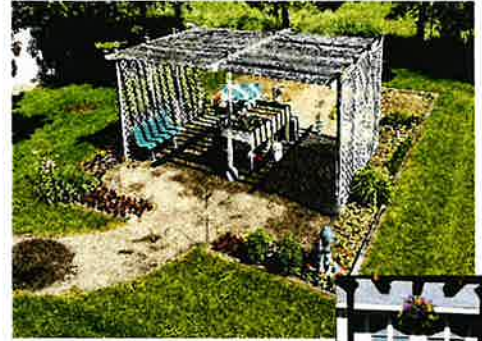

Jefferson and the
Committee of
Five authored
and penned the

Declaration of Independence. After 86 edits, the Third Continental Congress voted to approve the Declaration on July 2, 1776. Revisions were completed by the committee and approved on July 4th, 1776. The document proclaimed the Thirteen Colonies were officially an independent nation and free of British rule. July 4th became the auspicious moment to celebrate the founding of the United States of America even though the document was not fully signed by all members of the Continental Congress until August 2, 1776.

The Declaration highlights three key ideas: All men are created equal and have rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; the government is responsible for protecting those rights; and people have the right to defend these rights for themselves and their fellow Americans.

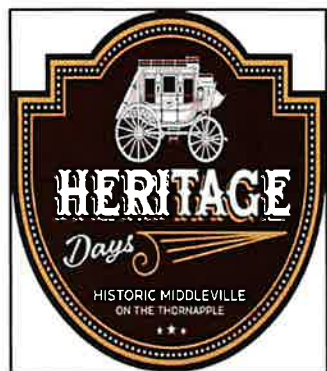


Many 4th of July traditions have been around for many years.

- 1. Fireworks displays are the most iconic of all Fourth of July revelries. The first celebration came in earnest on July 4, 1777**
- 2. The Bristol Fourth of July Celebration in Rhode Island holds its own with a legacy stretching back to 1785. As the nation's oldest continuous Independence Day parade, it stretches 2.5 miles and features a mix of historic reenactors, decorated floats, and local bands.**
- 3. This use of the flag's colors on everyday items grew in popularity in the 1900s.**
- 4. For over a century, Seward's Mount Marathon Race has challenged runners to race up and down a 3,022-foot mountain every Fourth of July.**

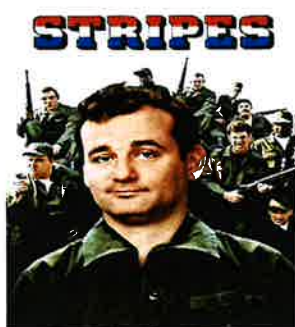
