## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What's the best human experience?

Ice-cream? It is Biblical. God promises a land flowing with milk and honey. Sounds like ice-cream to me. What's the best human experience? Electricity? For those of us who were without electricity, electricity is up there as one of the best human experiences. What's the best human experience? First kiss? Or maybe being young? There are many firsts. However, there is plenty of anxiety with firsts. I much prefer preaching now, than when I was learning. I much prefer riding a motorcycle now, than when I was first learning. What's the best human experience? Motherhood? Parenthood? But what if you are not called by God to be a parent?

What is the one thing that all humans can do to experience the best human experience?

Read what Jesus believes is the best human experience in John 15:12-17.

For the last few years I have been attempting to cultivate an orchard. I have cherry, apple, pear, plum and peach trees planted. If I can protect them from the deer this summer and fall, next year they will flourish. One of the scariest but most important activities is pruning the trees. I say scariest, because I don't really know what I am doing and to prune correctly, you must cut off a lot. It always seems cutting off is going to hurt the tree, but in fact, when you prune in the winter it grows even more vigorously. They flourish.

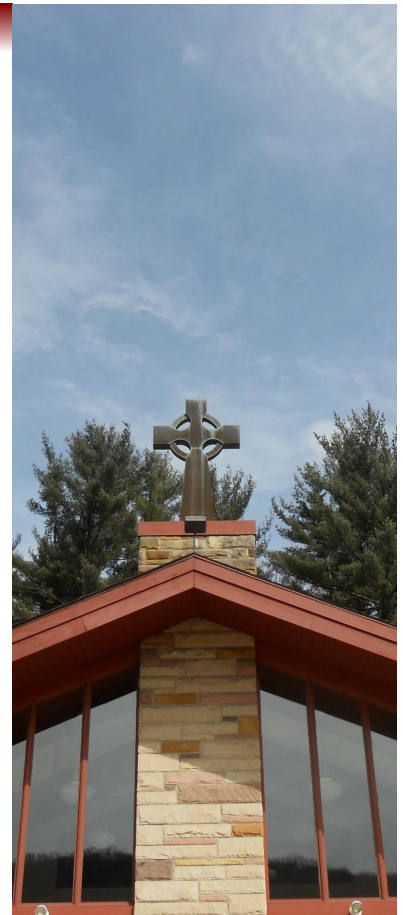
Let's say a tree has 100 branches. It only has so much energy to use. If you cut back 30 of the branches, now the tree has more energy for the 70 branches than it does for 100 branches.

**Think about your own life. You have limited time and energy. Prayerfully consider what you need to cut-back to give more energy to the things that bear fruit! Jesus teaches, "Every branch that bears fruit God prunes to make it bear more fruit." -John 15:2**

Yes, when pruning you cut-off dead branches, but the strange thing is, you also cut-back the branches that are your best fruit producers so the next season they produce even more.

You can't do it all nor should you! But what's the best human experience?

### ***Along the Way: On the Road to the Present Age***

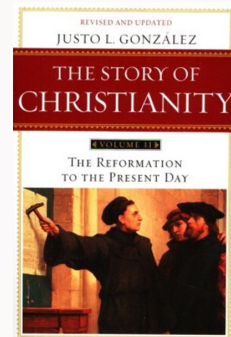
In the 2024-2025 programming year, a number of NPC members gathered to study both the origins of the early church and then the events leading up to, during, and immediately after the Reformation.

In September, we will come together again for *Along the Way: On the Road to the Present Age*. Don Pearson and Travis Webster will lead this 14-session course, in which we will pick up right after the Reformation and follow the church's history to modern times, with an emphasis on the development of the church in the United States. For our main resources, we will continue using Justo Gonzalez's *The Story of Christianity*, revised edition (mostly volume 2, with a small amount of reading out of volume 1), as well as the Great Courses lectures featuring UNC Chapel Hill professor Dr. Molly Worthen. You don't have to have taken the previous installments to join us in the Gathering Place on **Wednesdays from 10:15 am-12:15 pm, starting September 10<sup>th</sup>**. ## AUGUST 3<sup>RD</sup> HUNGER OFFERING TO PROVIDE FOOD RELIEF FOR THE PEOPLE OF UKRAINE

Our August Hunger Offering, which will be taken on **Sunday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>**, will help to provide food assistance to the victims of the ongoing war in Ukraine. The funds received from this offering will be designated for Ukrainian food relief and will be sent to World Central Kitchen (WCK) in support of their #ChefsForUkraine program.

Over three years after the initial Russian invasion in February 2022, the situation in Ukraine is even more dire. The fighting continues, including the enormous recent Russian drone and missile attacks. The devastating war in Ukraine has driven millions from their homes, and the consequences of the conflict have radiated outwards, triggering a wave of hunger in the immediate region and around the world. The war has destroyed farmland and infrastructure, killed livestock, and disrupted vital supply chains – all of which have driven hunger within Ukraine. Today, 12.7 million people need humanitarian assistance, including 2 million children – that's nearly 1 in 3 families. Close to 7 million Ukrainians are still living as refugees globally, and another 3.7 million are internally displaced.

