

We know that absences happen. Children may need to miss school for illness, medical appointments, or important family circumstances. These are a normal part of life, and St. Patrick School understands that.

However, as parents, you play a powerful role in setting the tone. When children hear that school is important from home, they learn to value their education. Even when absences are unavoidable, reminding your child that school is a priority helps build the habit of showing up, being prepared, and making the most of every school day.

Attendance matters in school for several important reasons:

- 1. **Learning builds daily** Each lesson connects to the next. Missing class can leave gaps that make it harder to keep up.
- 2. **Better grades and test scores** Students who attend regularly tend to perform better because they don't miss key explanations, practice, or review.
- 3. **Participation and collaboration** Many activities involve group work, discussions, or labs that can't be repeated the same way outside of class.
- 4. **Life skills** Showing up on time and consistently is a habit that helps later in jobs, college, and other responsibilities.
- 5. **Stronger relationships** Being present helps students connect with teachers and classmates, which makes school more enjoyable and supportive.

In short, good attendance leads to more learning, greater success, and increased opportunities. Life sometimes interrupts school, but your attitude makes all the difference. When children see you treat school as important, they will do the same.











# 1st Grade Exploreres Learning Directions




















3rd, 4th & 5th Grade Book Club with Mrs. Koebel
