ADVOCACY IN ACTION: HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE 89TH TEXAS LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The 89th Texas Legislature session came to a close June 2, 2025. We had a successful advocacy day with great representation from professionals and students. Personally, it was my first time participating and I learned so much. I enjoyed meeting students and professionals who are passionate about audiology and who want to improve accessibility, reimbursement, and ethical practice.

Bills that were passed impacting our profession involved some rule changes with TDLR (HB 904 and HB 905).

Other bills included:

HB 11 by Phelan and SB 2531 Middleton- TDLR licensure reciprocity agreement. This bill creates a universal licensure recognition program. TDLR will have to identify state laws that prevent the department from entering into a reciprocity agreement with a licensing authority in another state.

SB 1818 by Sen. Kelly Hancock will require an agency that issues a professional occupations license to promptly issue a provisional license to a military service member or military spouse while waiting for the confirmation of the issuance of a license. These provisional licenses shall expire in 180 days if the regular license cis not issues.

HB 1700 Telehealth by Rep. Caroline Fairly. The bill requires all agencies with regulatory authority over health professions providing telehealth services to adopt rules standardizing formats, patients consent forms, retention of patient records and appropriate standards of care

Finally, if you are not a TAA member, please consider joining. Austin Advocacy Day 2025 has demonstrated the value in supporting the Texas Academy of Audiology. Government policy and advocacy is a fraction of what TAA does for the profession, and I hope you will consider supporting the organization. Please encourage your colleagues and classmates to join as well. Our audiology voice is strongest when we use it together. 2025-2026 membership annual renewal will open after the Denton conference and Lifetime Membership is available now!




STUDENT ENGAGEMENT AT TAA 2025 | PRESENT, VOLUNTEER, AND PREPARE FOR YOUR FUTURE


Submission Guidelines

- **Research** submissions must include the (1) title of poster, (2) names of all authors, (3) abstract of 75 words, and (4) multiple choice question for audience about the research
- Clinical case study submissions must included (1) title of the case study, (2) name of the presenter, (3) summary of the case (75 words or less), and (4) multiple choice question for audience about the case
- Submissions must include the contact information (email; phone number; university/externship facility affiliation; and physical address) of the primary author (i.e., the entrant)

A panel of audiologists across the various areas of practice are available to answer all the students' questions about their future careers in audiology. 


STRENGTHEN OUR VOICE: SUPPORT PRO-AUDIOLOGY LEGISLATION WITH TAA PAC!
