



reetings to all residents of Sahuarita, new and established, as well as friends visiting us from afar! The middle of summer marks the beginning of a new fiscal year for the town, and with that comes the perfect time to reflect on the past year and look forward at the year ahead.

First and foremost. I want to extend my heartfelt sympathy to all those families who have experienced the tragic loss of loved ones due to COVID-19. On a national level, we have been presented with unprecedented challenges that wreaked havoc on our healthcare system and economy. However, I'm happy to report to you that despite a very difficult year, Sahuarita is standing strong!

Happily, we're seeing that



the regional economy has largely gone back to business as usual, and the national economy is continuing to emerge. I can say with great enthusiasm that from where I'm standing, Sahuarita is in as good a place as ever to plan thoughtfully for the future. One indicator of a healthy economy is an approved and balanced budget for this fiscal year that is up 59% over last vear's at nearly \$95 million dollars. This is incredible news for our community. and we are certainly in an

enviable position. With the growth of the town being another indicator that things are headed in the right direction, our planning and building department is happy to be reporting the highest number of permits granted for single-family homes in more than 10 years.

Because we're growing faster than the statewide average, we qualify for a larger share of state-shared funds. This is money that we can add to our general fund through which we are able to provide the



high-quality services we offer to residents. And I want to personally thank the wonderful folks living here, who throughout the pandemic have helped to keep the wheels turning by shopping locally. By doing so, vou've helped us maintain the excellent level of service for which we're known: (1) our police department is well-staffed and has the tools they need to do their jobs effectively, (2) our local infrastructure gets the attention it needs — keeping our roads in tip-top shape,



and (3) we're able to think outside the box, creatively, and find ways to stimulate economic expansion.

In the coming months, our economic development department will continue some of the programs it has spearheaded over the past few years for encouraging local entrepreneurship such as BizEDGE, BizLaunch and the Dreambuilder program. Additionally, we plan to continue outreach through targeted campaigns aimed at attracting new restaurants to locate in Sahuarita.

Over the years, our town leadership has sought to encourage a spirit of community through our signature events, providing venues for shared experiences and camaraderie that reinforce our community's characteristics: teamwork, cooperation, and generosity. reen Valley and Sahuarita offer a great mix of shopping opportunities.

Green Valley Village in the heart of Green Valley has more than 60 businesses, including boutiques, book stores, restaurants, professional offices, Sears, and a hardware store.

About a mile away on Continental Road, Continental Shopping Plaza has more than 50 shops and businesses, including a Hallmark store, hardware store, restaurants, salons, unique homegrown boutiques selling clothing, gift items and more, and a Safeway supermarket.

Major shopping destinations in Sahuarita include the Sahuarita Plaza on Duval Mine Road, anchored by a Ross

Dress For Less, Big Lots, Ace Hardware, Jo-Ann Fabrics, Petco, restaurants, and a Dollar Tree at the west end of the plaza. Across the street, The Crossing at Sahuarita at the southeast corner of Nogales Highway and Abrego Drive features a popular Sprouts store, TJ Maxx, PetSmart and Bealls outlet, along with a MOD Pizza restaurant, Starbucks coffee shop, Chipotle Mexican Grill, a new Eegees and more.

To the west of Interstate 19 is the Valley Verde Center with an Ashley Furniture Homestore, movie theater, restaurants and an Arizona Department of Motor Vehicles office. Visit online at https://azdot.gov/content/green-valley where you can make an appointment, or go to https://azdot.gov/motor-



vehicles. ADOT phone center: 800-251-5866, Monday to Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Also on Duval Mine Road at La Cañada Drive is the Sahuarita Palms Plaza, anchored by a Safeway supermarket and gas station and home to a variety of small shops, businesses and restaurants.

To the east is Madera Marketplace with a Walmart Supercenter, two banks, automotive shops, Walgreens, a 99-cent store, restaurants and more. South on Abrego at Esperanza Boulevard is a Tractor Supply Co. store, featuring tractor/trailer parts and accessories along with lawn/garden, home maintenance and pet supplies.

Fry's Marketplace and Chase Bank anchor the Rancho Sahuarita Marketplace and Village at Interstate 19 and Sahuarita Road. Other businesses include a dry cleaners, dentist, veterinary and medical offices, and restaurants. And just to the east, The Corner at Rancho Sahuarita hosts a Panda Express, Arby's, and Fry's gas station, part of a five-acre parcel at the northeast corner of Rancho Sahuarita Boulevard and Sahuarita Road. And just to the east, the new Sahuarita Library opened in fall 2021.

