*To be judged on flavor, lightness, general appearance and crumb.

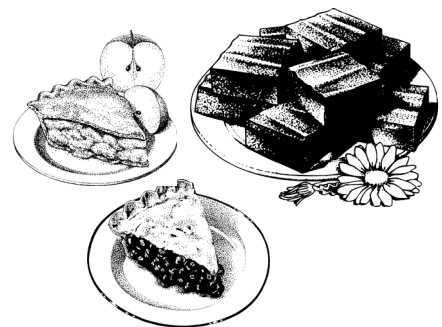

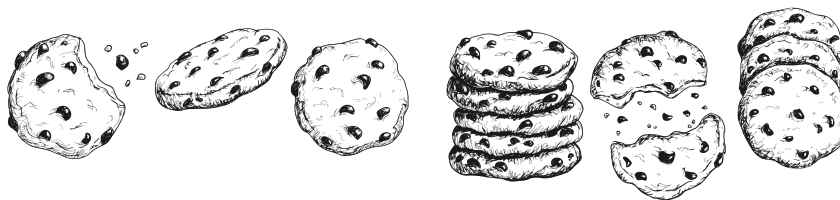

Pennsylvania's Incredible! ANGEL FOOD CAKE CONTEST RULES

1. Open to any individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Angel Food Cake contest at any other fair in 2025.**
3. The Cake and any Fillings and Frostings must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.). Any decorations must just be edible.
4. The recipe shall include eggs that were produced in Pennsylvania, if possible.
5. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting. *(All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be Returned.)*
6. Recipe(s) listing the ingredients and the preparation instructions must be submitted with the entry (printed on one-side of 8-1/2" x 11" size sheets of paper). Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back of all the pages. *(All recipes and cakes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)*
7. Refrigeration is NOT available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned, or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor (smell, taste, flavoring)	40 points
Inside Characteristics (texture & lightness)	30 points
Overall Appearance (surface, size, color)	20 points
Topping, Icing or Decoration	10 points

37th ANNUAL BLUE RIBBON APPLE PIE CONTEST RULES

1. Open to any individual amateur baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Blue Ribbon Apple Pie contest at any other fair in 2025.**
3. The Apple Pie, including fillings and crust, must be made from scratch with edible ingredients. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.) Any decorations must just be edible.
4. Recipe **must include at least 60% apples in the filling.** It does not need to be a "traditional" two crusted apple pie and it can have a variety of fillings.
5. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a food safe disposable pie pan. *(All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)*
6. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 1/2" by 11" sheets of paper. The recipe must list all the ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. *(All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)*
7. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
8. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

Flavor	35 points
Filling: consistency, doneness, moistness & flavor	25 points
Crust: color, flavor, texture doneness	20 points
Overall Appearance	15 points
Creativity	5 points

2025 HOMEMADE CHOCOLATE CAKE CONTEST

RULES:

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this Homemade Chocolate Cake contest at any other fair in 2025.**
3. The Cake and any Fillings and Frostings must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (*ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*). Any decorations must just be edible.
4. Cake recipe **must feature chocolate or cocoa** as a main ingredient.
5. Entry must be a **layered chocolate cake**. **The finished overall size of the cake, including decorations, shall not exceed 12" high by 12" wide by 12" deep.**
6. Entry **must be frosted** and frosting must also be made from "scratch" (*no pre-packaged frosting*).
7. The entire cake entry must be submitted for judging **on cardboard or other food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
8. The Cake entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
9. Recipes must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
10. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.

2025 PA Preferred® Junior Baking Contest Cookies, Brownies and Bars

The goal of the PA Preferred® Baking Contest is to encourage young people across the Commonwealth to participate in Pennsylvania's agricultural fairs by showcasing Pennsylvania grown and produced products in their contest entries.

