## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



SHAWNA JACKSON, AU.D.

Congrats to all the newest licensed members of Texas Audiology and the AuD class of 2021! As a Texas Audiologist, you join an accomplished group of colleagues who have contributed to the growth and propelled clinical excellence for decades before you. I offer a few words of rules and guidance to not only you, but others who commonly have these questions...

- 1. Texas licensure incorporates the ability to diagnostically evaluate and rehabilitate the auditory system including the dispensing of hearing aids. There is no need for a separate license to dispense hearing aids in Texas. There are specific rules and regulations of what must be included in fitting devices including patient contract requirements, verification, and testing needs. Make sure you read and understand these rules. Don't just rely on employers to ensure you are doing what is correct for your licensure.
- 2. Texas has a written law for use of the term "Dr". "In using the title 'doctor' as a trade or professional asset or on any manner of professional identification, including a sign, pamphlet, stationery, or letterhead, or as a part of a signature, a person other than a person described by Section 104.003 shall designate the authority under which the title is used or the college or honorary degree that gives rise to the use of the title." (§104.004 of the Texas Occupations Code). This means, you should always specify that you are a doctor of audiology on professional writing or communication with patients.
- 3. Texas laws for hearing aids govern the requirements to fit and dispense hearing aids. The FDA regulates the "sale" of the hearing aid.
- 4. As you start your careers in Texas, make sure to include low-cost, annual renewal to the Texas Academy of Audiology in your budgeting, or if you are like me and easily forget small expenses, consider a lifetime membership so you don't have to worry about remembering membership dues yearly. Membership runs from January-January. Don't wait to renew just for conference as this adds the late fee and isn't it better to support your profession year-round?!?
- 5. Get involved! Make sure your membership or file stays up to date on TAA website so you can stay in touch with happenings, but remember, TAA can only support you with financial and professional support of our members. Getting involved increases your ability to network as well as your ability to practice!

I wish you well as you venture into employment in clinics, schools, hospitals, industry, research, and more throughout our great state of Texas!





## TAA NEWS FROM AUSTIN:

#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE




The Texas 87th Legislative Session has been an active legislative season and the members of the board of the Texas Academy of Audiology have been busy tracking, supporting, and participating in furthering many bills that were filed that could affect audiology professionals this year. Unfortunately, with the Texas Senate adjournment on May 31st, many of these bills have timed out. Here is an update on what we have been involved with over the past year. Three bills, HB4, SB 40, and HB 1560 are in their final stages of legislation and are expected to become law.

HB 4 a telehealth bill seeking to make permanent the temporary waivers issued during the pandemic to expand telemedicine, was filed by State Rep. Walter Thomas Price, IV, on 2/25/2021. These waivers proved beneficial to patients by providing for the use of technology in the delivery of timely and cost-effective healthcare. The utilization of telemedicine provides greater access to medical specialists statewide and this bill is intended to provide services under Medicaid and other public benefits programs, using telecommunications (telemedicine, telehealth, and technology-related health care services) or information technology and to allow for reimbursement for some of those services to Texas citizens and address the technology gaps that exist in more rural communities by incorporating audio-only services into the scope of the telehealth exceptions in the state. HB 4 follows the trend of recent legislation across the country by expanding the use of virtual health care services to address the underserved and more vulnerable Texas residents by providing for Medicaid reimbursement for certain services. The Bill also establishes minimum standards to ensure a managed care organization provides Medicaid recipients sufficient access to certain services and authorizes a federally qualified health center to be reimbursed for the originating site facility fee and/or the distant site practitioner fee for a covered telemedicine or telehealth service provided to a Medicaid recipient. This Bill passed the House on 04/15/21, passed the Senate on 05/24/2, and is awaiting governor's signature. So long as this bill is not vetoed in its final stage, we can expect HB 4 to become law.

