Why All Christians Should Celebrate Juneteenth

Christians should celebrate Juneteenth because we worship the liberating God who is Jesus Christ.

Why should all Christians celebrate Juneteenth? For the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ lives to set people free as we read in Luke 4:16-30.

It was on June 19th, 1865 that General Granger led 2000 US troops to Texas to proclaim the end of slavery in the US and the enslaved people were now free.

Juneteenth celebrates that the United States enacted the Biblical principle that "all are created in the image of God (Genesis 1:27)."

Christians should celebrate Juneteenth in response to the Bible's main theme which is God setting people free! By the power of the Holy Spirit, the Bible was written by the oppressed for the oppressed.

Jesus lives to free us from sin and to transform society. Before we can be free from sin, we must recognize sin. The reason all Christians should celebrate Juneteenth is to recognize the national sin of slavery. As Abraham Lincoln called it, "America's original sin." The concept of original sin is that we are born into it. Before we are even aware of it, sin shapes our decisions and who we are. Jesus lives to free us from this bondage. Celebrating Juneteenth helps us recognize that American slavery caused deep social wounding and scarring that continues to this day. As Nehemiah reminds us, the only way to heal from a national sin is transparency through prayer.

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED SO OUR FACILITY CONTINUES TO ENABLE CHRIST'S WORK.

The Property Ministry has identified three near-term projects that need to be undertaken for safety concerns and/or to continue the usability and welcomeness of our facility.

Parking Lot: Property has evaluated repairs to get a few more years out of the current surface, but repairs would be extensive and costly. Based on the most effective use of our gifts, the contractor will repair the large holes and install a new 2-inch asphalt layer over the entire lot, with new line striping. We hope to receive enough gifts or commitments before July 25th so that we can take advantage of lower-than-expected paving quotes and do work this summer while the lot is less used.

Common Ground HVAC System: This work is a follow up to the successful 2023 water infiltration/wall project. As users of Common Ground know, the original duct work, installed in the 1970s, is in the floor and these ducts have collapsed resoling in a nonfunctional HVAC. This project will include new ductwork in the ceiling.

NPC Sign: A recent storm destroyed our NPC sign and surrounding stone. Thankfully no one was hurt. Right now, we have no road signage informing drivers we are here.

These three project costs are estimated to total \$127,000. Please consider a gift this summer to maintain our building and grounds so they can continue to be a resource to further the Kingdom of God. Gifts and commitments are requested by July 25, 2025. Thanks to the generosity of the congregation and its donations of funds, talent, and time, we can continue to maintain the church as a welcoming facility in good repair.
