In my column last week, I mentioned that Pope Leo signed an Apostolic Exhortation, "Dilexi Te." It was largely written by Pope Francis before his death. Pope Leo made some changes to suit him and published it. It is quite a long document. I am trying to read it. I tried to get AI to summarize it for me and it got a bit overwhelmed. It turned out that I was pasting too many letters into the chat box. Still, I decided to read the text and use the AI summary as notes (just in case it started to hallucinate.) I have gotten through the first chapter this week.

The document is focused on poverty in the world. It is addressed to all Christians. Who the text is addressed to really does change from time to time. This is addressed to all Christians and is intended to be formative for people to see the issue of poverty in a different way. I would encourage you to try to read it. The full text is readily accessible online. It is written in a more formal language and style, but that is par for the course for these documents.

In this column, I want to comment about paragraph 9. Leo writes, "The condition of the poor is a cry that, throughout human history, constantly challenges our lives, societies, political and economic systems, and, not least, the Church. On the wounded faces of the poor, we see the suffering of the innocent and, therefore, the suffering of Christ himself. At the same time, we should perhaps speak more correctly of the many faces of the poor and of poverty, since it is a multifaceted phenomenon. In fact, there are many forms of poverty: the poverty of those who lack material means of subsistence, the poverty of those who are socially marginalized and lack the means to give voice to their dignity and abilities, moral and spiritual poverty, cultural poverty, the poverty of those who find themselves in a condition of personal or social weakness or fragility, the poverty of those who have no rights, no space, no freedom." (Underline is added.)

That last section really struck me. Often, we think of poverty as being a number that a person has in their bank account or their ability to pay their bills. We think of that first kind of poverty that Pope Leo is talking about here. That is the most obvious, most frequently talked about kind of poverty. And we do want to help alleviate this kind of poverty. This may mean public services for people struggling to pay rent or utilities.

And if any of us had a billion dollars, I am sure we would all try to give to help solve this kind of poverty. But, the other kinds of poverty that Pope Leo lists are just as important for us to address in our world. How do we fight against the poverty of marginalized communities who have to fight for their own dignity and the ability to use their own voice? How do we fight the poverty of people who are oppressed by some powerful person that is controlling them? How do we fight the poverty of someone who has had their rights stripped and who lack the freedom they should have? How do we remedy the moral and spiritual poverty that is spreading across our nation, making us think that these poverties are just the way of the world?

Christ calls us to be concerned with the needs of the poor. Pope Leo is expanding that to include all forms of poverty in our world today.

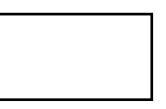
