To that end, here are the announcements. I will be available for confessions at Sacred Heart on Sunday afternoon at 3 pm. I will stay until 4pm or until all confessions are heard. Please don't feel bad about keeping me late. I don't have anything else I need to do that afternoon and can stay until I get hungry for dinner.

The most important thing for me is that you are able to receive the graces of the sacrament. I would be thrilled to sit there for 2 hours or more, hearing confession after confession.

The same is true on December 22nd. I will be at St. Mary's at 5pm and will stay until 6 or until all

confessions are heard. This is in addition to our regular weekly scheduled confessions: Saturday 3-3:40pm at Visitation and Tuesday during adoration, about 6-6:30pm at St. Mary's.

There are other opportunities for confession around the area. There are a few priests scheduled to be at Our Saviour's in Jacksonville on December 21st, from 2-3pm. Look at other parish's bulletins or call the parishes for more.

We do have a student from Sacred Heart being confirmed on Tuesday evening. I encourage you to pray for Brant Evans as he goes to the Cathedral for his confirmation.

Finally, there is a Pre-Jordan Class for the parents of children who need to be baptized. This class is at 6pm on Friday, December 19th at 6pm. If you can let me know you are coming, I can make sure I have enough copies of the materials.

We are firmly into winter now. I hope you have all been enjoying the snow. As a reminder, I tend to determine whether to have daily Masses based on whether the local schools close or have a delay. If New Berlin closes, morning Mass is cancelled for the day. If the school at the place where Mass is to be that day closes, then morning Mass is also cancelled for the day.

For Tuesday Evening Mass, I would just see how things are falling to determine whether we should have Mass or not.

As a reminder, if you cannot safely get to Church, the obligation for Mass, even on the weekends, is lifted. This does not mean that you can leave the hose on your driveway overnight to make it unsafe. If the weather (or any external force) legitimately causes you to be unable to get to Mass, then there can be no obligation to go to Mass. This is also true if you are seriously ill or hospitalized. If you are unable to get to Mass, then you are released from the obligation for Sunday or Holy Day Masses.

With all that said, we are still called to keep the Sabbath Holy. This can look different for different people. However, reading and meditating on the scriptures of the day, refraining from excessive and unnecessary work, and participating in a livestream or televised Mass are all good ways to keep the day holy.

You can also make a special point to pray the rosary or do other spiritual works during the day. The point here is to intentionally worship God, despite not being able to receive the Eucharist at Mass or being able to get to the Church.

I hope you continue to have a happy and holy Advent Season.


