FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

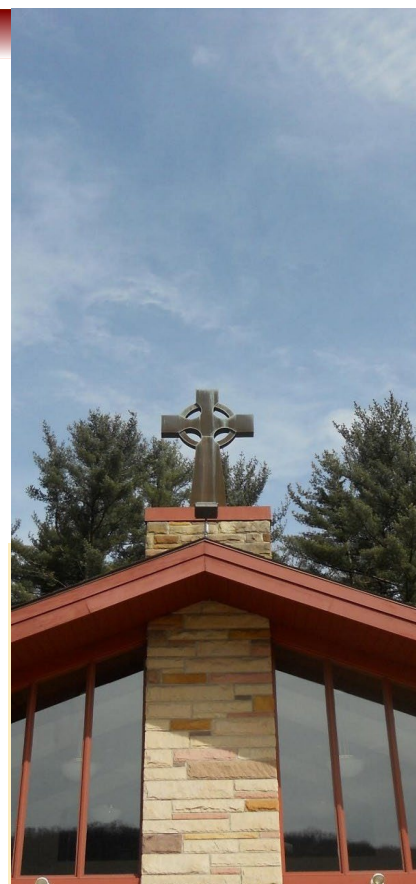
How are you God's presence in the world? In what ways have you been God's presence recently? In what ways are you training to be God's presence in the world?

Joseph, Jesus' human father (I make that distinction because we believe Jesus' actual Father is God), is reminded by an angel that Jesus is *Immanuel*. *Immanuel* in Hebrew means, "God is with us." This title comes from the prophet Isaiah in Isaiah 7:14. God commands Isaiah to use the name *Immanuel* to name Isaiah's son amid the Assyrians conquering Israel in 722BC. The capital of the northern kingdom of Israel was Samaria; hence, we get the name Samaritans. The southern kingdom of Israel took on the name Judah; hence, we get the name Jews. *Immanuel* is to be a sign that God is with us, even when the world is falling apart all around us.

Jesus doesn't want to be the only *Immanuel*, God with us. Jesus teaches us the Truth, the Way, and the Life for us to be God's presence in the world. The question is, "How are you training to be God's presence in the world?"

Jesus doesn't want you to train alone. Remember in John 20:22 when Jesus breathes into us and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit!" We can always call upon the Holy Spirit in prayer, especially in our darkest moments. Remember your baptism. When we are baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, one of the wonderful gifts that we receive is Christ's Holy Spirit. If we are in a dark moment because of something we have done, we can ask for God's forgiveness. If someone has hurt us, we can call upon the Holy Spirit to empower us to forgive. If you have not received the wonderful gift of Christ's Holy Spirit, if you have not been baptized by Christ's Holy Spirit, all you have to do is ask. Pray for Jesus to be the Lord of your life, ask Jesus to forgive you of your sins, and ask Jesus to breathe His Holy Spirit into your soul! Jesus wants you to be God's presence in the world.

Jesus doesn't want us to train alone! His Church is the training facility. It's at worship, where we are encouraged to serve to train each other. It's at worship, where we practice generosity to change the world. Jesus wants

us to be God's presence in the world and shows us how. In Matthew 25:31-46, Jesus prophesies that when He judges the whole world at His return, He will ask each of us, "How were you God's presence in the world?"

JANUARY 4TH HUNGER OFFERING TO AID STARVING PEOPLE IN SOUTH SUDAN

Although we now hear little about it in the news, the grave situation in South Sudan continues to worsen. The country broke off from Sudan in 2011 after decades of guerrilla warfare. After two years of peace, South Sudan experienced new conflict that pitted armed men from the largest ethnic groups against each other. The civil war that erupted in 2013 continues to rage on. Humanitarian needs in South Sudan have escalated to alarming levels, and the situation remains highly unstable and insecure. Countless people have died of hunger. Additional warfare broke out in the spring of 2023 as a power struggle between rival generals.

South Sudan is facing what the World Food Program has called “the humanitarian crisis of our time,” as tens of millions struggle through sieges, blockades, and aid shortages that have pushed entire cities into famine. More than 150,000 people have been killed, and millions have been displaced from their homes.

At least 21.2 million people are now facing high levels of acute food insecurity, according to the latest Integrated Food Security Phase Classification, the internationally recognized system for assessing famine and food insecurity.

Our first Hunger Offering of the new year, to be taken on **Sunday, January 4th**, will be used to help ease the tragedy that continues to befall our South Sudanese friends and to show them that they are not forgotten. Please help feed His sheep, and please pray for peace and comfort for all. Your generosity can truly make a life-saving difference to a brother or sister in South Sudan.

NEW ADULT EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY FOR WINTER 2026!

Along the Way: Mystics, Martyrs, and Saints

Over the past year and a half, a number of NPC members have been gathering to study church history, from the origins of the early church through the Protestant Reformation and up to the present day.

In January, we will come together again for *Along the Way: Mystics, Martyrs, and Saints*. Rather than going through church history chronologically, this 11-session course, lead by Don Pearson and Travis Webster, will explore particular individuals in church history within the context in which they lived and believed. As we go, we will learn about the process of canonization throughout the ages, discuss the role of saints in the modern day, and consider what we can learn from these pillars of Christian faith as we seek to live holy lives now. For our main resources, we will use the Great Courses series, particularly lectures offered by Dr. Emily Graham, of Oklahoma State University, and Dr. William Cook, from SUNY Geneseo. Supplementary materials will include a student book with additional lecture notes and primary readings.

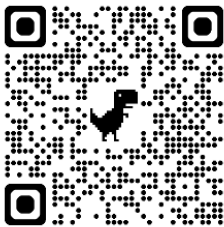

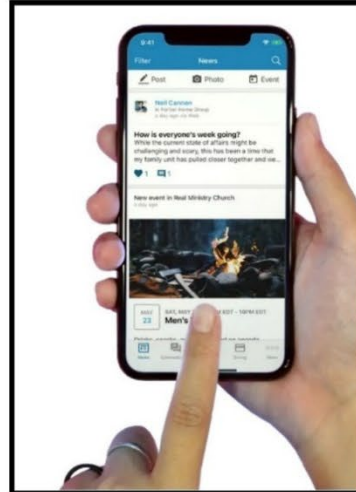
