Amen

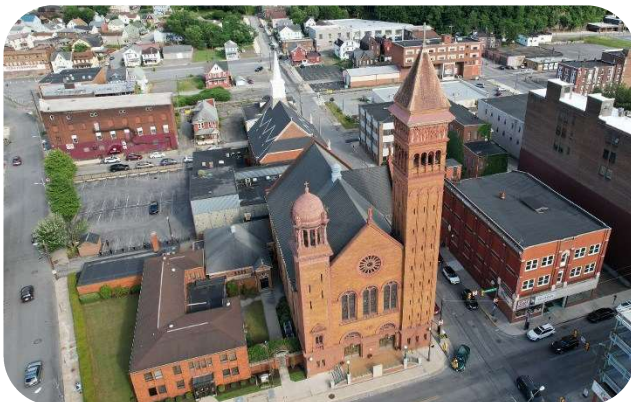

### Stewardship Reflection:

#### June 21, 2026 – 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings call us to tackle the challenging issues of fear and trust – two concepts on opposite sides of the same coin. They must be confronted and dealt with by all of us who wish to live the stewardship way of life.

In our first reading, from Jeremiah, the prophet expresses sentiments we have all felt at some point in our lives, when he says, "I hear the whispering of many: 'Terror on every side!'" Perhaps this 'whispering' comes from the culture that insists we must think of ourselves, our own interests, our financial comfort first – only when we are certain that our own needs are met can we think of serving God and sharing with others. Perhaps when we consider stepping out of our comfort zones, the fear-inducing whispers come from within us – "you're too weak, too selfish, too broken to really live as Christ's disciple." Yet, just when Jeremiah is nearly overcome with fear, he remembers the truth, and it is just as true for us today. "The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion." Of course!

Let's stop wasting any more time with fear. Instead, let's put all our energy, all our time, our talents and our treasure into trusting this great God, and using all that we are and all that He has given us to bring Him glory.

**Mass Intentions:** ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches.

**Anointing of the Sick/Homebound:** Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass? If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.


**Weekly Contributions:** If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please use an offering envelope. Be sure to write your name and the amount given clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

**Taking up the Gifts:** If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

**Daily Mass Missals**—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

**Bulletin Deadline:** ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and must include the name of the submitter.

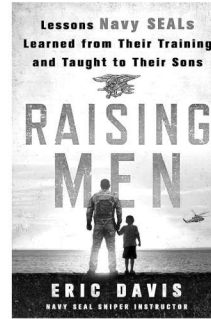

## Fr. Canice's Thoughts:

Happy Father's Day!

Although this is not a feast day on the Catholic calendar, it is always a joy when the secular world gets it right from time to time! Fatherhood is such a gift!

The Catholic Church has always held fatherhood in the highest regard! It has such a dignity and glory! Like motherhood, it is an extraordinarily high calling because, through an earthly father, children come to know the love of God, the Father!

Even Jesus Himself experienced the Love of God the Father through His Virginal Father, St. Joseph! Pope Francis gave us remarkable insight into this mystery in his Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde* (Section 4, "An Accepting Father") when he reflected on the parable of the Prodigal Son (which should be more accurately titled "The parable of the Merciful Father"). In regards to the character of the Merciful Father, Pope Francis sates:

"I like to think that it was from Saint Joseph that Jesus drew inspiration for the parable of the prodigal son and the merciful father (cf. Lk 15:11-32)."

This is a theologically rich and tender line. Pope Francis is saying that Jesus used Saint Joseph as a pattern, reflection, or image to think about God the Father.

In the second section of the letter, Pope Francis explains how it was through Joseph that Jesus saw "the tender love of God," calling upon all of us to "learn to look upon our weaknesses with tender mercy."

In other words, the merciful father who runs to embrace his wayward son, who refuses to condemn but instead restores dignity — that image of fatherly love was something Jesus knew firsthand. He had lived it with Joseph in Nazareth.

As the letter also states: "God's truth does not condemn, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us. That truth always presents itself to us like the merciful father in Jesus' parable (cf. Lk 15:11-32). It comes out to meet us, restores our dignity, sets us back on our feet and rejoices for us."

What a beautiful mystery — that the Son of God, who is mercy itself, learned from a human father what mercy looks like in the flesh. Joseph, the silent saint, left no words in the Gospels, yet his love echoed in one of the greatest parables ever told.

So, today, we give thanks to God for the gift of our fathers! May they continue to be a beautiful witness of God's love for us in the world!
