FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Have you ever tried to change your behavior? It's not easy. Hope has been trying to change my behavior for 19 years, and the Holy Spirit has been trying even longer. In fact, some studies show that we need to practice the new behavior as many as 18 to 254 days.

The reason for the big difference in the number of days is that we individuals are incredibly psychologically different. If you want to have a deep dive into going to Heaven and behavior change, the letter to the Romans is for you! God's Word teaches it's not simply a psychological issue, it's spiritual. **Read Romans 6.**

As Paul's friendship with Jesus Christ deepens, he proclaims the good news of the possibility of radical behavior change, radical spiritual change. Paul wouldn't use the phrase "behavior change," as you heard, he is using the phrases "slaves to sin" and "slaves to righteousness" or "dead to sin" and "alive to God in Christ." Paul believes God wants to save us from sin and the consequence of sin, which is death. Paul believes Jesus lives for us to live well, to live Heaven on earth, to live free!

God's Word teaches there is only one solution to our great spiritual crisis: proclaim the free gift of God, who is Jesus Christ. We can't force anyone to have faith. Love does not force. But we can proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ! Tell stories about Him.

Do you want to live well? Paul would say it this way, "Do you want to avoid God's wrath?" Accept God's gift by trusting that God wants good things for you by following Jesus Christ.

The first step is awareness. I teach the boys all the time, "Don't be zombies." And I have been preaching the image of zombies often because it is a great metaphor of life before and after Christ. Before Christ, we don't even know we are zombies. We are just following our guts, our cravings, our hunger. Zombies aren't alive, they are just living consuming others. For Paul, this is how he understands people before Christ, they are dead to sin. They are living but not alive, not even aware that they are heading to death or they are already dead.

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I like to use brushing teeth as an example. Our boys don't have the choice to brush their teeth. From little children, we encouraged, enforced the habit and eventually discussed the reasons why brushing teeth is beneficial because we understand that not brushing teeth leads to death. So not only must they trust us that teeth-brushing leads to life, but they must pursue this holiness morning and evening.

The more Hope and I discuss what we want for our sons when it comes to the faith of Jesus Christ, it is this: **instilling the habits of daily prayer and weekly worship like Jesus did.** Hopefully, they will come to have faith, but that is between them and the Holy Spirit. Hopefully, they will come to believe they no longer have to obey sin. Hopefully, they will offer their lives to God and embrace new life in Christ.

ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITIES


"Game On" Sunday is September 7th! Another programming year, another opportunity to join some fantastic Adult Education classes at Newlonsburg Presbyterian Church!

Don Pearson will be starting a new study on John's gospel. Drawing on the voices of several different pastors and scholars, the class will explore how John portrayed the life and person of Jesus. They meet during the Sunday Christian Education hour (9:45-10:45 am) in Common Ground.

Dennis Skeers will continue his leadership of the Faith and Contemporary Issues course. This class uses current events as a basis for discerning how to live faithfully in the world around us. They meet during the Sunday Christian Education hour (9:45-10:45 am) in the Gathering Place.

Curtis Paul will hold a class on Sunday mornings that will watch and discuss The Chosen. This will meet during the Sunday Christian Education hour (9:45-10:45 am) in Fellowship Hall.

Don Pearson and Travis Webster will be continuing their study, titled *Along the Way: On the Road to the Present Age*. Over 14 sessions, Along the Way will take participants through church history in the modern era, with an emphasis on the development of the church in the United States. We will use Justo Gonzalez's *The Story of Christianity* and lectures from "The Great Courses" as our primary sources. The class will meet on Wednesdays from 10:15 am to 12:15 pm, starting September 10th. All students will need a copy of *The Story of Christianity, volume two* (updated and revised edition), and will receive a workbook with additional materials. HUNGER OFFERING ON SEPTEMBER 7TH TO HELP WILKINSBURG FOOD PANTRY

Our Hunger Offering in September will go to Wilkinsburg Community Ministry (WCM), which is located in downtown Wilkinsburg. WCM was originally a collaboration of several area churches, with members of the board representing each of the churches. In 1968, clergy and lay leaders from ten congregations formed the Board of Directors for the Wilkinsburg Community Ministry. The unity of several congregations made it possible for WCM to meet the extreme needs of poverty and hunger in the community. Today, WCM unites congregations, local business owners, service groups, and individuals to help the folks of Wilkinsburg, Homewood, East Hills, Swissvale, Braddock, Edgewood, and East Pittsburgh neighborhoods address food insecurity for all people regardless of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, and creed.



