutions imaginable are tragically final ones.

Right here though, we have the answer to a broken, dying world...because we follow a God who knows his way out of the grave. The answer to the mess that is our world, is

now and has always been the same. The answer, is the witness of the cross. In light of the chaos of our world, I just read this week that the initial investigations are beginning to see if the children who were killed at recent shooting in Minneapolis will meet the formal criteria for martyrdom. Following the cross means refusing to be controlled by the forces of the world that threaten us. Crucifixion was the most powerful threat the Romans had. A new faith that said, if our God can conquer death, we have nothing to fear, meant that the Romans could no longer have power over them. It was those first Christians, who went out into the world without fear, who changed the world. People looked at them and said, "I don't know what they have, but I want it...and so Tertullian's words came true as the blood of the martyrs became the seeds of the Church.

Are we prepared in our world to stand up anyway, in spite of all that is going on, and follow that same Cross? It's a certainly challenge and yet, it's no greater challenge than the ones faced by the saints of every age. It is the challenge of the cross, and the challenge of Christ.
