It is important for us to keep accurate records when time comes for sacraments, certification as a Baptismal/Confirmation Sponsor, as well as charitable giving notices. If you would like to register or have moved, please fill out a registration form at the entrance and drop it in the collection.

Moving or joining a different parish: Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches.

Anointing of the Sick/Homebound: Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass? If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

Weekly Contributions: If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please use an offering envelope. Be sure to write your name and the amount given clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

Daily Mass Missals—If you would like a copy of "the Word Among Us" daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

Bulletin Deadline: ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and must include the name of the submitter.

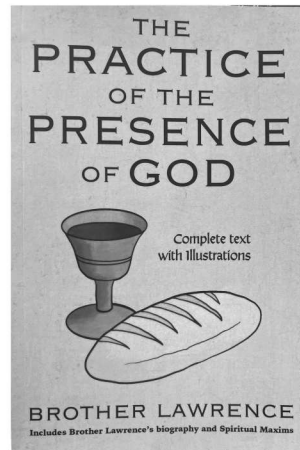

Fr. Canice's Thoughts:

This week we celebrate the Feast of St. Anne, the Mother of the Mother of God, Mary, and the grandmother of our Lord Jesus Christ. Her story is one of faith, miracles, and the tender providence of God.

I'd like to share with you two powerful stories of miracles attributed to her relics and her powerful intercession.

One ancient account tells us that her sacred relics miraculously brought the Gospel to 1st century pagans in France. At the time, Catholicism was being persecuted throughout Israel. A group of Christians including Mary Magdalene and Lazarus were loaded on a small boat and pushed off to sea with no oars. Yet, with the relics of St. Anne on board, the tiny vessel miraculously arrived on the shores of France and, amazed at the mighty miracle, the pagans received the Gospel message with awe and wonder! Our Lord's grandmother's bones, carried across the sea by angels, became an instrument of salvation for countless souls. What faith St. Anne's intercession stirred in those who beheld her miraculous relics!

The second story is equally awesome and wonderful. By the 8th century the relics of St. Anne had gone missing. During an earlier period of danger, the relics of St. Anne were hidden in a church for protection, yet the exact location had been forgotten. Years later, a boy born deaf, mute, and blind was attending Mass. He began to repeatedly and frantically strike a stone step in the church. Emperor Charlemagne, who was present, grew curious and ordered the stone step to be removed. As a stairwell leading to a lower hidden room of the church was revealed the mute boy began to exclaim "It is her!" Leading the congregation through the stairwell he arrived in a room miraculously lit by a vigil candle sitting next to wrappings inscribed with the words "here are the relics of St. Anne." Upon touching the relics, the boy regained all of his senses.

This sign from heaven confirmed what the faithful had long known: St. Anne, the grandmother of Jesus, intercedes mightily for us. Let us ask St. Anne to pray for our families, our children, and our grandchildren. Let us trust in her love and seek her protection as she kept vigil over Mary, the greatest of all mothers, and over the Child who is our Savior.

Dear Friends,

As you may know, our vocation office has increased efforts over the past year to reach young men and invite them to consider the priesthood. Our Called by Name initiative resulted in 422 nominations. Thanks be to God, we now have three new seminary applicants for Fall 2026, which would bring our total to four seminarians for our diocese.

As we continue to increase the number of seminarians for our diocese, the cost of their formation also grows. While this is a wonderful blessing and a "good problem to have," we need additional support to fund their education and care. It costs approximately \$65,000 per year for each seminarian, which covers their tuition, room and board, and health insurance.

With that in mind, I am humbly asking for your prayers and financial support for the upcoming **Fishers of Men Vocation Appeal**, which will take place in all parishes on the weekend of **August 1-2**.

The funds raised through this appeal will directly support our men in formation and ensure we can continue actively accompanying those discerning a priestly vocation here in the Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown.

Many of you will be receiving information in the mail about this appeal, and everyone will hear more about it next weekend at Mass.

Thank you for your steadfast faith, your generosity, and your enduring commitment to building a culture of vocations across our diocese. Please continue to pray for our seminarians and for an increase in vocations to the priesthood.