WCM focuses its efforts solely on food and nutrition, which remains among the greatest challenges to residents. With fresh food provided by local gardeners and relationships with the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, 412 Food Rescue, Trader Joe's, Market District, and Whole Foods, WCM strives to provide a more balanced source of food. Food is shared with over 5,000 residents per year, including senior citizens, citizens with disabilities, at-risk youth, and families who are economically challenged, underemployed, or facing emergencies.

Food is distributed through the storefront pantry that's located in the downtown Wilkinsburg location on Wood Street. In 2020, an urban garden was started at the rear of the building, which also contains a greenhouse, and this provides some locally grown fresh foods. In 2022, with the support of the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, WCM started a mobile pantry service in which a 27-foot truck equipped with a refrigerator/freezer is taken to seven different locations in the service area (on separate days) six days a week, to distribute food to people with transportation challenges. This "storefront pantry on wheels" operates in the late afternoon and early evening to help working families. It serves about 50-65 families at each location. MURRYSVILLE CROP HUNGER WALK PLANS SET FOR OCTOBER 12TH

The 46th annual Church World Service Murrysville CROP Hunger Walk will be held on Sunday, October 12th. We will join with over 2,600 communities around the country that organize these walks each year to help provide funds to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, heal the sick, and provide shelter for the homeless children of God in more than 80 countries around the world. Last year, CROP Hunger Walks raised over \$3 million to assist those struggling to feed their families. Appropriately, the letters **CROP** stand for **C**ommunities **R**esponding to **O**vercome **P**overty.

Last year's hybrid virtual and in-person Walk saw NPC joining together with five other local area teams to raise a total of nearly \$8,000. Our NPC in person and virtual team raised an amazing \$5,864 of the total amount raised locally! Out of 2,416 teams with October Walk dates in 2024, our NPC team fundraising placed in the top 100 – coming in at #68 in the entire nation. This year's fundraising plans will continue to rely primarily on online and social media fundraising. Hopefully, it will also be possible for some Walker sponsors to contribute in-person again this year, as well.

This year, we'll continue to make use of the wonderful asset we have in the Westmoreland Heritage Bike Trail. The route will be an approximate total of 3.5 miles (5 kilometers), with an approximate walk time of 1.5 hours. A water stop will be provided at the Walk midpoint, located at the parklet where Carson Avenue intersects the bike trail near the Murrysville Community Center. The Walk will begin and end at the Duff Park shelter at the park entrance off School Road South. Fortunately, the severe flooding that occurred this spring did not affect the section of the trail that we'll be using again. Sign-in will begin at the shelter at 1:00 pm, with the Walk beginning at approximately 1:30 pm. As we did, beginning in 2020, those who prefer to walk "virtually" may do so. This is a great option for those who are unable to participate on the actual October 12th Walk day.

Through the years, over 4,400 Murrysville Walk participants have raised nearly \$268,000 to fight hunger and poverty. Twenty-five percent of the money we raise in our Walk stays right here in Murrysville. We will again divide this portion three ways, between the Murrysville Loaves and Fishes Emergency Food Pantry here at NPC and the two local food distribution centers for the Westmoreland County Food Bank. One is at Mother of Sorrows Parish, and the other is at Cornerstone Ministries heading east toward Delmont on Rte. 22.

During the weeks to come, we'll be contacting all who have walked with NPC and who have contributed in recent years. We'll also be reaching out to invite new participants from our congregation and the community. Our goal is to continue our annual tradition of raising funds in support of the vital work of Church World



Service to fight hunger in our community, our nation, and around the world. For more information, please contact local walk coordinator and NPC member, Roger Schneider, at 412-613-8470 day or evening. You may also contact him by email at rogerls@comcast.net.






