this event happen. I am so pleased with them. I will say more about that at the barn, but I am continually impressed, thrilled, and humbled with how much of a group effort this event is. Thank you to all who have been involved in the planning of the Mass on the Farm!

Next, we have a Buildings and Grounds meeting on September 10th at 6pm.

I am excited to add a few new Altar Servers and Eucharistic Ministers to the service of the parishes. There is a training for Altar Servers on September 22 at 6:30pm at St. Mary's. There is a training for New Eucharistic Ministers on October 1 at 6:30pm at St. Mary's. As I said last week during the announcements. I am planning on a second training for both of these ministries. The bargain was that the first person to commit to the ministry would get to choose the time and the place of the second training (to fit with my schedule, of course.)

I have gotten that request for the second training for Altar Servers. The date and time has not yet been set. But when it is, I will let you know.

That means that the offer is still available for a new Eucharistic Minister who cannot make it to the October 1 training.

You know, I would really encourage you to take up a ministry within your parish. We are still in need of money counters. We still need lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Servers, ushers, and choir members. While a formal training is required for Eucharistic Ministers and Altar Servers, I would not abandon those who wish to participate in the other ministries. I would certainly help you learn the other ministries or point you to a person that would help.

The excuse that I often hear from people is that there are ministries and positions that certain people have done for many years. We don't want to step on the toes of those people. There can be some truth to this. We need to do better as a church in giving other people the opportunity to serve God in and through these ministries. This is not to say that those who have been serving for years should simply retire. Rather, we should make space for others to help as they are able, joyfully sharing the responsibility of serving the Lord without jealousy as we witness the growth of their relationship with Christ.

That should be our goal. We want others to serve God. We want others to participate in the Mass in the ways that they can. Sure, they might not do the things like a seasoned pro would. They might make mistakes. But God loves when a person gives generously of themselves... and we should too.

If you feel called to help with any of the ministries at Mass, please reach out. We will always need help.

And if you would like to establish a new ministry or prayer group, then let me know. I would be happy to list it in our bulletin and to do whatever else I can to help support you!