In addition, unique shopping and dining experiences in Green Valley and Sahuarita can also be found at The Marketplace on Calle de las Tiendas; The Quorum Plaza on West Beta Street, home to Copper Fitness and more; the White Elephant thrift store off La Cañada Drive; and Madera Plaza at the corner of Continental Road and Whitehouse Canyon Road.

MORE COMMERCE

Construction of the new Sahuarita Advanced Manufacturing and Technology Center was completed in 2020 on the southwest corner of La Cañada Drive and Sahuarita Road. This 32,000-square-foot multi-tenant advanced manufacturing center is the first of its kind in Sahuarita. The goal of SAMTEC is to establish Sahuarita as a hub for business innovation research and technology. The Town has welcomed its first tenant business, Saguaro Solar. SAMTEC is represented by CBRE Commercial



ecause Green Valley is an unincorporated community, the majority of its municipal services are provided by Pima County. Most local, county and state services can be found at the Pima County Government complex at 601 N. La Cañada Drive in Green Valley.

The complex houses Precinct 7 of the Pima County Justice Court, which handles local traffic, criminal and civil violations and issues marriage certificates. The Justice of the Peace can perform marriage ceremonies at the court as well. There's also a representative of the District 4 supervisor's office.

be found at the complex.
The PCSO deploys squads
of deputies and supervising
sergeants. Staffed by a public
safety support specialist
and members of the Green
Valley Sheriff's Auxiliary
Volunteers, the substation is
open Monday through Friday
from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

ncorporated as a municipality in 1994, the town of Sahuarita has a council-manager form of government. The Town Council typically meets every second and fourth Monday.

Sahuarita has its own police force, a municipal court and a town attorney and prosecutor. Its Parks and Recreation Department oversees leisure activities in the town. The Public Works Department watches over the town's streets, wastewater and engineering needs. The Planning and Building Department

The La Posada Community: A strong local partner, a vital asset to the AZ19 region

When the La Posada Continuing Care Community broke ground in 1986/87, Green Valley was a growing community of less than ten thousand residents, and the Town of Sahuarita did not yet exist. Three decades later, La Posada has established itself as a community leader, and a vital asset to the AZ19 region.

With about 500 full-time employees, it is one of the largest 501c(3) non-profit organizations in southern Arizona. As estimated in a recent University of Arizona study, La Posada provides over \$50 million in annual economic impact.

From the beginning, when it was founded as a part of Tucson Medical Center, the organization has been focused on the needs of seniors. Over seventy-five percent of new residents move to La Posada from the Green Valley / Sahuarita area, with an increasing number from surrounding Tubac, Vail, Tucson, and even Sierra Vista locations. Over 60 percent of new community residents are referred to join La Posada by a current resident.

Primary to its mission, La Posada offers housing, healthcare, and an independent lifestyle to over 750 residents aged 62 and over. In addition to the current selection of 489 Independent Living apartments, Garden Home townhouses, and singlefamily Park Centre Homes, there is a new addition. A grouping of 17 new free-standing Pavilion Homes has just finished construction, with a contemporary open feel and up to 2,315 square feet of living space.

If needed, innovative and engaging supportive living and memory care neighborhoods are available to La Posada community residents on site.

Daily resident life at La Posada is typically full of friendship and activity, enjoyable dining and a preventive healthy lifestyle. Many residents pursue volunteer opportunities on





campus, or continue their engagement in supporting local groups like the White Elephant. There are up to five Registered Nurses available for support and guidance through the Care Management team, with office locations in the midst of La Posada Independent Living areas. There are four wonderful dining venues, with a cooked-to-order family feel, that serve as primary social gathering spots.

The La Posada campus is a 100-acre gem, beautifully landscaped and developed over time. There is an open feel here, with opportunities for long walks along the Santa Cruz River path, rolling around the campus on a fleet of shared bicycles, or a quick ride on one of the La Posada trams.