Since the beginning of the war, it has been estimated that World Central Kitchen has served 276+ million meals, provided 2+ million gallons of water, distributed 10.7+ million food and vegetable kits, provided emergency response to 500+ attack sites, and distributed 216,000+ seed kits.

It is important to note that World Central Kitchen has a “100%” - Four-Star “Exceptional” rating on Charity Navigator, which is the highest level possible. This signifies that they “exceed industry standards and outperform most charities.” They are celebrating 15 years of service around the world this year. WCK has also provided amazing food relief work in Gaza and was on the scene to provide aid to victims of wildfires earlier this year in Southern California.

Please give generously in support of the people of Ukraine who continue to struggle to survive.

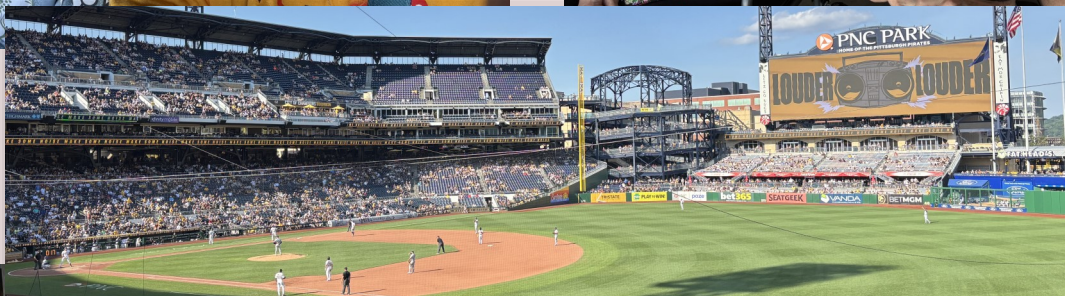
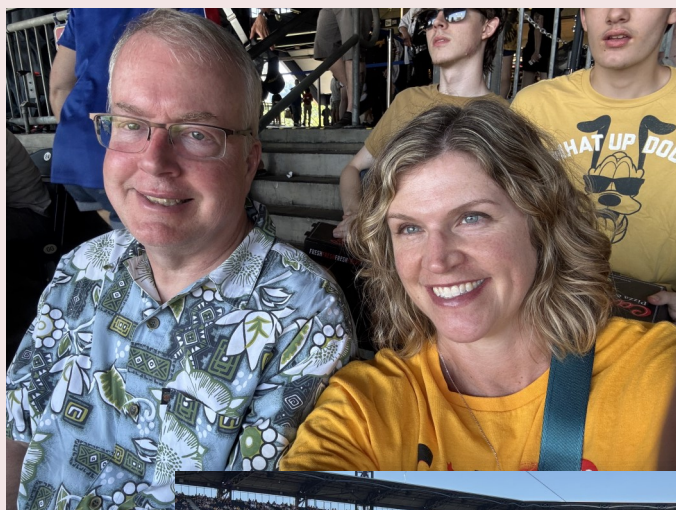


## PSC COUNSELOR BLESSED

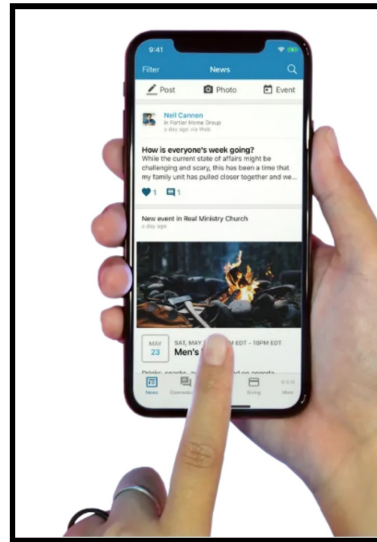

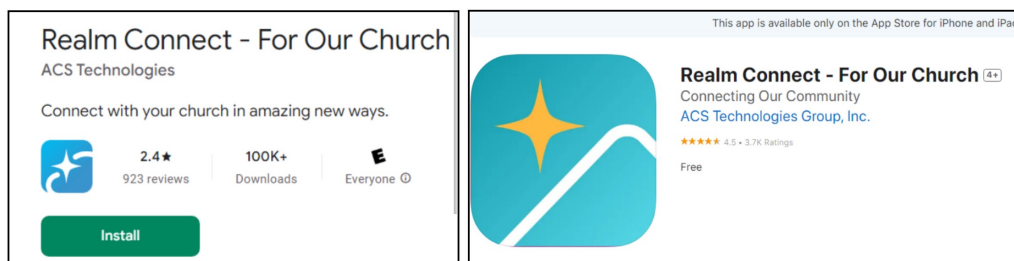
