ESCAPING WAR, FINDING REFUGE

Lewahtoo was still a child when he escaped the war in Myanmar. Like many Karen families, conflict forced him to flee, leaving behind everything familiar—including his family. He eventually found safety in Thailand, where God led him to a place of refuge: an orphanage run by Momo Kath. There, Lewahtoo found not only shelter, but a home filled with children who shared the same story of loss and displacement.

LOVE BEYOND BLOOD

Though they were not family by blood, the love shown to Lewahtoo by Momo Kath was deeper than he had ever known. It was a reflection of Christ's love—patient, sacrificial, and unconditional. Through this love, Lewahtoo learned about Jesus, His sacrifice, and His power to redeem lives. What began as simple curiosity grew into a deep desire to know God's Word.

A SEED THAT TOOK ROOT

Lewahtoo eagerly studied the Bible. The truths he learned became like a mustard seed planted in his heart, growing stronger with time. Years passed, and he realized that the good news he had received was not meant for him alone.

He longed to share the gospel—especially with his family and his people who were still suffering because of war.



A CALL TO SERVE

As an adult, Lewahtoo left the orphanage, started his own family, and worked to provide for them. Yet deep in his heart, one burden never faded: the salvation of souls, especially among his fellow Karen people displaced by war.

God eventually called him to become a SULADS volunteer in Thailand. He joined the training and began serving as a Bible worker, fully embracing his calling.

CARING FOR THE FATHERLESS

One of Lewahtoo's greatest callings is caring for children without parents. Some of these children have parents who remain in Myanmar, unable to care for them due to the ongoing conflict.

Moved by compassion, Lewahtoo established his own small orphanage, now caring for 27 children. Though he did not finish formal schooling, his passion for sharing Jesus is undeniable.
