You'll find 400 very rare masterpieces of the glass that was only produced from 1909 to 1912.

Next enjoy a guided tour at the David Warther Museum, where David will present the history of the sailing ship, carved in ivory and highlighting famous American ships. David is the grandson of the World's Master Carver, Mooney Warther, and is a master in his own right. See how David creates these priceless works of art. After our busy morning you're sure to be hungry for the delicious buffet meal that we'll enjoy at Der Dutchman Restaurant in Walnut Creek. And following lunch take your seat at Amish Country Theatre for the Dave Banks Big Band USO show, "America Remembers." Enjoy over
