Parishioner Registration: If you would like to join either of our parishes, please contact the rectory/church office. Registration, the practice of stewardship and regular participation in the sacraments, indicates that a person is an active member of the parish and is eligible to act as a godparent or a sponsor. As a church community seeking to be faith-filled disciples and good stewards, the sacrifice of our time, talent, and treasure is essential for the common good.

Moving or joining a different parish: Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request for the sick or homebound.

Infant Baptism & Christian Initiation of Adults: Call the church office, (814)536-0117.

Marriage: 9-month notice; pre-marital preparation required.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches.

Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass? If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message for Fr. Matt. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

Weekly Contributions: If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please use an offering envelope. Be sure to write your name and the amount given clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

Daily Mass Missals—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

Bulletin Deadline: ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and must include the name of the submitter. **Also, when there are multiple layers to an event, bulletin announcements need to be coordinated through the primary event planner to prevent conflicting submissions.**

Flocknote: Flocknote enables us to send large group emails and text messages. If you would like to receive the general notices and reminders about upcoming events in the parish, requests for help/volunteers, the bulletin published to the website, and other updates, use these instructions to sign up if you have not already done so.



Fr. Canice's Thoughts:

Allow me to draw your attention to the important role of St. Joseph in today's Gospel. When Joseph discovers that Mary is with child, we learn of his intention to divorce Mary quietly. While some may be quick to assume Joseph's suspicion that Mary was unfaithful to him, the gospel story simply does not support this theory. Notice that the Angel Gabriel did not say "do not be suspicious of your wife," but "do not be afraid" to take her into your home. From this we can reason that Joseph was not suspicious of infidelity but, perceiving that something extraordinarily holy was happening within Mary, he felt his own unworthiness and decided to distance himself from the mystery out of respect and reverence. Despite this hesitation, when Joseph receives his call from the Angel to take Mary into his home, he responds readily and faithfully. As St. Joseph was a true virginal father and protector of Jesus and Mary, he also is a father and protector of our family, the Church! St. Joseph, protector of the universal Church and terror of demons, pray for us!


Do You Have an End of Mass Announcement?

Stewardship Reflections for December 21, 2025 – 4th Sunday of Advent:



As our Advent preparations draw to a close and Christmas fast approaches, it is fitting that today's readings demonstrate the intensity of the Father's perfect and passionate love for each of us, culminating in the gift of His own Son, Jesus Christ, on Christmas Day. As we reflect on the enormity of this gift, let us ask ourselves what we can offer in return.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, we find an unparalleled example of one who embraced the stewardship way of life in St Joseph, as he responds to God's call to him through the message of an angel. St Joseph immediately and humbly obeys the instruction from the angel: "Do not be afraid to take Mary

your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Open to this extraordinary role, he did as the angel commanded and 'takes Mary into his home.'

Let us imitate St Joseph, then, as good stewards, giving our very lives to those around us in love and gratitude to God who has given us everything we have, especially His own Son, Jesus Christ. From the Rector/Pastor:

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; Upon those who lived in a land of gloom a light has shone...

For a child is born to us, a son is given to us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful, Upon David's throne, and over his kingdom, which he confirms and sustains by judgment and justice, both now and forever.

This week we celebrate Christmas. A Savior is born to us who is both Christ and Lord, and of his kingdom there will be no end. Jesus is the light that came into a dark world. He was and is THE turning point of all of human history.

In our own lives we have lots of smaller turning points, moments when we see the light in the darkness, when we see real hope.

This year has been a year of endings and new beginnings here in town. It has been a year of changes. As a Church, we watched the death of Pope Francis and the election of the first Pope from the United States with Pope Leo. Locally, We watched the building next to our activities center burn down, opening the possibility for a parking lot at St John's. We tore down the Convent at St Patrick's, dramatically opening the space, and we watched in town as Central Park is being redone. It felt so different going to watch the Tree lit up over at PNG Park this year after having the park at Central Park for so long, just as it still feels different walking to the activities center or pulling into the parking lot at St Patrick's. We also said our farewells to Fr Simon as he moved up the hill to St Benedict's and welcomed Fr Canice who is only just getting started here.

In my own family, this has been quite the year of change, as two of my nieces were married this year, and another has a wedding very soon. They're each setting up their new families, and welcoming new life into the world. Yet, they've also moved away and the people at the holiday tables are changing for us. There's something about

holding a little baby that reminds us that not only is the world always changing, but it's always being renewed and restored with new life.

Really, that is the way of things. Times do change, life marches on, and if we try to hold things just as they are, we find them slipping away from us, but if we're willing to grow, through Christ the world is constantly being renewed.

I think that's part of the beauty of the Christmas Season. The Savior of the world doesn't appear on earth suddenly out of nowhere already full grown. He comes to us as a tiny, helpless infant. Then, he lives, grows, and ultimately dies on a cross for our sins, that He might rise again in newness of life, so that might rise with him and celebrate eternally in heaven. That's the challenge...life keeps moving, and we're called to keep growing with it. Growing, learning, moving, and becoming all that God has called us to be.

I ran across a quote recently from Pope Leo the Great in around the year 450. He said the purpose of Christmas was...

to give the human race a wondrous grace so that iniquity might return to the ways of innocence, old age to newness of life, strangers might be received by God as His children and without any claim be capable of entering into an inheritance, that the evil-living might begin to live righteously, the parsimonious become generous, the incontinent chaste, and the earthly might become heavenly-minded.

As we celebrate this Christmas, are we prepared really, to embrace the newborn king, to welcome that return to innocence, the return to newness of life, so that all on earth might, as Saint Leo the Great says, become heavenly-minded.
