FROM THE REGIONAL MANAGER -

SEPTEMBER WAS AN IMPORTANT MONTH FOR THE ACYS SERVICE, WITH ESSENTIAL SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAMS DELIVERED ACROSS THE REGION, AND TWO MAJOR REGIONAL SPORTS EVENTS HOSTED IN YIRRKALA (U15 GIRLS AFL X) AND GALIWIN'KU (BASKETBALL EASTERN CUP). I WOULD LIKE TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND THANK OUR ENTIRE ACYS TEAM FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS. THE QUALITY AND QUANTITY OF ACTIVITY DELIVERED IN SEPTEMBER WAS AMAZING!

IN OTHER NEWS, THE ACYS TEAM IS WORKING HARD PREPARING A NEW LIBRARY SPACE IN MILINGIMBI. THE OLD MILINGIMBI LIBRARY WILL SOON BE RELOCATED TO THE COMMUNITY REC HALL, WHERE A SEPERATE QUIET SPACE IS BEING PREPARED FOR COMMUNITY MEMEBERS YOUNG AND OLD. BUILDING OFF THE SUCCESS OF OUR NEW GALIWIN'KU AND GAPUWIYAK LIBRARY SPACES, THE NEW MILINGIMBI LIBRARY WILL BE A COMFORTABLE SPACE FOR READING, RESPITE, PUBLIC WIFI ACCESS, CELEBRATING COMMUNITY HISTORY / CULTURE AND MUCH MORE. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT ALL OF OUR COMMUNITIES HAVE ACCESS TO SPACES THAT ARE VALUED, AND SUPPORT BROADER COMMUNITY WELLBEING.

THE ACYS TEAM WILL ALSO BE REOPENING THE YIRRKALA YOUTH DROP IN CENTRE IN NOVEMBER. THIS SPACE HAS BEEN HEAVILY RENOVATED, INCLUDING A NEW LARGER SEPERATE KITCHEN AREA, WHEELCHAIR ACCESS RAMPS, A LARGER BATHROOM, NEW FLOORING, NEW PAINT, NEW FURNITURE, NEW LIGHTING AND MORE. THE NEW SPACE WILL OFFER YIRRKALA RESIDENTS A SAFE, VALUED AND QUIET SPACE FOR INDOOR ACTIVITY WITH YOUNG PEOPLE.

I LOOK FORWARD TO SHARING MORE EXCITING UPDATES AS THE YEAR DRAWS CLOSE TO AN END.

NEW STRUCTURE




THE ACYS PROGRAM IS MANAGED BY REGIONAL MANAGER ACYS PETER DUNKLEY.


ACTIVE COMMUNITIES FOCUSES ON PROACTIVE, CONSISTENT YEAR-ROUND EARLY INTERVENTION ACTIVITIES FACILITATED AFTER SCHOOL HOURS AND DURING SCHOOL HOLIDAYS. ADDITIONALLY, WE FACILITATE MULTIPLE ANNUAL REGIONAL EVENTS, ENGAGE DIVERSE EXTERNAL PROVIDERS WHO ARE DOMAIN EXPERTS IN A RANGE OF YOUTH ENGAGEMENT DISCIPLINES, AND WE NOW RUN COMMUNITY LIBRARIES IN SEVERAL COMMUNITIES.

ACTIVE COMMUNITIES IS MANAGED BY ACTIVE COMMUNITIES MANAGER, DANIEL RULE.

YOUTH SERVICES FOCUSES ON MORE TARGETED SUPPORT FOR AT RISK YOUNG PEOPLE EXPERIENCING LOW TO MODERATE VULNERABILITIES. EARC ACCEPT REFERRALS, PROVIDE ASSESSMENT, AND TRIAGE YOUNG PEOPLE UNDER 3 SEPARATELY FUNDED BUT COMPLIMENTARY PROGRAM AREAS.