As a non-profit led by a local board of trustees, La Posada makes a strong commitment to giving back. Posada Life Community Services offers programs including a senior lunch program, daytrips, adult day services, and counseling. Next door to the Community Center, Los Niños del Valle offers an innovative and engaging




pre-school for kids from 12 months to 5 years and beyond. Physical, occupational and speech therapies are offered on an outpatient basis to the general public by the La Posada staff. The Connect Green Valley app and website is the latest addition, offering an online resource for services and information. The value of these community programs, along with other avenues of staff and community engagement, is typically valued at over \$1 million each year.

The Shoppes at La Posada, situated where the campus meets Continental Road, offers tasty breakfast and lunch options at Posada Java, wonderful consignment finds at the Vensel Treasure Shoppe, and is a popular gathering place for music and art events. Each spring, the community opens its grounds for the Taste of La Posada event - with bountiful food, music and tours of the residences!

ahuarita Unified School District No. 30 (SUSD) is a premier public school district in Southern Arizona, serving approximately 6,100 students in grades K-12. Founded in 1964, the district is proud of its long tradition of academic excellence. Since then, Sahuarita Unified School District has become known for its innovative curriculum, rich history, and sense of community. Today, the district is made up of a childcare/early education center, two high schools, one K-2 primary school, one 3-5 intermediate school. one middle school, two K-8

Both award-winning high schools offer a wide selection of educational choices in academics, the arts, sports, and career and technical education. Our graduates continue to be admitted to a wide number of universities, and among the nation's best schools. This past year,



our graduates redefined challenges as opportunities to thrive, earning approximately \$9 million in scholarships. Through exemplary programs, students learn the skills they need to reach their full potential for success.

As the 2021-22 school

year unfolds, there are new and promising next steps and indicators of further progress and success in the Sahuarita Unified School District.

• A new health professions Career and Technical Education (CTE) program will be offered to high school **CULTURE & COMMUNITY**

students this year.

- · With the continued expansion of dual enrollment college-level programs in math, English, science, and more in partnership with Pima Community College, high school students could soon graduate with an associate degree by the time they walk at their commencement.
- · We are focused on vital measures to support students, including mental health and total student wellness. Sahuarita Unified School District received a \$25,000 grant to fund an improvement project focused on student and school staff well-being and enhancing student, staff, and parent connections to the student's school. The two year grantfunded project is slated to begin this fall.
- · This year, the middle school Career & Technical Education career exploration class, formerly only available to students at Wrightson Ridge School, is now also available at Anza Trail. The yearlong course will offer students the opportunity to explore careers through lessons and hands-on activities that are aligned to the CTE courses offered at the high school level. Students will then be able to make better-informed decisions when selecting CTE pathways.
- The Sahuarita Solar Energy Project has installed solar arrays at more than 8 campuses/facilities (over 9,000 panels). Many of these arrays have recently begun generating energy for the district. To this date, the Sahuarita Solar Energy Project has generated more than 3.0 GWh of power and reduced electrical costs by

more than 65%. This equates to nearly \$100,000 in avoided costs, sustains more than 2,500 acres of U.S. forest and/ or generates enough energy to power 371 homes for one vear.

Jessica England. teacher at Sahuarita Middle School, and Ashton Gildea, teacher at Walden Grove High School, join a distinguished list of SUSD teachers who have made this list in past years. collaborative committee. approved by the community and adopted by Pima County.

The Council's members are homeowner associations. local businesses, public services and corporate members. Each member has a seat on the Board of Representatives, the Council's governing body. The Council operates through its Standing Committees — Traffic & Arroyos; Health and Human Services: Planning and Architectural; Environmental: Park Advisory; HOA Relations; and Emergency/Citizens' Corp. More than 200 people volunteer their time and talent to service on the Council and its Committees to ensure that Green Valley remains a premier place to live, work, play and invest. All Council and Committee meetings are open to the public.

The Council sponsors programs such as the Preferred Vendor Program; a local Health Care Directory; Dispute Resolution; Community Forums; Homeowner Association (HOA) workshops: Planning and Architectural Permit review; Service Requests for people to report problems with county-owned roads and other property; and contractual support for Pima






To the south at the Tubac Center for the Arts, an eclectic mix of exhibitions and shows are open to the public throughout the year.


In addition, Desert Diamond Casino at Interstate 19 and Pima Mine Road brings in classic rock bands, country and western stars, Latino performers, comedians and more.

it is an architecturally significant historic landmark off Interstate 19 on the Tohono O'odham Nation, Visitors can view the ornate parish church from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and the gift shop is open daily from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.. Mass times are Saturdays at 5 p.m. and Sundays at 10 a.m and 11:30 a.m. Museum visits and guided tours will resume when conditions are safe.

