## OLD BUSINESS - Review of the last C.A.T. meeting (June 2025):

- **Horses:**
  - Annual wellness check & barn call was May 30, 2025. The Richarson Family donated cash to help cover the annual wellness check and horse vaccinations. Cats still need their Rabies vax, because they were MIA when the vet came in May.
  - Farrier care was also administered.
  - Summer horse training routines were established.
  - We started seeking volunteers for winter horse care & stable management.
- **Facility:**
  - The round pen was finished and is in use almost daily for training and exercising the horses and for EAL lessons & programming.
  - Still no word from the Crawford County D & A Single County Authority regarding our application for the \$10,000 grant for the horse trailer.
- **Volunteers:** Volunteers needed!
  - Asked attendees to please refer people to the [VOLUNTEER page](#) of our website.
  - Mike and Markie helped out at the AICDAC Recovery Hub Conference. Horses couldn't come, as originally planned, due to horrible weather & a truck breakdown. The presentation went well, however and there was a lot of positive feedback from the conference attendees.
  - We made many new connections at the AICDAC Recovery Hub Conference and booked an 8-person staff retreat for the summer!
  - Thanks to volunteer, Kathy Dickinson who worked on recruiting volunteers for the July 12th Volunteer Roundup.
  - The July 12th Volunteer Roundup did not happen, because Deb's family visited from out of town at that time, so we canceled it.
- **Events:**
  - [Recovery Road Warriors ministry](#) launched! RRW is available to anyone residing in Crawford County.
  - [Campfire C.A.T. meetings](#) announced.
  - Reported on May's event: AICDAC Recovery Hub, Region 7 Conference.
  - Began accepting applications for the next round of Life's Healing Choices / E.A.L. Course.
  - Announced upcoming Recovery Celebration community events.
  - Called for volunteers to plan the October Horse Camp-Out event.
- **Programming:**
  - Finished Spring LHC/EAL and started Summer sign-ups and offered one course for adults in the summer.
  - We had only one new applicant for the FoR-HiM Youth EAL Program.
  - Programming for the rest of the summer was halted, due to a crisis in our family. *(God's story and our witness of Christ's redemptive power is still being written, so stay tuned for that testimony!)*
- **Future:**
  - Progress with the strategic plan was discussed.
  - Deb attended many training events and received adequate CEUs for her Certified Recovery Specialist (CRS) & Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor (CTRI) renewal requirements.
  - Fundraising and financial needs were discussed.
- **Closing:**
  - Prayer requests were shared.
  - Markie led us in the Serenity Prayer

**NEW BUSINESS:****Horse UPDATE**

1. **Faith's training:**
  - a. The trainer, Sarah Maracci backed out of our original contract due to changes in her situation.
  - b. With my shoulder injuries, I was unable to do a whole lot of consistent work with Faith in 2025, her 2nd year, and the first couple months of this, her 3rd year.
  - c. To give her experience with how to be a polite horse with humans, I hired a young Amish man to be her "handler" over the winter. Daniel has done very good work getting her more settled and safer while leading, holding her feet up for farrier, standing in crossties., etc. He even taught her to take a saddle and he put a few rides on her.
  - d. I found a professional trainer in Erie, and she will go to Faith Haven Stables in April.
  - e. Please pray for Faith and her new learning journey.
2. **Healthy & happy herd:**
  - a. All the horses thrived over the winter despite the severe weather and frigid temps. They lost some weight, but not more than expected and they all maintained a healthy body condition.
  - b. I'm sure they really appreciated the new barn roof with no leaks! (Thanks again, Leslie Minor!)

**Facility UPDATE**

1. **Round Pen Maintenance:** Weed control chemicals to be applied as soon as we have a sunny day without a lot of wind.
2. **Barn Roof Project:** Our new barn roof was installed last November, made possible by a generous donation from Leslie Minor.
3. **New Tack & Tool Shed:** We were also gifted with a 16'x20' shed with which to stow our tack & tools by Leslie Minor. We are still working on building out the interior with saddle racks & shelving.
4. **Borrowing a Tractor:** We are looking to borrow a tractor to install more stone in the driveway and make more repairs and renovations to the back stall of the barn.
5. **Horse Trailer & Truck:**
  - a. The horse trailer grant was not approved. The SCA did not respond to our inquiries about our grant application. We accept The Lord's providence in this, knowing He is ordering our steps... We continue to expect a miracle and God's perfect timing.
  - b. We no longer have an operational truck to pull a trailer. The truck's engine seized up last month. We are trusting the Lord for \$7,000 for the repair.

to have fun with my friends and horses. I believe Elaine's goal is to bless me for my birthday. Thank you Lainey! I love you! Volunteer, Cassy is planning to also attend my birthday outing at the Indoor Trail Course with her new horse, Titan! Our horse handler, Daniel will also attend to help us wrangle, as needed.

6. Volunteer helpers are especially necessary right now as I continue recovering from the shoulder surgery. Even after the doctor releases me to work again, I am not to lift more than 20 pounds, ever.

With such an unexpected windfall, it is possible for anyone interested in participating in our equine-assisted programs to attend at no out of pocket expense to them.   - a. Generally speaking, we do not "solicit" money from donors, but we have had requests from folks who want to add to our ministry financially, so we established a system to use those gifts from the wider community to help would-be students have access to our equine-assisted learning programs and recovery services through a Scholarship Fund. I've written up the official policy regarding how we distribute these funds in the [Scholarship Info & Application](#) sheet. The way the funds are disseminated is mostly on a first-come/first-served basis, however there are other considerations as outlined on the [Scholarship Info & Application](#) sheet.
  - b. We use all donated funds to care for and manage our herd, PLUS we offer tuition assistance to students and program applicants who request financial assistance.