Senator Judith Zaffirini, the second-highest ranking member of the Texas Senate filed a similar bill based on the success of temporary regulatory changes made due to COVID-19. SB 40, which would authorize health professionals regulated by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation, including speech-language pathologists, audiologists, and hearing instrument specialists, to practice via telehealth was filed on 11/9/2020. SB 40, which was sponsored Texas Academy of Audiology, also adds a definition of Telehealth within the Occupations Code, and includes in that definition of a health professional any health provider who holds a license issued by the state. SB 40 also allows for the remote supervision of assistants, apprentices, interns, or other similar trainees using telecommunications or information technology that continues the "Use of Telehealth health professional programs. The definition also states that the provision of telehealth shall meet the requirements of "direct care" or "direct observation." This bill passed the Senate on 4/13/21, passed the House on 5/18/21, and is awaiting governor's signature. So long as this bill is not vetoed in its final stage, we can expect SB 40 to become law.





HB 1560 (TDLR Sunset Bill) was filed by Rep. Craig Goldman and Sen. Dawn Buckingham on 3/10/2021. Following its most recent review, the Sunset Advisory Commission found TDLR performs critical functions for the state and should be continued for 12 years. However, to help alleviate administrative burden and allow TDLR to become even more efficient, the sunset commission recommends eliminating certain license types, removing unnecessary regulations, and streamlining certain licensing programs. HB1560 seeks to continue TDLR and the related Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation with statutory modifications aimed at implementing certain sunset commission recommendations and improving TDLR operations. HB 1560 passed the House on 5/3/21, passed the Senate on 5/24/21 and is awaiting governor's signature.

## FOUR OTHER BILLS (HB 440, 1633, 2545, AND 2566) WERE REMARKABLY CLOSE TO PASSING. THESE BILLS MADE IT OUT OF COMMITTEE AND PASSED THE HOUSE. UNFORTUNATELY, THEY ALL RAN OUT OF TIME AND DIED IN THE SENATE.

HB 440 Supporting health benefit coverage for hearing aids for children and adults was filed by Rep. Julie Johnson 11/10/2020. HB 440 was sponsored by the Texas Academy of Audiology and aimed to allow patients to upgrade to a hearing device that is more expensive that what their insurance policy would pay for if the patient is willing to pay the higher cost. This bill passed the House unanimously on 4/30/21 but Sen. Zaffirini was unable to get the bill set for a hearing, and it ran out of time in the Senate Business & Commerce committee. This bill is dead for this season.

HB 1633 The Audiology & Speech-Language Pathology Interstate Compact Bill is an occupational licensure compact which would allow licensees who choose to participate to expand their ability to practice in other states who have passed legislation to join the compact without having to obtain additional state licenses. The compact addresses increased demand to provide audiology and speech-language pathology services and authorizes in-person and tele practice across state lines. States participating in the compact communicate and exchange information, including verification of licensure and disciplinary sanctions; however, compact states retain the ability to regulate practice in their state. Currently Alabama, Kansas, Kentucky,

Louisiana, Nebraska, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Utah, West Virginia, and Wyoming are participating, and New Mexico has a bill in their legislature to join the Compact. On March 31st Rep. Ryan Giullen presented the bill pointing out that 8 states had already passed their compact bills and that Georgia would pass their shortly. Texas was hoping to be the 10th state – making the compact complete. Shawna Jackson, AuD (TAA president) testified on behalf of the Texas Academy of Audiology and shared a great story about her experience with patients having to travel to Dallas from out of state to see her. She explained that the compact would allow her to use the compact license and see her patients via telecommunications. Her testimony can be viewed at https://tlchouse.granicus.com/MediaPlayer.php?view\_id=46&clip\_id=20009. Larry Higdon with Texas Speech and Hearing Association also spoke in favor. HB 1633 passed the house on May 14th with 97 yes votes and only 46 no votes and was assigned to the Sen. Health and Human Services Committee

Unfortunately, the bill never got a hearing in the Senate Committee, so the bill is dead for this session. There seems to be a real hesitancy for legislators to give away state authority for people to practice inside Texas. There were several other bills creating interstate compacts for other healthcare professions that suffered the same fate.



