	The governing board re-visited the predicted results (the topic was fully discussed at the meeting held on $23^{\rm rd}$ June 2025).	
	With staff movement and new members of staff in post, the governing board spoke of the need to ensure KW is fully supported. The governing board are very aware that KW will need to focus on the new staff in place as well as the teaching and learning in school. The governing board acknowledged the support from the SLT and that of the Business Manager, Lisa Shepherd. KW is aware that systems are in place which re-inforces the support in place.	
	The MEMC reported that the solar panels are now in fully working order. KW will speak further with Mia Bridgland (Year 5) about sustainability and passivaus and the possibility of putting together an assembly about the school. The governing board also noted that with the LED lighting being installed over the holiday period, this will have an impact on spend moving forward.	
	With the introduction of My Child at School (MCAS), communication will be forwarded to all parents/carers explaining the details for its use. The message will be sent re-inforcing that this will be the means for communication and Seesaw will be a learning platform only.

	The Privacy Notice for parents/carers has been updated to include Bromcom and new requirements of data protection legislation that have come into effect. The details have been uploaded to the school website and parents/carers have been informed.

	The Safeguarding position has been re-advertised and further interviews will take place on Monday 21st July 2025.	
	The governing board discussed the cyber procedures and requirements for Montgomery Primary School. Moving forward, the governing board members who lead both GDPR (JC) and Safeguarding (SW) will be involved with all training available as well as the Chair (SWe).	
	The governing board spoke further about the recent cyber attacks to well known brands and how the attack was dealt with – as a school, Montgomery Primary School must know what to do and have a set plan in place should this happen – this will include looking at all of the internal workings of the school e.g., registers and pupil contact details.	
	The Emergency Management Plan will be reviewed to look at, 'evacuation' and, 'invacuation'. The use of a different sound on the alarm setting will be investigated in order that the school community can hear the different sound. The governing board spoke about, 'soft' and, 'hard' procedures which the staff community are aware of.	
	A SCR audit was completed on 7 th July 2025. The governing board were informed that LS was proficient in the knowledge and procedures and processes relating to the new starters. Random names were also pulled from the staffing list and their information viewed. LS has a spreadsheet and names are also highlighted to ensure of any action required to be taken e.g., a leaver.	
	It was noted that all staff advertisements have been re-written, all paperwork is consistent and safer recruitment is in place.
