

As the cool fall days start to turn into winter, I want to share a few quick reminders to help your child stay warm and safe:

- Morning Arrival: Our front doors open at 7:20 a.m. Please don't drop students off before that time. Teachers begin their day at 7:30 a.m., so there's no supervision available earlier unless you've made special arrangements.
- **Dress Code:** Starting **Monday, November 3**, shorts are put away until **April 1**.

Outdoor Recess: We go outside for recess unless it's *bitterly* cold, so please make sure your child has a coat every day. The weather can be unpredictable this time of year—warm one day, freezing the next—so it's best to be prepared.



BOX OF JOY IS A MINISTRY OF CROSS CATHOLIC OUTREACH



Art Room News

This past month 7th and 8th grade art students participated in an educational field trip to Kearney, Nebraska, designed to enhance their understanding of the connections between history, culture, and the visual arts. Thanks to the generosity of Saint Patrick Church Alter Society and the Nebraska Arts Council we were able show the students various environments where art can helps connect us to the our past, present and the future.

Our first stop was in Holdrege, Nebraska's, Iron Horse Creative District. Students were able to look at Holdrege's newly developed arts district, featuring two of their public mural and outdoor sculpture garden. This visit provides real-world examples of community-based public art. We took the time to highlight the importance of creative placemaking, community identity, and how art can bring pride to a community.

Our second stop on the field trip students participated in a self-guided tour of The Archway, where students will examine how art, architecture, and sculpture are integrated into the historical narrative of Nebraska and the American experience. This tour will highlight the ways in which visual and structural elements communicate historical themes and provide an immersive learning environment. Student also did a scavenger hunt closely studying some of the sculptures features around the archway.

The third component of our trip took place at the Museum of Nebraska Art (MONA). Students toured the museum's permanent collection and special exhibitions, with a focus on the contributions of Nebraska artists. Following the tour, students participated in a structured art-making workshop on experimenting various techniques using the art media watercolor.

The final component of our field trip we stop to see a life size crane sculpture that was created by the artist Sondra Jonson of Cambridge, Nebraska she is an influential artist that creates life like bronze sculptures that primarily focus on religious themes. In our school, parish and community parks in McCook and Cambridge she several sculptural works on display. We were able to meet up with Sondra in her studio to see some of the projects she is currently working on as well as the clay cast of the crane sculpture we seen in Kearney.

It was a wonderful full day to see how art is all around us.

In the month of November students will be taking turns going to the High Plains Museum in McCook



to see the Statewide Traveling Exhibit from the Sheldon Art Gallery in Lincoln, Nebraska. It will be a wonderful exhibit presenting art work from all the past and art education teachers from the University of Lincoln.



Finley, and to the Rights: Brooklyn and Chase. The students sold in excess of \$18,000 in tickets. What an amazing job these students do!