HB 2545 which would have increased the age of mandatory insurance coverage for hearing aids and cochlear implants from the age of 18 to age 21 was presented and explained to the house committee on insurance on April 13th by Rep Shawn Thierry. Haley Owen, AuD (TAA VP of Legislative Issues) testified on behalf of the Texas Academy of Audiology in favor of this bill elucidating long-term consequences of untreated hearing loss such as quality of life, education, and limited employment issues. Her testimony can be viewed at https://tlchouse.granicus.com/MediaPlayer.php? view\_id=46&clip\_id=20283. This bill passed the House unanimously and was referred to the Sen. Business & Commerce Committee where it is has unfortunately run out of time is dead for this session.

HB 2566 The Newborn Hearing Screening Bill (/Senator Nathan Johnson) which would remove the requirement for written consent of a newborns parents before providing screening results to the state health department was filed by Rep. Drew Darby on 3/2/2021. This bill would also require that the Health and Human Services Commissioner develop guidelines to protect the privacy of patients. This bill passed the House on 5/8/21.



Several other bills of note to our profession (HB 980, 280, 3499, 3677, SB 466, 992, 1329) were filed, but either never made it out of committee or never passed the house. They are briefly summarized here however; all have run out of time for this legislative session.

HB 980 Relating to the reimbursement and payment of claims by certain health benefit plan issuers for telemedicine medical services and telehealth services was filed by Rep. Art Fierro on 1/6/2021 HB 980 would add a mental health professional to the definition of a "health professional" in the insurance code which requires reimbursement for telehealth services. The bill also would require health insurers to reimburse providers for telehealth services at the same rate as in-person services and would prohibit any waiver from these provisions.

SB 466 Relating to the licensing and regulation of speech-language pathologists and audiologists was filed by Sen. Angela Paxton on 1/26/2021. Sen. Paxton specifically identified speech-language pathology and audiology in her Telehealth bill for continuation of services and reimbursement for services provided by telecommunication. The bill did not receive a committee hearing and will not pass.

SB 992 Relating to the provision of telehealth services by health professionals located outside of this state was filed by Rep. Kelly Hancock on 3/3/2021. This bill would have allowed any medical professional licensed in another state to provide telehealth services to patients in Texas.

SB 1329 Relating to health benefit plan coverage for speech therapy services provided through telehealth services filed by Rep. Chuy Hinojosa on 3/10/2021.


HB 280 Relating to an action plan to expand telemedicine medical services and telehealth services and increase access to critical medical care and health care services in this Texas was filed by Rep. Phillip Cortez on 11/9/2020. This bill would require the Health and Human Services Commission to develop and implement an action plan to expand the use of telemedicine medical services by health care providers and increase the availability of critical medical care and health care services to residents in Texas. HB 3677 Relating to the coordination of Medicaid and private health benefits for Medicaid recipients with complex medical needs was filed by Tan Parker on 3/10/2021.

## PROFESSIONAL ISSUES

As Texas begins to emerge from the challenges of the pandemic and focus on what's next, the start of the 2021 externship application cycle is just around the corner. The past year has certainly presented many challenges to prospective externs and externship sites alike. However, for many years students have consistently described the process as stressful, confusing, and unstandardized. The fourth year is a critical step in the development of the next generation of audiologists as it provides an opportunity to translate academic knowledge to real-world clinical situations. High quality externship sites are always in demand to ensure the next generation is prepared to tackle the challenges of the changing hearing healthcare landscape.

In recent weeks, a group of audiologists including Dr. Ian Windmill, have launched the Audiology Clinical Education Network to promote standardization of the externship process. The network is focused on the application/acceptance timeline. Below is the network's proposed common timeline for the upcoming externship cycle for Fall 2021:

- September 10, 2021: Deadline for students to submit application materials to individual sites
- September 11, 2021: Externship sites begin interviewing applicants
- October 15, 2021: Interviews completed
- October 20, 2021: Offers of externships extended to students at noon eastern time
- October 24, 2021: Deadline for students to accept offers of externships
- Ongoing: Supplemental offers may be extended to students if positions are not filled
- November 20, 2021: Process closes

Whether you are an established externship site or considering opening your doors to an extern for the first time, the timeline above can serve as a starting point to ensure your clinic stays competitive for the best applicants.
