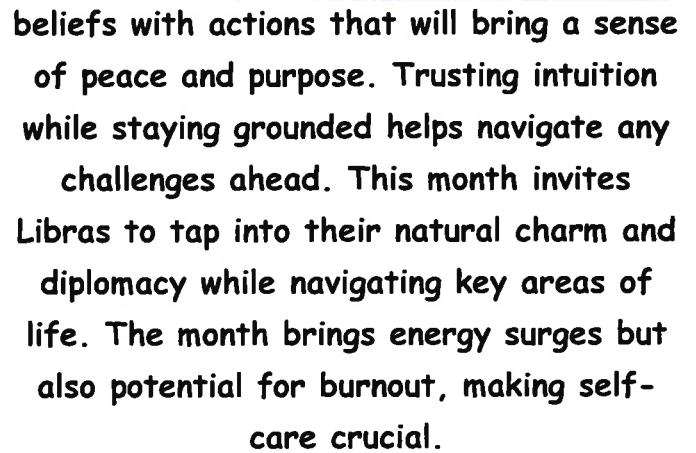

Dogwood: purplish red



Beech: light tan

Red maple: brilliant scarlet

Sugar maple:
orange-red

Black maple: glowing
yellow

Striped maple: almost colorless
