Children's Message

Scripture: I John 4: 7-12

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only So into the world that we might live through him.

This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

Message

Intro- Spoiler alert: He dies

We cannot tell this story without keeping in mind what's going to happen

Without remembering the reason behind it all

Love, Sacrifice

Red-love and sacrifice

Scripture-1 John 4:7-12

Intersection of love and sacrifice

Christmas is about love

That feels familiar

Love from God

Gathering together with our loved friends and family

Love warming our hearts in the middle of the cold midwinter

It can be easy to connect Christmas with love

But according to our Scripture passage love necessarily manifests itself in sacrifice Scripture ties those two together

Because this is about love

"This is how God showed His love among us, He sent" Jesus

And love is over and over again in Scripture (not just in this passage) about sacrifice

Giving oneself up for the sake of someone you love

Because Christmas is about love it is necessarily about sacrifice

Jesus doesn't stay in that manger forever

The manger was not His destiny, at least not His ultimate destiny

He didn't come here just to be born

He came to be a perfect, pure, spotless, once and for all, one man for all humanity sacrifice

Why?

And why did God's love prompt sending His Son? What is this sacrifice for?

Sometimes around Christmas we fall into the pattern of sacrificing for wants

I'll just go a little further with the credit card this month for a few more presents We work a few more hours to earn a little more for an especially expensive time of year

And there's nothing wrong with wanting to do something nice for someone we care about

But this is not that

The loving sacrifice we're talking about at Christmas wasn't about fulfilling anyone's wants

This is about a cosmic, eternal necessity

We were by our very nature separated from a loving God

Unable to fix the situation and bridge the gap (because we aren't the newfallen snow)

We absolutely NEEDED God to do this

The only solution was for Him to send His son, to be a loving sacrifice on our behalf

The sacrifice of Christmas isn't Black Friday or Cyber Monday, it's Giving Tuesday

It's helping other people with needs

Feeding the hungry

Providing shelter for those out in the cold

Clothing for all those poor teenagers walking around in shorts in the middle of

December

For us, Christmas is a time to remember God's sacrificial love and to look for ways that we, too, can give of ourselves to help those in need

Tie in to communion

Always feels a little awkward to celebrate communion during Advent

But it is important to remember that Jesus doesn't remain a baby in the manger for long

Soon, sooner than Mary can believe, Jesus grows up

Like children do

He becomes a man, He steps into the mission He was sent here to live out

He shows us what the love of God is

He sacrifices Himself for us

That's what we remember this morning as we move from the manger to gather again around this table