- c. In order to eliminate barriers to the hope and healing of Jesus through our horsiness, we strive to never turn anyone away from receiving our services. We also endeavor to create an environment that promotes an individual's ownership and empowerment in their recovery by including a volunteer component to the dissemination of scholarship funding.

### **Immediate Needs Assessment & Financial Considerations:**

1. **Farm Truck repair:** The farm truck requires \$7000 in repairs. We use this vehicle to haul feed and hay for the horses.
2. **Liability insurance:** Since 2020, this annual expense has been met through personal contributions by Mike & Deb, however it is no longer feasible for them to shoulder this expense. We are trusting The Lord to provide ~\$2,000 for liability insurance by June. *(Community programming cannot continue beyond June 2026 without this line item. Please pray!)*
3. **Horse trailer:** Approximately, \$10,000 is needed for this line item, in order to execute our long-term sustainability plans.

#### **Why we want a horse hauling rig...**

- a. **Continuity of Care:** As you know, in 2024 we acquired a generous contribution from a community member *(also known as Debbie's Dad)* that enabled us to purchase an F-250 pulling/hauling vehicle. It broke down in Feb. and remains inoperable and will stay parked in the driveway at the farm until we raise \$7000 for the repairs. The barrier we want to eliminate for those we serve is the interruption of services that occurs every winter due to the lack of an indoor arena at our facility. Continuity of care is vital for people in recovery from life-threatening illnesses and addictions. Having the ability to haul our horses to a borrowed or rented indoor arena when weather is inclement is more affordable than adding an indoor arena to our current property. Obviously, we'd prefer to just have an indoor arena right here at Too Far Out Farm. God will do what He will do and we praise Him everyday for who He is and for the way He accomplishes His plan of salvation by grace through our faith.
  - b. **TFO Farm Outpost Missions:** With horse hauling capabilities, we would be able to facilitate EAL sessions at community events, rehabs, churches, agencies, etc. for the purpose of offering E.A. services to those who cannot travel to the herd. We will bring the herd to them! For example, we were asked to present our herd and facilitate an equine-assisted session to attendees at a recovery conference in 2025. Transportation for two horses to this event in Reynoldsville, PA was estimated to cost over \$500. *(This was an opportunity to spread the Gospel to mental health professionals in southern PA! Please ask God to provide a horse hauling rig, so we can honor requests, such as this more affordably and effectively.)*
  - c. **Veterinary Cost Savings:** Having access to our own livestock hauling rig will also save us money in veterinary emergency situations and for routine medical care by transporting horses to the veterinary clinics, when necessary. For example, in January 2024, Titan required transport to Burton, OH for treatment at the Equine Specialty Hospital. Thankfully, The Lord provided his transport through a friend of the farm who gave us a deeply discounted price of \$90, however if this same veterinary urgency happened without the availability of a generous livestock hauler, we would have paid upwards of \$400 to \$500 for the service. Also, with this resource, we could save on veterinary barn call fees (\$100-\$120 per visit) by hauling the horses into the veterinary clinic for routine care.
4. **Horse hay for the year:** \$3,300 needed for the next 12-month hay supply. *(Mike & Deb ask for prayers that this need be met by September, so we can pay the farmer in advance to ensure an adequate supply for the winter.)*
  5. **Annual Vet check & farrier:** Traditionally, these routine expenses add up to about \$1,500/year. That's if we don't put shoes on the horses. *(Please pray for these needs to be met.)*

## 2026 - Strategic Planning in Progress:

1. Pray for God's continued guidance as we move, step-by-step in the Holy Spirit and day-by-day with Jesus, and TOGETHER as the TFO Farm community, one day at a time!
2. Deb will renew her Certified Recovery Specialist credential in May 2026.
3. Deb's PATH CTRI credential is current and remains valid until June 2027.
4. Deb's EAL & EAP credentials remain current for life.
5. Our strategic plan to rally community support and recruit new volunteers, and students consists of the following networking opportunities around our region:
  - a. Active participation in networking groups, such as Crawford County Community Council, Western PA Riding & Driving Club, Erie Resource Meetup, etc.
  - b. Hosting a table at various community events, such as CCCC Volunteer Fair (Jan.), Meadville MLK event (Jan.), WPRD Tack Swap (Mar.), Titusville Community Earth Day event (April), An Afternoon of Hope or AICDAC Recovery Conference (May), ECDAC Conference or Buhl Park Juneteenth Celebration (June), Bethel Life Recovery Community Connections (July), Family Resource Day (Aug.), Recovery Celebrations (Sep), Carelon NW Regional Forum (Nov.), Recovery is Community NWSA events, MHA Center activities. We were unable to attend any January and February events in 2026 due to Deb's shoulder surgery recovery, which limits the use of her right arm. We will not have a table at any March & April events for the same reason. We will resume setting up a table at monthly community events in May with the Afternoon of Hope event in Erie on May 15, 2026.
  - c. Speaking engagements, such as at conferences and meetings of the PA Equine Council, Crawford County Community Council, Recovery Hub, Celebrate Recovery, etc.
