Statewide Impact



Texas AIM

State Funding: Texas Academic Innovation and Mentoring (AIM) is a partnership between TXBGC and the Sylvan Learning Centers to provide an after-school and summer academic remediation at 68 clubs serving 3,400 youth; FY26 funding: \$2,137,500



TEXSYN

State/Federal Funding: Texas Statewide Youth Services Network (TEXSYN) is aimed at positive youth development programming to prevent juvenile delinquency at 48 clubs serving 2,100 youth; FY26 Funding: \$1,650,000



FutureStrong

Federal Funding: Through the Texas Office of the Governor, FutureStrong supports life-skills training, crime prevention and safety at 25 clubs serving 1,250 youth; FY26 funding: \$220,000



At-Risk Food Program

Federal Funding: Through the Texas Department of Agriculture, the At-Risk Afterschool (CACFP) and Summer (SFSP) food program provides free meals and snacks to children during out of school time at 33 clubs serving 2,600 youth; FY26 funding: \$1,700,000
