

EPISCOPAL CHURCH MEMBERSHIP



As humans we all have a need to belong. As relational beings we desire to be connected to someone and to be a part of something greater than ourselves. But if we really stop and think about it, our deepest longings are spiritual. Who am I? What is the meaning and purpose for my life? What happens to us when we die? Why is there evil,

death and destruction in the world? And the list could go on and on.

In my biased opinion, the best place to seek answers to these types of spiritual longings is in a faith community. For many of us, that means a church. Some of us may have belonged to a church all our lives, while others may just be starting down this path. We all have different experiences and expectations of church but we all find ourselves here at Grace at this moment in our lives.

Some of us are involved with everything going on at Grace while others participate sporadically. Some of us never miss a Sunday service and some of us only come once or twice a year. People often ask, "How do I join?" Is there a form to fill out or dues to pay or does showing up on Sunday mean that I am a member?

Our Episcopal tradition holds that all baptized persons who have received Holy Communion in this congregation at least three times during the preceding 6 months are considered active members at Grace. Being a member in good standing also means that you are participating in the ongoing life of the parish and you are sharing your time, talent and treasure with the parish.

Members are also encouraged to make a public affirmation of their faith commitment by being baptized and then either confirmed or received by an Episcopal Bishop. Teenagers, and adults who have not been confirmed may receive some instruction from the parish priest as a preparation for this sacrament. In addition, adults who were confirmed in another Christian tradition may also participate in an Inquirer's class to prepare for reception into the Episcopal tradition.

Every year in the spring time, our Bishop Bonnie Perry, officiates at a regional confirmation/reception service when anyone in the diocese may attend this service. We at Grace will be part of such a service on Saturday, May 11th at 11:00 am at St. James on Grosse Isle. On this day our bishop will be available to confirm and officially receive people into the Episcopal Church. If you would like to be confirmed or received on this date, please contact Pastor Steve by Sunday, March 10th. We will then set up some times to meet for instruction and conversation.

Please know that whatever your official membership status is here that you are welcome at all times and at all events. May God continue to bless you on your journey of faith and belonging. Please feel free to talk to me if you have any questions or desire more information.
