

Description of the group classes:

Pen of Lambs - consists of one (1) ram lamb and one (1) ewe lamb

Pair of Yearlings - consists of one (1) ram and one (1) ewe

Flock - consists of one (1) ram, any age; one (1) ewe, 1 year and under 2 years; one (1) ewe, under 1 year

Breeder's young flock - consists of one (1) ram lamb; two (2) ewe lambs, all bred and owned by exhibitor

Get-of-Sire - consists of four breeding animals, any age or sex, the get of one (1) sire; need not be owned by the exhibitor.

Monroe County Bred and Owned Sheep

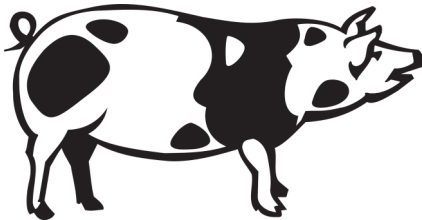
Two animals bred and owned (or co-owned) by Monroe County breeder. Animals can be of either sex and must have shown in previous classes.

PRE-REGISTER by July 23

1. Exhibitors will be expected to accept the stall assigned without controversy, and to cooperate with the Department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
2. Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals at shows shall be prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges. This includes sale advertising!
3. Swine considered for entry, must meet the P.A. Dept of Health specifications listed on page 5 of this premium book.
4. Immediately prior to unloading, all swine must be visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock committee.
5. Breeding Swine will be accepted for entry on Saturday, August 16, 2-4 pm.
6. All Breeding Swine will be removed from West End Fair Grounds on Tuesday, August 19, by 9 am.

Animal Health Regulations

IMPORTANT: ALL HEALTH PAPERS MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING. Swine for exhibition require a CVI valid 30 days after date of issue, and Ear Tag/Notch/Tattoo compliance.
