**Haiti Kids School** is a MN-based non-profit that supports nearly 600 children in Léogâne, Haiti. Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, and Léogâne was at the epicenter of Haiti's catastrophic 2010 earthquake in which 90% of the town's buildings were destroyed. This earthquake was ranked the 4th deadliest natural disaster on the planet in recorded history. Crisis aid was given by many compassionate individuals and nations, but the rebuilding of Léogâne's infrastructure and its children's futures has been ongoing....

**Haiti Kids School** is pleased to be part of building this future! Prior to the earthquake, a partnership between the MN-based Haiti Kids Team and Haitian Staff had already begun. Since the earthquake, the school has been rebuilt (with the addition of a high school wing!), and has experienced exponential growth in enrollment due to Haitian families fleeing gang activity in surrounding regions and showing up at our door.
