CODE OF CONDUCT

Student Camp Code of Conduct 2026

Overnight camp regularly provides a unique opportunity for connection with God, small group leaders, and peers. Keystone Church values the trust parents place in our Pastoral Staff and CREW leaders to guide their students spiritually and provide a safe environment for camp. In order for Keystone Church to host an effective camp, we must begin with a safe camp. We ask both parents and students to join our commitment to this vision.

Keystone Student Code of Conduct

As a student attending Keystone Student Camp, I will:

1. Follow my CREW leader with respect and comply with their direction
2. I agree to treat others with respect
3. I agree to respect Camp property
4. I will not bring alcohol and/or drugs to Camp
5. I agree to give all medication to the Camp Nurse
6. I will not bring fireworks, knives, firearms, or weapons of any kind
7. I will agree to give my phone to my CREW Leader while at camp
8. I will remain in my cabin after Lights Out (Sneaking out is considered a safety risk to campers and will be taken seriously)

Violations to the Student Code of Conduct may result in, but are not limited to:

- Student dismissal from camp*
- Student and Parent meeting with Pastoral Staff after the completion of camp
- Possible suspension from future Keystone Church overnight events
- Cost of damages caused to camp property covered by the Parent/Student

**** In the event that a student is dismissed from camp due to a violation of the Student Code of Conduct, return transportation from camp will be at the parent's expense***

PACKING LIST

Clothes:

- There are no events that require you to dress nice. Students wear shorts and t-shirts all day. We are outside most of the day; dress appropriately for summer weather. Avoid expensive clothing. Bring clothes you don't mind if they get lost or damaged.
- Two changes of clothes for Tues-Thurs are suggested, but not required. Most students wear one set for daytime and dress according to our Night Time Theme for the evening (see below.)
- It is a good idea to pack a light jacket or sweatshirt should it rain.
- Clothing: All clothing must be modest. Avoid shirts and shorts that reveal the buttocks or chest. Many dress to support their Team Colors (see next page.)
- Shoes: Rec and Team Time require Closed-toe tennis shoes for safety. Sandals or flip-flops for swim time.
- Swimsuits: Girls should bring a tankini or one piece swimsuit (a t-shirt or swim shirt must be worn over a two-piece)

Night Time Themes:

- Monday Night - Camp Kick Off (Wear your CREW Colors *see next page)
- Tuesday Night - Western Night (Bring your hat, boots and western shirt)
- Wednesday Night - Lip Sync Battle (Lip Sync 2026 attire is coordinated within your CREW)
- Thursday Night - Baptism and Closing Ceremonies (No special attire)

Accessories:

- Water Bottle
- Bible
- Pillow, sheets & blanket or sleeping bag (Camp beds are twin bunk beds - camp provides only the mattress. No bedding is provided)
- 2-3 towels for showers and swimming
- Toiletries/soap/shampoo
- Sunglasses/sunscreen
- Disposable, Waterproof Camera
- Backpack (Keystone will provide a drawstring backpack)
- Watch (No Smart Watches Allowed)
- Collapsible laundry hamper (optional)
- Over The Door towel hanger (optional)
- Money for Concessions. \$20 should be plenty for the week. Cash or a prepaid gift card are suggested. Most items cost \$1-3.

Luggage:

- All items MUST be packed in a duffel bag or soft-sided suitcase.

*Luggage tags provided at check-in. Your bag should have a handle that allows a tag to be placed around it.

*Packing in trash bags is prohibited.

- NO STORAGE TRUNKS

*Anyone who arrives with a trunk will need to go home and get a soft sided bag. Trunks do not fit under the charter buses.

- There is a limit of one large bag and one small bag per person.

You may bring a backpack for the bus.

- Everything must be packed in luggage.

*No loose items allowed. (Bedding, pillows, etc)

*Since all luggage must be stored under the charter bus, your compliance is appreciated.

** All luggage and backpacks will be inspected by a K-9 team. Should any items be packed that violate the Keystone Student Code of Conduct, immediate dismissal from Camp is possible. See next page for more details on prohibited items.

WHAT **NOT** TO BRING TO CAMP:

- EXPENSIVE ITEMS (there is no space to lock these items away)
- RECORDING DEVICES Ex. GoPro's are not allowed (Keystone photographers are happy to take any photo or video requested. These can be found on our camp photo link that will be emailed.)
- CELL PHONES (camper cell phones will be collected by CREW Leaders and held for them during camp)
- OTHER ELECTRONICS Ex: Tablet, Speakers, TVs, Electronic Games, Laser Pointers, etc
- SNACKS containing nuts
- WATER GUNS This includes water balloons and water balloon launchers
- NICOTINE Tobacco, pouches, or vape products in any form, matches, or lighters
- FIREWORKS or any other explosive/fire-making devices, including snap pops
 - ILLEGAL DRUGS including Marijuana, THC pens or THC gummies
- ALCOHOL
- WEAPONS Firearms, Knives, or any other device intended to harm others

ADDITIONAL INFO

Is there a nurse available?

- Yes. Multiple nurses and EMT are on site all week.

How are medications administered?

- Meds are administered by the camp nursing staff.
- Medicine must be brought in a gallon-sized bag. In original packaging. Student name and grade on outside. Please send only the number of pills for each day at camp. Keep extra medicine at home.
- Inhalers, and Epi-Pens are kept by the CREW leader.