STAFF SPOTLIGHT: VICKI WASSENS



I MOVED TO GALIWIN'KU TO WORK WITH EARC TO START A NEW CHAPTER IN MY BOOK OF LIFE. I LOVE WORKING WITH YOUNG PEOPLE AND WAS SEARCHING FOR YOUTH WORK JOBS IN MY HOMETOWN IN NSW AND SOMEHOW THE ACYS ROLE IN NT POPPED UP. PREVIOUSLY, I WAS WORKING IN A SCHOOL AND HEAVILY INVOLVED AS A SPORTS VOLUNTEER AND COACH. I HAD WORKED WITH A LOT OF INDIGENOUS ATHLETES AND FAMILIES AND ADMIRED THEIR FAMILY CULTURE. IN MOVING TO GALIWIN'KU, I WANTED TO BETTER EDUCATE MYSELF ABOUT FIRST NATIONS CULTURE AND SPIRITUALITY, AS WELL AS BEING ABLE TO OFFER SOMETHING TO COMMUNITY.

WORKING IN THIS CONTEXT, I'VE BECOME MORE EMPATHETIC AND HAVE ADAPTED MY APPROACH AS MY CULTURAL UNDERSTANDING HAS DEVELOPED. A COUPLE OF MY KEY WORK SKILLS ARE TIME MANAGEMENT AND MULTITASKING – AND THESE SKILLS HAVE GONE TO A WHOLE NEW LEVEL IN THIS ROLE. I AM CONTINUING TO GROW AND LEARN EACH DAY – DEVELOPING BOTH PROFESSIONALLY AND PERSONALLY.

IN THE FUTURE, I'M LOOKING TO CHALLENGE MYSELF TO DEVELOP MORE CULTURALLY APPROPRIATE LIBRARY ACTIVITIES. I'M LOOKING TO EXPAND AND IMPROVE OUR PROGRAM. I'M CONTINUALLY CHALLENGING MY MINDSET AND TRYING TO THINK OUTSIDE THE BOX.

IN THE GRAND FINAL OF THE EASTERN CUP I WAS CRYING MY EYES OUT. GALIWIN'KU WERE COMPETING AND THE PASSION, ENERGY AND ENTHUSIASM FROM THE CROWD WAS OVERWHELMING. I WAS THINKING – "WOW, LOOK WHAT WE DID! LOOK WHAT THEY'RE DOING!" I AM ALL GOOSEBUMPY TALKING ABOUT IT NOW. OLD YOLNGU AND LITTLE YOLNGU WERE ALL WANTING TO HIGH FIVE AND MAKE EACH OTHER LAUGH. THE OPPORTUNITY TO ENGAGE WITH COMMUNITY HAS BROUGHT ME GREAT JOY!

IT'S GREAT TO HAVE FAFT VISIT OUR SPACE ON FRIDAY'S. I LOVE SEEING THE REC HALL OVERRUN BY TWO-YEAR-OLD'S GLIDING ON THEIR TUMMIES ON SKATEBOARDS. IT'S A JOY TO PROVIDE THIS FOR YOUNG PEOPLE.

AS TIME GOES ON – OUR 'COMMUNITY HUB' CONTINUES TO GROW. ALL AGES CAN VISIT THIS WELCOMING, SAFE SPACE. IT'S MUCH NEEDED FOR RESPITE AS WELL AS FOR ACTIVITY. IT'S OPEN FOR ALL OF COMMUNITY – NOT JUST FOR YOUNG PEOPLE.

I'VE ENJOYED DEVELOPING RELATIONSHIPS WITH YOUNG PEOPLE AND THE GALIWIN'KU COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE – IT'S BEEN VERY REWARDING. I'M GRATEFUL TO THE COMMUNITY FOR TEACHING ME MANY CULTURAL THINGS. I'M LOVING EVERY MOMENT.

YOUTH SERVICES SEPTEMBER UPDATE

THIS MONTH, OUR YOUTH SERVICES TEAM HAS BEEN BUSY SUPPORTING THE ACTIVE COMMUNITIES PROGRAM WITH REGIONAL EVENTS AND RUNNING ENGAGING ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS.