RULES:

1. Open to any individual **amateur** baker (ages 8 through 18 at the time of the fair's contest) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. **Entrants may NOT have won 1st place in this PA Preferred® Junior Baking contest at any other fair in 2025.**
3. Entry must be **six (6) individual sized portions** of the baked entry item (cookies, brownies or bars).
4. The Cookies, Brownies or Bars, and any fillings and frostings, must be **made from scratch with edible ingredients**. No pre-packaged ingredients may be used (*ex: no pre-made mixes, cookie dough, pie crust, frosting, etc.*). Any decorations must just be edible.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred® or locally produced ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients include grains (*such as oats or flour*), butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. **A PA Preferred® logo is not required** because not all PA Preferred® products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient (*see attached example*). Contact RA-AGPAPPreferred@pa.gov for any assistance with qualifying ingredients.
7. Entry must be submitted for judging **on a food safe disposable setting**. (*All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.*)
8. The PA Preferred® entry and its recipes will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.
9. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of 8-1/2" x 11" sheets of paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. **The name of each PA Preferred® ingredient or locally produced ingredient must be clearly listed along with the name of the source that made/grew the product** (*ex: PA Preferred Milk – Galliker's brand; or Apples - Smith Farm Orchard*). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages.
10. Refrigeration is not available at the fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
11. **Judging Criteria:**

(texture, even grain, evenly baked)	
Overall Appearance	20 points
(surface, shape, size, color))	
Topping, Icing, Decoration	10 points

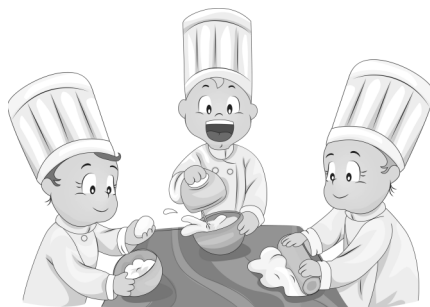

Youth Baked Goods

Section 2 Youth 4 - 7 Baked Goods Section 3 Junior 8 - 12 Baked Goods Section 4 Senior 13 - 18 Baked Goods

- *Baked products – one loaf, one cake, one-half dozen on board, in basket or on paper plate; each item completely covered with plastic wrap; to be judged on general appearance, flavor and texture
- *Canned fruits and vegetables – entries to be in pint or quart jars of clear glass with new covers; to be judged on general appearance, quality and neatness of package.
- *Jellies, jams and butters – to be in standard jelly glasses, covered with paraffin and removable lids; to be judged on appearance, flavor, consistency, and neatness of package.
- *Pickles and relishes – entries to be in pint or quart jars of clear glass with new covers, to be judged on size, uniformity, clearness, color, and appearance.
- *Canned foods to be judged on quality, general appearance and container. Canned jars will be opened for judging purposes.
- *Use standard Mason-type, clear quart/pint jars free of labels for preserving and exhibiting fruits, vegetables, and meats.
- *Use two-piece self-sealing lids (flat discs and metal screw bands) for sealing all jars of food.
- *Metal screw bands may be loosely applied while transporting jars to and from fair to prevent damage; however, screw bands must be removed from jars before exhibiting entries.
- *All food not in standard jars or not sealed with self-sealing lids will be disqualified by the judge.

- *Canned fruits and vegetables judged on quality, general appearance, and container which shall be standard clear glass jar free of labels, with new lid and cover.
- *Exhibitors are limited to one entry in each division of a class.
- *Entries must be packed within the year of exhibition.
- *Any entry may be opened by the judge if deemed necessary.
- *Use standard Mason type jars.
- *Use two-piece self-sealing lids - flat discs and metal screw bands - for sealing all jars that are free of non manufactured designs and colors.
- *Metal screw bands may be loosely applied while transporting jars to and from fairs, to prevent damage; however, screw bands must be removed from jars before exhibiting entries.
- *All food not in standard jars or not sealed with self-sealing lids will be disqualified by the judge.

- * Judged on appearance, flavor and consistency and neatness of package.
- * Jar must be sealed.
- * Butter - fruit which is cooked until soft. The pulp is then run through a sieve, making it smooth.
- * Honey spread - fruit products which use honey in the preparation as a substitution for part of the sugar.
- * Jam - a thick, sweet spread with pieces of crushed or chopped fruit.
- * Jelly - a clear, sweet spread made from fruit juice, pectin and sugar, which holds its shape when unmolded.
- * Marmalade - thick spread using the pulp and rind of fruits.
- * Preserves - like jams except the pieces of fruit are large.
- * Conserves - preserves with nuts.
