If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being! -2 Corinthians 5:17


Jesus lives to live in us and with us.

Congregations pay an annual amount of money per church member - per capita apportionment - to their respective presbyteries. Per capita is the way congregations of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) connect, participate, and share in the work of the wider church, "mutually sharing the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading." Help reduce Per Capita costs to NPC by contributing your share (\$55 per member in 2026). Last year, 20% of members participated; this year, Stewardship & Finance aims for 30% to give their share. 
LENTEN STUDY FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY! STARTS FEBRUARY 23RD AT 5:30-6:30

For over 1,500 years, the church has been observing Lent, which is the 40-day period before Easter commemorating Jesus' journey to the cross, death, and resurrection. It can be a time for remarkable spiritual growth as we turn our attention to his sacrifice on our behalf.

In such a season, it can be good to join with other Christians in intentional reflection and preparation, supporting and learning with one another as we journey alongside Jesus. This year, we will have that opportunity using Adam Hamilton's study *The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life*. In *The Walk*, Adam Hamilton focuses on five essential spiritual practices (worship, study, serving, giving, and bearing witness to our faith) that are rooted in Jesus' own walk with God and taught throughout the New Testament. In each chapter, Hamilton explores one of these practices, its New Testament foundation, and what it looks like to pursue this practice daily in our personal lives and together in the life of the church.

This year, we are doing something new – we are offering an option for some of our youngest members! This six-week course will have one section for children (3 years old-5th grade) and one for adults and youth together in the weeks leading up to Easter. The meetings for all ages will take place on Monday evenings from 5:30-6:30 pm (Feb. 23, March 2, 9, 16, 23, 30); there will also be a Zoom option for the Monday adult/youth class.

SALVATION ARMY MURRYSVILLE/EXPORT THANKS NPC

Roger Schneider, NPC member and local coordinator of the annual Red Kettle campaign for the Export/Murrysville Service Unit of the Salvation Army, sends out sincere thanks to all the NPC members who helped this past year.

On the last Saturday of November and the first three weekends in December before this past Christmas, 47 individuals from NPC generously gave 154 hours of their time to help assist in the Red Kettle days by ringing those familiar bells and encouraging passers-by to put a contribution in the red buckets, by helping set up and take down equipment at the 6 local locations and by helping to count the contributions. This year, over 140 volunteers of all ages from local congregations, Franklin Regional High School, and scouting and service organizations in the community joined together to help those in need.

The funds raised will be used locally for the next 12 months to provide cash assistance to those in need. Food vouchers are also available through the Murrysville Loaves and Fishes Emergency Food Pantry. During these challenging times, our community gave generously at our local kettle locations to help raise just under \$15,500. This is a new record for the service unit, with the most recent highest total being nearly \$15,000 last year! The volunteer gifts of time during the busy holiday season will make it possible for our local Salvation Army Service Unit to continue living up to the Salvation Army motto: "Doing the Most Good"! Thanks to all who volunteered and those who donated.

Here at NPC, we'll start the day off right by joining with congregations around the country to help our needy neighbors through the Souper Bowl of Caring. It's a simple, yet significant act of caring for others. AND, if things go right, we'll be watching our Pittsburgh Steelers defeat a yet-to-be-determined (as of the Good Newlonsburg deadline) opponent later in the day!



Watch for our youth who will be collecting your gifts BEFORE and AFTER both services. Please be sure to drop off your cans of soup or cash contribution on **Sunday, February 8th**. Loaves and Fishes food pantry suggests bringing two cans of regular soup and one can of chunky-style soup per family. These will be immediately put to use in our Murrysville Loaves and Fishes Emergency Food Pantry. Last year, you generously brought in 142 cans of soup and dropped \$307.00 in cash contributions into the large soup pots held by our NPC youth. By the middle of February 2025, youth from 1,386 groups around the country had raised a whopping total of \$19,209,146.38 worth of food or cash contributions!! This is strong proof that many small gifts can make a big difference in the lives of those in need!

FROM THE YOUTH DIRECTOR

In the month of February, we celebrate Valentine's Day. On this day, the church remembers St. Valentine. Little is known about his life, and the only certain thing is that he was martyred for the faith. Beyond that, it is hard to separate fact from fiction, or to untangle the story of one Valentine from another.

Despite these historical mysteries and debates, one thing is clear: love is one of the most important aspects of the Christian faith. And while Hallmark will capitalize on the opportunity to make money off of romantic love, I would like to take a moment to focus on *agape*, which is the term used in 1 John 4:18, which refers to unconditional love.

I have learned that practicing *agape* requires an examination of my motivation and a shift in my focus. If I do something out of fear, my actions and motives are focused on myself. If I do something out of selfless love, I focus on the well-being of those who would benefit. I believe Jesus calls us to practice *agape* when he says, "love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:31).

And while I could say a little more about this topic, I recommend the works of people who are much more knowledgeable. One of them is Rev. Dr. Jacqui Lewis, who wrote a book and has a podcast on the topic of love. Her book is titled *Fierce Love*, and her podcast is *Love Period*. I haven't read her book, but I have

enjoyed her podcast and the guests she converses with. Another author I recommend is Fr. Richard Rohr, and his book *Eager to Love*.

My hope this month is that you take time to learn about the prophetic path of Love outlined for us by Jesus. In a world full of cheesy cards, overpriced chocolate, and romantic comedies, let's be the people who are called to love and who put that love into action. Or as Pastor Curtis says, "For the glory of God and betterment of humanity." Amen.



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING FISH BANKS! STARTS FEB. 22ND. ENDS PALM SUNDAY!



REALM CONNECT APP

Getting Started with Realm and the Realm Connect App

Realm is Newlonsburg's online portal to access a member directory, view and register for events, communicate with other members, give online and view giving records, schedule volunteer roles, share documents and messages for group activities, and receive news and announcements from NPC.

Realm Connect is accessible in both web and app versions. Once you establish a username and password, the login will work for either platform.

Each member is a user in the system and uses an individual email address for the login. You cannot have the same email for login purposes as another member.

Realm Connect Features

Directory

The searchable online directory contains all the information in the print directory plus you can call or message anyone with one click. Members can directly add and edit their email, phone numbers, addresses, and profile pictures.

Communications

Email, call, or text with one click from the directory. Have a discussion with a small group. The communications portal enables you to send photos and messages to one or a large group of members.

Events

You can view, register, and receive reminders for upcoming NPC events. You can also use mobile check in to sign into worship and other events.



Newsfeed


You can receive news, announcements, and notifications to always get the most up to date NPC information.

Volunteering

Learn about volunteer positions, get reminders about when you are scheduled to volunteer, and access your volunteer group's schedule.

Yes. Information is encrypted. For online gifts, Realm's payment processor complies with the highest level of security standards.

Do I have to download the app to participate in NPC events?

No. Realm is a tool to make staying connected and getting involved in activities/events easier. There will continue to be ways to access all aspects of NPC without Realm.

What if I forgot my password?

If you have a Realm account, but forgot your password, you can visit the main login page and request to reset the password:



How do I know when there is new information in the app?

You can turn on notifications to receive new updates from NPC and NPC members.
