#### Pastor's Pen

The priest convocation was fine. We were at the new Augustine Institute, just north of St. Louis. It is a beautiful campus which used to be the Boeing Educational Center until Covid made them decide that it wasn't worth doing their trainings and meetings in person. absolutely huge! There were lots of the other priests there and we had a good time.

We start with a few reminders. First, Altar Server training is this Monday, September 22, at St. Mary's at 6:30pm. The next training will be on October 22 at St. Mary's at 5pm. Anyone in 4<sup>th</sup> grade or older is welcome to participate.

Pastoral Council will meet at 6:30pm this Wednesday at the office. Eucharistic Minister Training is next Wednesday, October 1st, at 6:30pm at St. Mary's. Eucharistic Ministers must be Freshmen in High School or older.

I do continue to pray for a safe harvest and encourage all of you to do the same. I want to draw your attention to the fact that Pope Leo just canonized 2 new saints. Let's look at them.

Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati were canonized as saints on September 7<sup>th</sup>. The process of the canonization has been taking place for quite a few years before

Pope Leo, but he had the honor of doing the ceremony.

First, St. Pier Giorgio Michelangelo Frassati was born in Turin, Italy, in 1901 to a wealthy, influential family. From a young age, he cultivated a deep spiritual life, centered on daily Communion and devotion to the Virgin Mary. He dedicated himself to serving the poor and sick, using his own money for charity and giving generously of his time. He saw this as a privilege, often sacrificing personal comforts to help others.

Frassati pursued a degree in mining engineering so he could "serve Christ better among the miners." He was also politically active, joining Catholic organizations and fiercely opposing both Communists and Fascists. He was known for his love of the outdoors, especially mountain climbing, and used these outings as opportunities to share his faith with friends. A lover of art, literature, and music, he was also a member of the Lay Dominicans.

In 1925, just before his graduation, Frassati contracted poliomyelitis while caring for the sick. He died at age 24. His final act was to send medicine to a poor man he was visiting. His funeral was attended by a vast crowd of the poor he had served, who were previously unknown to his family. In 1990, Pier Giorgio Frassati was beatified by Pope John Paul II, who called him the "Man of the Eight Beatitudes." He is now known as a patron for students and youth.

St. Carlo Acutis is even more amazing! This saint was born after me! Carlo Acutis was a London-born Italian teenager, an ordinary boy with an extraordinary devotion to the Catholic faith. Born on May 3, 1991, he grew up in Milan and, despite his family not being particularly religious, he developed a deep love for the Eucharist, which he called his "highway to Heaven." He received his First Communion early, at age seven, and faithfully attended daily Mass and Adoration, famously stating, "When you stand before Jesus in the Eucharist, you become a saint."

A computer whiz, Carlo taught himself college-level programming. He channeled his skill to create multilingual websites cataloging Eucharistic miracles, earning him the nickname "God's influencer" or "cyber apostle." His life was guided by the principle: "To be always united to Jesus, this is my life plan."

Carlo was active in his community, teaching catechism, volunteering at soup kitchens, and helping the poor in his neighborhood. He viewed his hobbies—playing soccer and video games (which he limited to an hour a week)—as opportunities for a Gospel-centered life, striving "not to die as a photocopy." He died of acute leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15. The Catholic Church canonized him as its first millennial saint, celebrating him as an inspiration, especially for young people, "not to squander our lives, but to direct them upwards."

There are several more saints up for canonization on October 19<sup>th</sup>. I will try to talk about them when that happens.