IN MILINGIMBI, OUR YOUTH SUPPORT COORDINATOR, TAYLOR, HAD A GREAT TIME TEAMING UP WITH MIWATJ HEALTH TO DELIVER EDUCATION SESSIONS ON IMPORTANT TOPICS LIKE SMOKING (YAKA ŊARALI), ALCOHOL AND OTHER DRUGS (AOD), AND GENERAL HEALTH AWARENESS. THESE SESSIONS WERE NOT ONLY INFORMATIVE BUT ALSO A FUN AND ENGAGING WAY TO CONNECT WITH YOUNG PEOPLE IN THE COMMUNITY.

TAYLOR'S ROLE AS THE YOUTH SUPPORT COORDINATOR IN MILINGIMBI IS TO SUPPORT YOUNG PEOPLE WHO MAY BE EXPERIENCING LOW TO MODERATE VULNERABILITIES, SUCH AS VOLATILE SUBSTANCE USE. WHILE THIS IS NOT A CLINICAL REHAB SERVICE, TAYLOR IS TRAINED TO OFFER SCREENING, ASSESSMENTS, AND THERAPEUTIC ACTIVITIES TO HELP YOUNG PEOPLE BUILD CONFIDENCE, REDUCE RISKY BEHAVIOURS, AND STAY ON A POSITIVE PATH.

WHEN NEEDED, TAYLOR ALSO WORKS WITH YOUNG PEOPLE TO CREATE PERSONALISED YOUTH SUPPORT PLANS. THESE PLANS OFFER ONGOING GUIDANCE AND, IF NECESSARY, CAN INCLUDE REFERRALS TO MORE SPECIALISED YOUTH AOD SERVICES OR OTHER SUPPORTS.

WE ARE PROUD OF THE POSITIVE IMPACT OUR TEAM IS MAKING, AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO CONTINUING THIS IMPORTANT WORK IN THE MONTHS AHEAD!

ACTIVITY PROVIDER REPORT

29 SEPTEMBER - 1 OCTOBER 2025 MILINGIMBI ART AND CULTURE - MILINGIMBI

OVERVIEW: THROUGH DISCUSSION WITH ARTISTS AND TRADITIONAL ELDERS AT MILINGIMBI ART AND CULTURE, IT BECAME CLEAR THAT ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT NEEDS WITHIN OUR COMMUNITY IS TO ENSURE THAT THE RICH CULTURAL HERITAGE AND TRADITIONAL PRACTICE OF WEAVING IS PASSED DOWN TO YOUNGER GENERATIONS. OUR SENIOR WEAVING ARTISTS DEVELOPED THIS SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM TO PROMOTE ENGAGEMENT WITH THE ART CENTRE AND ENCOURAGE A NEW GENERATION OF EMERGING FIBRE ARTISTS TO EXPLORE THEIR CRAFT. THE LEAD FACILITATORS WERE: ELIZABETH RUKARRIWUY GARRAWURRA, ROSLYN MARKAPU, MANDY BATJULA GAYKAMAŊU, MARGARET GAMUTI WITH HELEN GANALMIRRIWUY GARRAWURRA OVERSEEING THE TEACHING.

ACTIVITIES: FOR THREE CONSECUTIVE DAYS, SENIOR WEAVERS GUIDED AND SUPPORTED YOUNG MIYALK (WOMEN AND GIRLS) TO LEARN WEAVING PRACTICES AND CONNECT TO LOCAL FIBRES, CULTURE, AND COMMUNITY. PARTICIPANTS WERE INTRODUCED TO THE FULL PROCESS OF FIBRE ARTMAKING—RESPECTFULLY COLLECTING PANDANUS AND JUNGLE VINE, STRIPPING AND DRYING FIBRES, PREPARING AND COOKING NATURAL DYES, AND BEGINNING TO FORM WEAVING COILS.