Heading south, the Asarco Mineral Discovery Center in Sahuarita provides visitors an opportunity to learn about the importance of mining in everyday life. It includes an award-winning exhibit center, video theater, cactus garden and picnic area. Visitors also can stand at the edge of an open-pit copper mine, and stop at the mill to see how the ore is processed. Shop at the Company Store gift shop, too.

Wanna bet — or be entertained? The Desert Diamond Casino on Pima Mine Road in Sahuarita features slot machines, table games and keno, plus entertainment and dining choices that include Taste of Agave — At The Buffet, the Diamond Grill and the Sports Bar.

Also in Sahuarita, the Titan Missile Museum offers tours that take visitors 30 feet underground to see the silo of this former intercontinental ballistic missile site, now a National Historic Landmark. The only ICBM site in the world with a Titan II missile in the launch silo, this complex provides above-ground and underground exhibits depicting the Cold War era. See the command center and walk the silo cable ways.

Interstate 19 Exit 95. www.casinodelsol.com Visitors who want to bring home fresh, tasty, locally grown pecan treats may order online from the Green Valley Pecan Store in Sahuarita by visiting https://www.pecanstore.com/. Chocolate-covered and praline pecans are among the favorites; there's also pecan brittle, barbecue sauces, olive oils, and many other tasty treats.

At Historic Hacienda de la Canoa at the Raul M. Grijalva Canoa Ranch Conservation Park in southern Green Valley, Pima County Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation staff and volunteers offer a variety of intriguing guided tours of the ranch buildings, gardens and corral, birding tours at the pond, plus special nature and history-





oriented events for the public. Dating back to the original Spanish San Ignacio de la Canoa land grant, this ranch was a stop for the Anza Expedition in 1775-76 and was one of the largest cattle ranches in Arizona when operated by the Manning family from the early 1900s until the 1970s.

Farther south is Tubac Presidio State Historic Park and Tumacácori National Historical Park with a historic adobe church.



bout 20 miles south of Green Valley on Interstate 19 is a quaint little riverside village that calls itself the place "where art and history meet."

Indeed, the village of Tubac has dozens of shops, galleries and restaurants, many of them selling unique products made by the artists and artisans who call the village home.

Tubac's history is impressive as well. It was here in 1752 that the first European settlement in what is now Arizona was founded when the Spanish built a presidio near the banks of the Santa Cruz River. The area's history is celebrated at Tubac Presidio State Historic Park, where every fall the town turns out to recognize local hero Juan Bautista de Anza II, a commandant of the presidio, an Indian fighter and colonizer who led a group of settlers to California in 1775-1776 to establish what is now San Francisco.

More recently, Tubac has established itself as a




resort destination with the expansion and renovation of the Tubac Golf Resort, and a place for high-end vacation and part-time homes.

Just down the road from Tubac is Tumacácori, where a Spanish mission still stands at Tumacácori National Historical Park as a reminder of the part this region once played in settling the New World. Across the street is the Santa Cruz Chili & Spice Company, offering an enticing selection of chili spices and seasonings along with southwestern cookbooks, local history and kitchen essentials.

ARIVACA

rivaca is a beautiful rural community 23 miles off Interstate 19 south of Green Valley. The gentle winding road to Arivaca is the perfect training ground for bicyclists getting in shape for the Tour de Tucson race.

Just be careful as you travel down this road. Be on the lookout for rabbits. coyotes, deer and openrange cattle. Once you arrive in Arivaca, there are a number of things to see and do.

Arivaça's town site was originally a Pima Indian village. Mining operations in the area began in 1856. and when the mines played out, ranching took over.

Today, it's the home of the Arivaca Cienega, a wetland associated with the Buenos Aires National Wildlife Refuge. There are hiking trails and interpretive signs telling about the area and the wildlife you may encounter. The refuge is on the avid birdwatcher's list and is home to many species of birds. Also to the west of town is the refuge's wooded Arivaca Creek Trail. To the south of town, try your luck fishing at Arivaca Lake.

Annual festivities are held for the Fourth of July, and weekend farmers markets are popular through much of the year.





he government seat of Santa Cruz County is Nogales, home to about 25,000 residents. Its sprawling Mexican namesake just to the south in Sonora has about 20 times that number.

