REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

Dear friends,

There's something beautifully human about today's Gospel. Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary, and we find ourselves in the middle of a family moment. Martha is rushing around, trying to get everything ready—tidying, cooking, doing what any good host would do. Mary, on the other hand, is simply sitting at Jesus' feet, listening to him speak. Martha is flustered, and she asks Jesus to step in. But he responds gently: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things. One thing is necessary."

It's a story that touches something deep in all of us. Many of us live with a constant hum of busyness—jobs to do, people to care for, things to sort. And yet, Jesus invites us not just to do for him, but to be with him. That doesn't mean that Martha's work was unimportant. But Mary had chosen the better part—the quiet attentiveness to the presence of the Lord.

That same spirit of hospitality runs through the whole of today's readings. In Genesis, Abraham welcomes three strangers under the oak tree. He rushes to prepare a meal, washes their feet, and waits on them. But in his hospitality, something more happens—he encounters the mystery of God, and receives the promise of new life.


Paul, in the second reading, speaks of the great mystery that has been made known: "Christ in you, the hope of glory." It's a stunning phrase. Not just Christ alongside us or above us, but Christ *in* us. That's the goal of the Christian life-to make space for Christ to dwell in us, to listen, to welcome, to trust.

So as summer unfolds and some of us finally get a little time to breathe, perhaps we can take a moment to ask ourselves: Where am I making space for God in my life? Where do I sit and listen, like Mary? Where do I welcome others, like Abraham? In both stillness and service, God is waiting to meet us.
