



4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:1-12a

A priest I know was once falsely accused of a terrible crime. The claim was wild and easily disproved, but for a while, it didn't matter. In the atmosphere shaped by the abuse crisis of the early 2000s, the public assumption was guilty until proven innocent. His name was dragged through the mud, and his ministry placed on hold. I had the privilege — and the burden — of walking closely with him during that time.

He was angry. He was confused. He felt abandoned and deeply disoriented. The last thing on his mind was the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: "Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against



you falsely because of me ... Rejoice and be glad" (Matthew 5:11-12). Rejoice? He felt anything but.

And yet... something holy slowly grew in him. Not overnight, and not without pain. But as the truth came to light and his name was cleared, I watched him become more Christlike —

more patient, more compassionate, more detached from human approval.

Maybe you haven't faced something so dramatic. But where do you feel judged? Misrepresented? Overlooked? Maybe someone else got the credit or the promotion. Maybe someone you love isn't getting their due. In those moments, the Cross of Jesus is near. When we feel accused, that's when we ask him for the grace not just to endure, but somehow, mysteriously, to rejoice and be glad.

8 Ways to Support THOSE WHO ARE GRIEVING

- 1 BE COMPASSIONATE & EMPATHETIC**
Sit with them in their grief: e.g. "That must really hurt." Don't try to explain it away.
- 2 PROVIDE A LISTENING EAR**
Talking can be very healing. Plus, words can hurt whilst listening generally cannot!
- 3 GIVE A HUG IF APPROPRIATE**
A firm, reassuring hug can release Oxytocin, which creates a feeling of calm and a host of other health benefits.
- 4 LET THEM GRIEVE IN THEIR OWN WAY & TIME**
There is no "normal" way to grieve, and no timeline.
- 5 SHOW YOUR SUPPORT & CARE**
Send a note, flowers, schedule a Mass intention, or some other touch to show you care.
- 6 REMEMBER THEIR LOVED ONE & CONTINUE TO TALK ABOUT THEM LOVINGLY**
It can hurt when everyone else seems to have forgotten, especially on special days like holidays, birthdays, anniversaries, etc.
- 7 DON'T TAKE ANYTHING PERSONALLY**
They may not want to talk, may seem distant, or may even lash out. Everyone grieves differently; try not to take it to heart.
- 8 PRAY FOR THEM & THEIR LOST LOVED ONE**
Lift them, their family, and their lost loved one up in prayer. Say a rosary, light a prayer candle, etc.



DEVOTIONAL



ORDINARY ACTS OF LOVE

Having just celebrated the mystery of the Incarnation—God entering human history as a vulnerable child—the Church does not rush us immediately to the desert of repentance. Instead, she invites us to walk with Christ as He steps quietly from the hidden life of Nazareth into His public ministry. This “ordinary” time is anything but ordinary.

Just as Jesus spent 30 hidden years before beginning His ministry, we are reminded that holiness is most often formed quietly—through fidelity, prayer, and ordinary acts of love. The Catholic Church dedicates February to the Holy Family as a model for all Christian families, emphasizing the virtues of faith, sacrifice, love and prayer.

Ordinary Time is called “ordinary” not because it is common, but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

Christmas reveals who Christ is: Emmanuel, God-with-us. Ordinary Time begins to show us how He is with us. For Catholics, Ordinary Time invites us to walk alongside Him as His mission becomes visible and transforms our lives.

The Solemnity of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd harkens back to the Christmas mystery of Light, except now Christ is “the Light of Revelation to the Gentiles who will

save his people from their sins.” Candles, symbolizing Christ our Light, will be carried in procession this day, as will be the Paschal candle during the Easter Vigil Liturgy.

The green vestments of Ordinary Time symbolize growth, life, and hope. After the brilliance of Christmas gold and white, the Church dresses in green to remind us that faith is meant to mature steadily. This month is not driven by dramatic feasts; rather, it mirrors the slow, patient work of grace in daily life leading us into the penitential Season of Lent.


The Gospel readings during this time frequently focus on Christ’s early miracles, teachings, and the calling of the first disciples. We hear fishermen invited to leave their nets, ordinary people transformed by a simple “Follow me.” This challenges us to examine our own readiness to respond.

Ordinary Time asks: What nets am I still holding? What familiar comforts prevent me from a deeper trust? It is a season for attentive listening, for recognizing how God speaks in the routines of our lives.

This period before Lent also prepares our hearts gently for conversion. Rather than beginning with ashes and fasting, the Church first allows us to encounter Christ’s mercy and authority. We see His compassion for the sick, His patience with sinners, and His power over darkness. By the time Lent arrives, we know who we are turning back to—not a distant judge, but the

Lord who has already walked among us. In a world that prizes excitement and constant change, the Ordinary Time bridges the space between Christmas and Lent, teaching us to value spiritual steadiness. It reminds us that God is present not only in mountaintop moments but also in the quiet middle spaces of our lives. Here, Christ walks with us, teaching us how to live as His disciples day by day. If we embrace this season fully, we discover that what is “ordinary” can become the very place where God does His most extraordinary works.




