A note from the pastor

St. Louis IX, King of France (Feast Day Aug. 25)

Louis IX ruled France from 1226 to 1270 and was known for his religious devotion, love justice, and humanitarian efforts.

He led several crusades to the Holy Land, with his final journey ending in his death in 1270.

After his death, he was canonized as Saint Louis by the Roman Catholic Church.

He is also known as Saint Louis, the only French king to be canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church.

King Louis IX was highly revered in the 18th century as a model ruler known for his piety, humility, and commitment to justice. He introduced significant legal reforms, including establishing a royal justice system where citizens could appeal directly to the monarch, and he abolished trials by ordeal. His reign also saw France reach a political and economic zenith in Europe.

The city of St. Louis, Missouri, is named in honor of Louis IX, King of France.

In 1764, French fur traders Pierre Laclède and Auguste Chouteau established a fur trading post on the western bank of the Mississippi River and named the settlement "Saint Louis" in tribute to Louis IX. This naming was also in honor of Louis XV, who was the ruling King of France at the time.



Louis IX's strong Catholic faith led him to build the Sainte-Chapelle in Paris to house holy relics, and his patronage fostered innovation in Gothic art and architecture. His example influenced the development of St. Louis, MO, which became a center of Catholic faith in the region. The city's Basilica of Saint Louis, King of France (the Old Cathedral) and the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis are both named in his honor. A prominent equestrian statue of King Louis IX, called "The Apotheosis of St. Louis," stands in front of the Saint Louis Art Museum in Forest Park and was the primary symbol of the city for many years.
