

## **Discussion Questions**

### **Episode 4: Vocations and the Eucharist**

Take some time to sit with God and pray through what stood out to you the most. Ask Him to show you why that is staying with you and if He has anything to reveal within it.

What stood out to you the most from hearing Jonah share about his call to the priesthood?

Has there been a time in your life that you've experienced pure joy in serving others? Do you find that it comes easy for you to serve others? Does anything keep you from serving those less fortunate? Ask the Lord where you can serve someone today.

Jonah mentioned that he saw the love on Fr. Ray's face that he has for Jesus. How do you look at Jesus in the Eucharist? How does He look back at you?

Jonah talked about the importance of being vulnerable with the Lord by coming before Him and laying out everything on your heart. Surrender everything that's bothering you and give it all to Jesus.

Do you find it challenging to open up to Jesus? How do you talk to your best friend? Do you reveal your struggles and fears? Try talking to Jesus today like He is your best friend. He wants to hear everything that's on your heart.

If life is difficult right now and you want to find true joy and true happiness, Jonah recommends that you consider what would your life look like if you gave it all to the Lord today? What area of your life do you need to invite Jesus into and surrender all control to Him?

Jonah mentioned that when talking with children about vocations, we should begin with discussing the Universal Call to Holiness. We are all called to be saints, called to be holy and that the Lord has prepared a way for us to live out that call faithfully. Teach children to pray and to discern the path that best builds up the Kingdom and gives glorification to God. What do you think about the Universal Call to Holiness? Do you believe that you are called to be a saint? Do you pray for your family to be saints in heaven?

How can you begin praying for vocations today?
