

A meeting of the Board of Public Works was held on Thursday, August 18, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. at the City Building, 82 Main St., Hornell, NY.

PRESENT: Mayor John Buckley, Commissioner Jared Zigenfus, Commissioner Joseph Liberto, Public Works Superintendent Mitch Cornish, and City Clerk Melissa Logan.

ALSO PRESENT: None

ABSENT: Waste Water Treatment Plant Chief Operator Richard Dunning, Water Filtration Plant Chief Operator Leonard Fucci

Mitch Cornish spoke at the beginning of the meeting about the City of Hornell Water System Reservoirs and Transmission Main Improvements. He spoke on how the three reservoirs are connected and used. He handed out some information from LaBella's and spoke on the deficiencies and suggestions for the future and the possibility of grants for these needs.

He spoke about the Water Treatment Plant. The old clarifier is going to have the impeller and shaft replaced, under warranty, on the 23rd. There has been signal problems with flow and with the new clarifier, this will not be a problem. Looking to put a new magmeter in. The WTP has been using about 2.2 million -2.6 million gallons/day and the WPCP is getting about 1.6 million gallons/day. We believe this is due to swimming pools, watering lawns and car washes, etc. At the WPCP the UV project is under construction.

Public Works has milled a few streets, Maple, Church, Miles and Lincoln Street. Next up is Davenport, Hornell and Pine Streets. The BOCES House is 75% completed. They are working on the garage, painting interior, putting kitchen in. Waiting on gas company for gas service. Still have to work on fencing, sidewalk and landscaping.
