Parishioner Registration: If you would like to join either of our parishes, please contact the rectory/church office. Registration, the practice of stewardship and regular participation in the sacraments, indicates that a person is an active member of the parish and is eligible to act as a godparent or a sponsor. As a church community seeking to be faith-filled disciples and good stewards, the sacrifice of our time, talent, and treasure is essential for the common good.

Moving or joining a different parish: Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request for the sick or homebound.

Infant Baptism & Christian Initiation of Adults: Call the church office, (814)536-0117.

Marriage: 9-month notice; pre-marital preparation required.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches.

Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass? If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message for Fr. Matt. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

Weekly Contributions: If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please use an offering envelope. Be sure to write your name and the amount given clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

Daily Mass Missals—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

Bulletin Deadline: ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and must include the name of the submitter. Also, when there are multiple layers to an event, bulletin announcements need to be coordinated through the primary event planner to prevent conflicting submissions.

St. Vincent de Paul Conference of **St. John Gualbert Cathedral:**

Members of St. Vincent de Paul are called to be servants of the poor. And, mercy, says St. Vincent, is the "proper attribute of God himself." Mercy is part of charity that calls us first to identify in spirit with the other person. St. Vincent also tells us, "To be compassionate toward the sufferings of our neighbor and to weep with him...to soften our hearts and to render them responsive to their sufferings and miseries." Mercy calls as well for outward signs or gestures. As St. Vincent observed, "Heart and hand should go together as far as possible." He urges, "Weep with your poor and your sick. God has appointed you to be their consolation...Serve the poor with gentleness, compassion, and love." The faith-filled person sees Jesus in others and responds to any situation with Jesus' love and mercy. Faith is faithfulness in action, "love gains for us an entrance into the hearts of others."

Lord, increase our faith and give us compassionate hearts filled with mercy. Give us the grace to weep with those we serve and forgive us the times when we judged or condemned them. May we bring consolation to those who are suffering and may our heart and hand always go together.

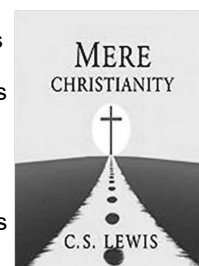

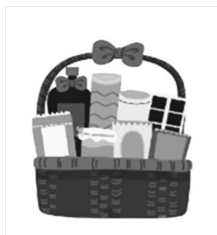

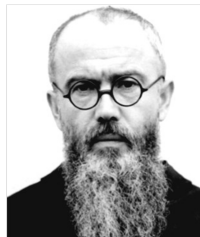

Triumph of the Heart:

The Sacred Heart Province of the Third Order Regular Franciscans is sponsoring a free showing of "Triumph of the Heart," on Sunday, October 19 at 7:00 p.m. at AMC Altoona 12.



The movie is about the incredible story of Saint Maximilian Kolbe. His entire life was marked by a fierce and unwavering love for the Immaculate Virgin Mary. As a child, he experienced a vision of Our Lady offering him two crowns—one white, symbolizing purity, and one red, symbolizing martyrdom. When asked which he desired, he boldly replied, "Both." He grew to become a brilliant evangelizer, founding the Militia Immaculata, a movement dedicated to leading souls to Christ through total consecration to Mary, battling sin and darkness with devotion and truth.

His love reached its greatest expression in the German death camp of Auschwitz. When a fellow prisoner—a husband and father—was condemned to die, Kolbe selflessly volunteered to take his place. He suffered starvation with peace and prayer before ultimately receiving a lethal injection, giving his life out of love.

UNIQUE RELIGIOUS EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY:

Starting in January 2026 All Saints Parish in Boswell will begin Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS), a Montessori based approach to religious education for children ages 3-6. CGS is held in a specially prepared space called an "atrium," where children use beautiful, hands-on materials, to explore the life of Jesus, the liturgy, and scripture at their own pace. Through prayer and contemplation, CGS fosters the child's natural and joyful relationship with God.

The session usually lasts around 2-3 hours and will be held during the week (time and day to be determined by interest - either in the evening or during the day) in a space specifically set aside by the parish for CGS. 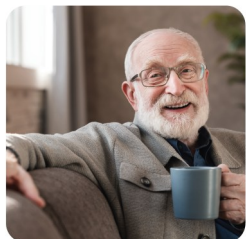
