**National Conservation Lands** are among the most essential and spectacular natural, cultural, and archaeological places in the country. They protect:

- > The cultural continuity of Native Nations
- > Rural economies
- > Access to hunting and fishing and other recreational activities
- > Essential wildlife migration corridors
- Nature needed to mitigate the effects of the climate and biodiversity crises



The Great Bend of the Gila is 84,000 acres of river valley and surrounding lands in the Sonoran Desert, with abundant cultural diversity and natural resources. Conservation Lands Foundation is working with a coalition of local partners and alongside Native Nations and communities to gain long-term protection for this important landscape.



## More National Conservation Lands Are Needed

Only 15% of the 245 million acres of public lands managed by the Bureau of Land Management are protected as National Conservation Lands and more is needed to support healthy plant and wildlife populations, rural economies that depend on them for recreation and tourism, our climate system, livelihoods, food, and freshwater supplies.

### Westerners Who Prefer Public Land Conservation Over Energy Development Is At All-Time High

72 percent of Westerners across the political spectrum want elected officials to protect more clean water sources, air quality, and wildlife habitat while providing opportunities to visit and recreate on public lands.

**89 percent of voters** oppose reducing or removing national monument protections.
