Merry Christmas! We remain in the Christmas Season for a couple weeks. It ends after the Baptism of the Lord, on January 11th.

First, a couple of reminders. I am out of town until January 2. There will be no weekday Mass while I am gone, except on January 1st. New Year's day is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Mass will be on January 1 at 9am at St. Mary's.

You may not know that all Catholics are obligated to participate in the celebration of Mass on all Sundays (or the appropriate vigil on Saturday) and on certain Holy Days. Maybe some of you have noticed how the Mass changes your attitudes each week. Maybe some of you can see yourself becoming more generous or patient or forgiving of others. Maybe you can see in yourself a change of your heart that has made you think of those in need around you.

The Mass is an important source of Spiritual nourishment for our soul. Full participation in the Mass helps us to learn those attitudes of patience, forgiveness, generosity, and empathy. The Mass

teaches us that we can sacrifice for others. While many people may feel like they have a pretty good grasp on our virtues and the growth in them, there is always more to learn and more ways to grow.




