Position Aims: To provide quality sexual health and blood borne virus clinical care to young people aged 12-25 years and NTAHC community members in Darwin and Katherine.

Selection Criteria:

Essential:

1. Current AHPRA Registration
2. Demonstrated advanced knowledge, skills and experience in dealing with sexual health service provision including up to date knowledge and experience in the application of ethical, legislative and regulatory requirements pertaining to service delivery.
3. Demonstrated high level written and oral communication, organisational, and time management skills
4. Demonstrated experience and skill in the use of computer applications, including electronic data management, to support service delivery, research, evaluation and communication.
5. Proven ability to work effectively both unsupervised and as part of a multi-disciplinary team.
6. Demonstrated knowledge, experience and a commitment to the principles of quality management including the ability to participate in planning, implementing and evaluating service delivery
7. Awareness, understanding and experience of work in a cross cultural environment particularly in relation to Aboriginal culture and gender diversity.
8. Ability to travel on a regular basis.
9. Willingness to obtain an Ochre Card and undergo a criminal history check
10. NT Driver's License

Desirable:

1. Postgraduate qualifications and/or certificates in nursing practice, and/or related public health, primary health care, management, education and training.

Aboriginal people and people living with HIV or chronic HBV or HCV are encouraged to apply

Responsibilities:

1. Work in partnership with NTAHC, SARC and headspace medical, nursing and administrative staff to provide clinical care, education and support for clients with or at risk of sexually transmitted infections and blood borne viruses.
2. Work in partnership with other Government and Non-Government agencies to provide a multi-agency approach to sexual health that is coordinated and complementary.
3. To provide evidence-based information, education and support to clients particularly in relation to sexual and reproductive health
4. Participate in clinical audits and quality improvement activities
5. Liaise with general practitioners and other primary health care staff including remote health practitioners to provide information and education to support quality care
6. Manage information systems, including electronic databases, statistical collection, and patient review and recall systems including follow up.
7. Prepare and submit reports and acquittals as required within the grant agreement
8. Contribute to development of policies and protocols relating to sexual health clinics
9. Support the provision of a safe working environment and safe and effective health care services through participation in the Continuous Quality Improvement Program, and adherence to relevant legislation
10. Participate in promotional activities via multimedia programs including media releases and telecommunications.
11. Other duties as directed by the NTAHC Executive Director