PARTICIPANT ENGAGEMENT: MOST PARTICIPANTS PARTICULARLY ENJOYED THE PREPARATION OF DYE MATERIALS AND EXPERIMENTING WITH NATURAL "BUSH CHEMISTRY" TO UNDERSTAND HOW LOCAL PLANTS ARE USED TO COLOUR AND STRENGTHEN FIBRES. THE WORKSHOPS CREATED A CULTURALLY SAFE SPACE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO LEARN, SHARE STORIES, AND EXPRESS THEMSELVES CREATIVELY ALONGSIDE RESPECTED SENIOR ARTISTS.

OUTCOMES:

- ENCOURAGED THE NEXT GENERATION OF EMERGING FIBRE ARTISTS
- PROVIDED MEANINGFUL FUTURE EMPLOYMENT PATHWAYS AND SUSTAINABLE INCOME OPPORTUNITIES
 PRESERVED TRADITIONAL CULTURAL PRACTICES
- BUILT POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND PROVIDED A CREATIVE SPACE FOR THE YOUNGER GENERATION TO EXPRESS THEMSELVES

IMPACT: THE WEAVING WORKSHOPS STRENGTHENED INTERGENERATIONAL CONNECTIONS AND RENEWED ENTHUSIASM AMONG YOUNG PARTICIPANTS TO CONTINUE LEARNING AND WEAVING AT THE ART CENTRE. THE PROGRAM SUPPORTED THE CONTINUITY OF CULTURAL PRACTICE, PROVIDING SKILLS AND CONFIDENCE THAT CONTRIBUTE TO BOTH CULTURAL AND ECONOMIC SUSTAINABILITY FOR MILINGIMBI'S FUTURE ARTISTS.





ACTIVITY PROVIDER REPORT

29 SEPTEMBER - 1 OCTOBER 2025 BULA'BULA ARTS - RAMINGINING

LED BY RAMINGINING ARTISTS EVONNE RRARAYPUM, DOROTHY DJANPALIL, JOY BINDINDJILIL, JOY BURRUNA, AND ANGELA MALIBIRR, THE BULA'BULA ARTS PAINTING WORKSHOPS WERE BURSTING WITH CULTURE, CONNECTION AND CREATIVITY. OVER THREE DAYS, GROUPS OF BRIGHT YOUNG ARTISTS PICKED UP THEIR BRUSHES TO PAINT THEIR TOTEMS, LEARNING TRADITIONAL TECHNIQUES AND STORIES ALONG THE WAY. AS THE SESSIONS WENT ON, THE ENERGY GREW — EVERYONE CAME TOGETHER TO CREATE FOUR STUNNING LARGE-SCALE PAINTINGS, TWO DHUWA AND TWO YIRRITJA CANVASES, CELEBRATING THEIR CULTURAL MOIETIES. THE WORKSHOPS BECAME A JOYFUL SPACE FOR SHARING, LEARNING, AND CONNECTION, AS SENIOR ARTISTS PASSED DOWN KNOWLEDGE AND THE CHILDREN PAINTED WITH PRIDE, ENTHUSIASM, AND A REAL SENSE OF BELONGING.

ACYS COORDINATOR, DARRAN WYATT, SAID OF THE WORKSHOPS "THE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO ATTENDED ENGAGED IN THE WORKSHOPS REALLY WELL, LEARNING TRADITIONAL PAINTING, WHILE GAINING OTHER VALUABLE INSIGHTS FROM ELDERS AROUND MIXING COLOURS, CORRECT TECHNIQUE WITH A PAINT BRUSH AND INDIGENOUS PATTERNING. AC&YS STAFF ARE LOOKING FORWARD TO DOING MORE WORKSHOPS WITH BULA'BULA ARTS IN THE FUTURE. THIS WILL ENSURE THE YOUNG PEOPLE CONTINUE TO EXPAND ON THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF TRADITIONAL INDIGENOUS PAINTING AND TECHNIQUES, WHILE ALSO PROVIDING POSITIVE CONNECTIONS TO BOTH COMMUNITY AND CULTURE.


