

Office Hours: Monday through Friday 9AM - 3PM.

Parishioner Registration: If you would like to join either of our parishes, please contact the rectory/church office. Registration, the practice of stewardship and regular participation in the sacraments, indicates that a person is an active member of the parish and is eligible to act as a godparent or a sponsor. As a church community seeking to be faith-filled disciples and good stewards, the sacrifice of our time, talent, and treasure is essential for the common good.

Moving or joining a different parish: Please remember to notify us if you have a change of address or will be leaving either of our parishes so we can update our records and notify the diocese of the change.

Anointing of the Sick: Upon request for the sick or homebound.

Infant Baptism & Christian Initiation of Adults: Call the church office, (814)536-0117.

Marriage: 9-month notice; pre-marital preparation required.

Mass Intentions: ALL mass intentions are handled through the St. John Gualbert office. If you would like to have a mass offered, please fill out the form in the churches or available on the parish website, put it in an envelope with the mass donation (\$10) and drop it off in the collection basket or at the parish office. A copy of the rules and policies for Mass intentions are also available in the churches.

Do you know anyone who can't make it to mass? If you have a family member who is sick or infirmed and unable to attend mass, please let us know. Father makes periodic rounds to visit the sick. In time, we would also like to find Eucharistic Ministers to do the same. If there is ever an emergency, call the parish number and leave a message for Fr. Matt. It is very important that those who are seriously ill or in danger of death are able to receive the sacraments, but we don't know unless you tell us. Don't be afraid to call.

Weekly Contributions: If you would like your cash gifts to be reflected on your giving statement, please *use an offering envelope*. Be sure to write your **name and the amount given** clearly on the offering envelope to insure proper credit. If you attend at another parish, please use your envelopes as they will be returned to us.

Taking up the Gifts: If the mass intention is for your family and you would like to take up the gifts at that mass, please let the ushers know about 10 minutes before mass. We have had a few families ask at the last minute and we would rather not ask someone to take up the gifts and then tell them not to because the family of the mass intention has just showed up.

Daily Mass Missals—If you would like a copy of “the Word Among Us” daily missal that includes daily mass readings, antiphons, and reflections, please stop or call the St. John parish office. A subscription costs \$20 per person per year.

Bulletin Deadline: ALL submissions for the bulletin need to be submitted no later than Tuesday 12:00 PM in order to be listed in the following Sunday edition and **must include the name of the submitter**. **Also, when there are multiple layers to an event, bulletin announcements need to be coordinated through the primary event planner to prevent conflicting submissions.**

Flocknote: Flocknote enables us to send large group emails and text messages. If you would like to receive the general notices and reminders about upcoming events in the parish, requests for help/volunteers, the bulletin published to the website, and other updates, use these instructions to sign up if you have not already done so.



Fr. Canice's Thoughts:

This Sunday's Gospel invites us to read Scripture through one of my favorite lenses: typology. Simply put, typology helps us see the Old Testament as a blueprint for the New Testament. Within its pages, God's plan is revealed in seed form—foreshadowing what will be brought to fulfillment in Christ. As St. Augustine beautifully taught, the New Testament is concealed in the Old, and the Old Testament is revealed in the New.

Today's Gospel offers a perfect example of this. When John the Baptist points to Jesus and proclaims Him "the Lamb of God," our minds are meant to return immediately to the Old Testament—specifically, to the Passover lamb in the Book of Exodus. In order to free His chosen people from slavery in Egypt, God commanded Moses to offer a very specific sacrifice: an unblemished male lamb. It was to be sacrificed, its flesh eaten, and its blood poured upon the wooden doorposts. Through this sacrifice, the Israelites were spared and set free from bondage.

Christ fulfills this foreshadowing in a far more profound and extraordinary way. He is the perfect, unblemished, and sinless Lamb. He is sacrificed for us. His blood is poured out for us upon the wood of the Cross. We partake of His flesh. And rather than delivering us from slavery in Egypt, He frees us from slavery to sin and death itself.

This is why, at every Mass, the priest echoes the words of John the Baptist and proclaims: "Behold the Lamb of God. Behold Him who takes away the sins of the world."

Stained Glass Classes:

THE ART OF STAINED GLASS MAKING – JANUARY 25TH & FEBRUARY 1ST – All

 Saints Parish in Boswell will be hosting a two-class course by Owen Shotts on the art of making stained glass at 2:00 PM on January 25TH and February 1ST in their parish hall (505 Center Street, Boswell). Because of the nature of stained glass making, the course extends over two classes and due to the cost of the materials there will be a \$50 fee per student. Students will learn the basics of stained glass, walk through a project, and make their own project. The class is limited to twelve students. SLOVAK PRESENTATION – JANUARY 18TH – Queen of Angels Parish in Central City (Somerset County) will host a presentation on the Cultural History of Slovakia by Dr. Renáta Kamenárová on Sunday January 18TH in the parish activity center (738 Sunshine Avenue, Central City). Dr. Kamenárová is the Director of the Slovak Studies Program at the University of Pittsburgh, the only university program in North America where students can take Slovak language and culture classes and opt to receive a Minor in Slovak Studies. Dr. Kamenárová holds a PhD in Slovak Language, and a MA (combined) in Slovak Language and Literature / History from Comenius University in Bratislava, Slovakia. In addition to teaching at Pitt, she has been a visiting researcher at the University of Regensburg and the University of Leipzig in Germany as well as serving as a visiting scholar at the Institute of Polish Philology at the University in Lublin in Poland. She has received numerous awards and has published many scholarly works. Her presentation will begin at 2:00 PM and will serve to be an occasion for fascinating information about Slovak culture and history presented in a down-to-earth way by a serious scholar.
