RULES & CONDITIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

- Only the steward may re-arrange the position of exhibits

 Any exhibitor found to have moved other exhibitor's entries will be disqualified
- An exhibit preparation table will be provided close to the exhibit tent
- No preparation should be done inside the exhibit tent (unless wet weather)
- No boxes, trugs or containers are allowed on the exhibition tables
- No exhibits from previous years may be entered
- Exhibits must be staged between 8.30am and 10.30am on the day of the show
- Exhibitors should vacate the tents by 10.30am
- ✓ Judging will commence at 11.00am
- Entries should not be removed before 3pm but may be left for auctioning
- All exhibits to be staged in your own containers or vases.

 The committee will take all reasonable care of the exhibits but does not accept responsibility for loss or damage
- Children should put their age with the exhibit
- The exhibitor must have grown all plants and flowers, with the exception of the floral art classes
- Entries must be on the entry forms provided and need to be received at the Merrie Harriers by no later than 9pm Wednesday the 30th of July 2025
- It is essential to use a separate entry form for every entrant
- No changes of entries are permitted after the entry deadline
- Only one entry per class per exhibitor is permitted
- In every case the judges decision is final



CLASSES FOR VEGETABLES

- 1. Five white potatoes
- 2. Five potatoes other than white
- 3. Six shallots ~ general purpose
- 4. Six pods of peas
- 5. Three carrots ~ trimmed
- 6. Three beetroot ~ trimmed
- 7. Six French beans
- 8. Six runner beans
- 9. The LONGEST runner bean
- 10. Three red onions
- 11. Three white onions
- 12. The HEAVIEST onion
- 13. Two lettuce ~ with roots
- 14. One HEAVIEST marrow
- 15. A pair of culinary marrows, not to exceed 15" (38cm) length
- 16. Two cucumbers
- 17. Three courgettes ~ 4-6" (10-15cm) in length
- 18. Five tomatoes ~ to be shown with calyx
- 19. Seven cherry tomatoes ~ to be shown with calyx
- 20. A vase of four named varieties of herbs
- 21. Two vegetables of the same kind, not otherwise in schedule
- 22. Any weird or misshapen vegetable ~ with caption
- 23. 'Dig for Victory' *A collection of vegetables and flowers in a trug, tray or box.

CLASSES FOR FRUIT

- 24. Soft fruits ~ seven of the same variety
- 25. Three apples ~ of the same variety
- 26. A collection of fruits

Suggestions: apples, blackcurrants, cherries, gooseberries, plums, raspberries, red currants, strawberries, tayberries, white currants.

CLASSES FOR ROSES – STAND ALONE CLASS

- 27. Three hybrid tea roses ~ one or more varieties
- 28. Most fragrant rose
- 29. Roses floribunda / cluster ~ a vase of three sprays
- 30. One specimen rose

CLASSES FOR FLOWERS AND PLANTS

- 35. One stem each of three varieties of flowering shrub (e.g.: Fuchsia, Weigela, Hebe, Spirea)

- 37. Vase of pollinator friendly flowers (e.g.: Catmint, Buddleja, Lavender, Geranium, Verbena)

- A composition is a display of flowers, foliage and accessories depicting a theme in a limited space with flowers predominating
- Dried and preserved flowers do not include silk, plastic or any synthetic materials
- Measurements ~ please check carefully as the judge has the final word
- 44. **'Dads army'** ~ for men only ~ an arrangement in a boot, space allowed 15 x 15" (38 x 38cm)
- 45. **'Breakfast arrangement'** \sim fresh flower arrangement in an egg cup, space allowed 4 \times 4" (10 \times 10cm)
- 46. **'Victory in Europe'** \sim A composition reflecting on VE Day 80 years on in red, white, blue, space allowed 15 \times 15" (38 \times 38cm)
- 47. 'Big and Bold' ~ fresh flowers arrangement, space allowed 20 x 20" (50 x 50cm)
- 48. **'It's a Small World'** ~ a miniature garden with free choice of materials, space allowed 8x11.5" (21 x 98cm)