The U.S. city is a government center with numerous retail outlets. restaurants, and a sizable

warehousing center for fresh produce coming across the

In Mexico, the city of Nogales is a modern factory and produce shipping center, but it's also a tourist destination. It's easy to get there. Just walk across the international border in downtown Nogales, Ariz. The tourist area immediately south of the border has restaurants, shops and, if you want, pharmacies and dentist offices. You can drive into Mexico, but the lines of cars driving north into the United States can be long and move slowly.

There's a U.S. Consulate in south Nogales, Sonora, on Calle San Jose, about five miles south of the border. It's open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. closed on weekends and on U.S. and Mexican holidays. Its Mexican phone number is 01-631-311-8150 or 01-631-313-4797. From the United States the number is 011-52-631-313-48-20.

Although it's hassle-free to enter Mexico, U.S. citizens need a passport or passport card to return from Mexico. Also bring along a photo ID such as a driver's license. The pandemic has brought extra restrictions on border crossing.





mong the highlights in the Santa Cruz Valley for visitors and residents alike is Madera Canvon in the Santa Rita Mountains east of Green Valley. Called a "Sky Island," the wooded canvon is only 11 miles southeast of Green Valley, but it sports an environment quite different from the desert below.

Madera Canyon is a haven

for flora and fauna found nowhere else in the United States, and it has three distinctive lodges, miles of trails ranging from easy to very difficult, and picnic facilities.

According to the Friends of Madera Canyon, a Green Valley-based advocacy group charged with protecting the canyon, more than 200 bird species have been seen in

the canyon, including rare ones like the elegant trogan, flame-colored tanager, redfaced warbler and the rosebreasted grosbeak.

The best trails in Madera Canyon climb the southern side of Mount Wrightson. including the Old Baldy Trail and the Super Trail. both of which lead to the 9.456-foot peak.

A thick forest thrives in

Madera Canyon. Visitors will find mesquite trees, several varieties of evergreen oaks, alligator junipers, Arizona Madrones, cottonwoods, white-limbed sycamores. Ponderosa Pines and more.





ANZA TRAIL

he Anza Trail will eventually run from Culiacan, Mexico, to San Francisco, Calif., following as closely as possible the historic route taken by Juan Bautista de Anza II and 240 immigrants in the winter of 1775-76.

In this region, hikers, bicyclists and equestrians can use:

- A 5.2-mile section in the Canoa Ranch area, just south of Green Valley, that begins east of Interstate 19 on Elephant Head Road near the Santa Cruz River. The trail here is a packed surface for foot and bicycle traffic. Equestrians can use the river wash so as not to damage the trail.
 - · Take the Abrego



Trailhead in Green Valley along Abrego Drive south of Continental Road on the east side of Abrego Drive, covering 3 miles. Hike south from here to the Elephant Head Road Trailhead, Hikers also can head north from the Abrego Trailhead to the north end of the Country Club of Green Valley golf course, and continue to the Llano Grande trailhead in the town of Sahuarita. From there, the trail follows close to the Santa Cruz riverbed up to the southern boundary

of the San Xavier Indian Reservation.

• A rather lush, 3.8-mile section follows the river from the presidio at Tubac to the mission at Tumacácori. This is one of the more popular hikes in the Santa Cruz Valley and can be picked up at well-marked trailheads at the mission and the presidio. It's a beautiful route and this mostly flat, easy trail is a great option for families. The trail also extends north from Tubac for about a mile. This is a top trail section for

birders.

• A 5.5-mile stretch of the trail near Rio Rico follows the river and winds through mesquite forests. Take I-19 exit 17, Rio Rico/Yavapai Drive. Park at the trailhead next to the Santa Cruz County building and look for the trailhead sign.

p on Mount Hopkins in the Santa Rita range. the Smithsonian Institution operates the Fred Lawrence Whipple Observatory, a state-ofthe-art telescope array used by scientists to study the beginnings of our universe.

To assist this important research, and to help out other observatories across Southern Arizona, Pima County, Tucson and

Sahuarita have all passed ordinances that require special outdoor lighting, keeping the sky dark so scientists can see (or at least attempt to see) everso-faint objects millions of light-years away in

space.

The Whipple **Observatory visitor** center in Amado offers astronomy and natural history displays, occasional Star Parties, and nearby picnicking.