What meds will the nurse have available?

- OTC medicines (Tylenol, Ibuprofen, Pepto, Claritin & Zyrtec).

What happens if my student is injured?

- Should a student get hurt at camp, you will be notified immediately. If the injury requires a hospital visit, someone from Keystone Staff will take your student to the hospital with your approval.

Are there lifeguards for the pool?

- Yes. The camp has certified lifeguards on duty during all pool hours.

What does the camp do for security?

- The camp is a closed campus and visitors are not allowed. Keystone will have dedicated volunteers patrolling throughout the campus all week.

How are camp Servant Leaders screened?

- All CREW leaders are selected by Keystone Church Pastoral Staff. All Keystone Servant Leaders going to camp have gone through extensive training, child protection training, and a Criminal Background Check. Email Lisa at lisa.moore@keystonechurch.com for more information.

Are students allowed to keep their phone at camp?

- No. Keystone Church believes the best way for God to speak to our students is to remove distractions. We want to hear from God and value the connection between students and leaders. Technology can be a barrier to a student thriving in these areas. For this reason, we value our time at camp as a phone-free experience. Should you have questions about this, please contact our Student Pastors.

What are the sleeping arrangements?

- Cabins are split up by guy/girl and grade.
- CREW Leaders and students sleep in the same cabin.

What if my student needs to arrive late or leave early?

- A time away form must be submitted. Contact Lisa Moore at: lisa.moore@keystonechurch.com to receive the form
- Once your student leaves camp, they may return as long as prior arrangements are made with Keystone Student Staff.
- Unannounced arrival at camp will not be permitted due to safety protocols in place for campers.

How is food served?

- Food is served by camp staff. Family Style dining. Small Groups sit together.

ALL FOOD ALLERGIES

- There will be a separate line for students with food allergies. All meals are prepared and served separately.

Does my student need money?

- Optional. There will be a snack shack and a gift shop where they may purchase items. There are t-shirts, drinks, and souvenirs. Most items are inexpensive. No more than \$20 to \$30 for the week would be needed.

What are we doing?

- Safety is our number one priority for StudentCamp
- All Servant Leaders are trained and background checked
- No student is allowed to wander alone
- Students are not allowed near the woods surrounding camp
- The pool is always supervised by Lifeguards
- Nurses will care for students with signs of illness
- Parents will be contacted in any case of emergency
- Guys are not allowed in girls cabins and vice versa
- If you see a violation of camp guidelines, find an adult

What can you do?

- **Hydrate.** Camp is mostly outdoors, please hydrate prior to arrival and during camp.
- **Rest.** Camp is extremely fun and days in the sun can be long. Come rested and prepared for what God has for you.
- **Sun Protection/Awareness.** Please prepare your student for spending time in the sun and how to protect themselves.
- **Stay well.** Make sure your student has not had a fever or cough 7 days before camp.
- **Prayer.** Join us in prayer for a safe and fun camp.

BAPTISM

WHAT IS BAPTISM?

Baptism is the very first step a new believer takes when following Jesus. Baptism is the outward expression following an inward decision to put your faith in Jesus. The decision to follow Jesus is deeply personal, but is not supposed to remain private. We believe that every follower of Jesus should follow His example and be baptized by immersion.

STUDENT BAPTISM

Every year at Student Camp, many students choose to begin a relationship with Jesus for the first time. Once that moment happens, our CREW leaders provide guidance and counsel through their decision. We will offer baptism on Thursday night of camp. We encourage any student who makes the decision to follow Christ to be publicly baptized.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

When a student chooses to follow Christ, we encourage them to share with you as soon as possible. The CREW leader with your student will provide a phone for your student to call you. No student will be allowed to be baptized without the parent's approval. Baptism will be provided at Keystone Church Aug 3 for any parent wanting to be in attendance for that moment.

POST-CAMP

A student's spiritual development is something we handle with great care. Our CREW leaders are highly dedicated volunteers who walk along side your student on a weekly basis. Weekly attendance at church on the weekend and Wednesday night is encouraged for your student's growth as a Christ follower. We can also provide a step-by-step guide to help you lead your student at home. We will also lead every student to get involved in volunteering at Keystone Church.

HEART PREPARATION

As camp approaches pray for each of your campers daily by name. Pray over their current spiritual and physical situation. Some may be coming to get away from home, others are coming to have fun, and some may come and not yet know why. Ask God to make their hearts ready for what He wants to do. Ask the Holy Spirit to show Himself to them in a REAL way that they can understand. Pray for your student's small group leader, so that nothing would distract them as they prepare for the amazing week ahead.

LIFE CHANGE

At camp we always pray for life change to occur. At Keystone, we believe that when you truly encounter Jesus, you're changed FOREVER. Pray that your students have a huge encounter with Jesus Christ.

A RENEWED HEART

A student's journey with Christ has different seasons. We know this is a reality for all Christ followers. We pray that Jesus would be real to all students and their passions renewed every day. Pray they would know that following God is so much better than any of the temptations students are facing.

CONSISTENCY

Pray for your campers by name, and pray that they would always remember this moment of what God has done in their lives. Pray that they would chase after God, and pray that you would be able to help them follow God's design after camp.

PASSION

At Keystone we want to lead everyone to experience a PASSIONATE life in CHRIST. Pray for your student's small group leader by name, and pray that God would use them to help your student see a passionate life in Christ in their leader!
