We are thinking of each and every one of you after last week's events. I am lovingly calling my week — "Little House on the Prairie." I wasn't a fan. I will try not to take our resources — water and power - for granted again. I know many of you feel the same. Praying most didn't have broken pipes to add insult to injury and hoping recovery is taking place.

On the professional front, in case you haven't heard, in Florida just last week, a group called Redesign Health (the parent company of Lively Hearing Corp: https://www.listenlively.com/) was successful in getting unanimous committee support for legislation they introduced eliminating the requirement for an audiological hearing evaluation before fitting hearing instruments on those 18 years of age or older.

(Florida HB 957, Senate: S700 Amendment 302884)

If this legislation passes, patients will have the right to forego ALL audiology evaluations by providing a waiver before purchasing amplification. This addition was attached to significant Legislation on Telehealth scheduled to be heard soon. These bills open the door for direct-to-consumer sales in Florida.

What if the Florida Academy of Audiology hadn't been there to notice this add-on?

Would YOU as a professional be happy with this change?

There are things that we shouldn't take for granted – including our profession of Audiology in Texas.

How does the idea of imminent direct-to-consumer sales of hearing instruments sound to those of you who evaluate, fit, and dispense hearing instruments in Texas? Keep reading...

Florida is one of the three largest states for hearing aid sales, in addition to California and <u>Texas</u>. Yes, Texas! <u>If this bill passes in Florida</u>, it amends Florida's Audiology Practice ACT/Licensing <u>Law</u>.

I can only imagine this group will want to head over to Texas to push this legislation here soon after.

Would you be OK with this? Would this be best for your patients and you?

Our TAA lobbyist, Brad Shields, and the TAA Board of Directors are watching this very closely...

Part of TAA's mission is to watch out for the "Bogeymen" who might try to come and change our professional practices here in Texas. I would personally consider this a Bogeyman in OUR professional backyard. Without TAA resources, we would likely never know.

- 5) HIDE any information from the directory that you choose by checking "Hide Above Field From" and then "Directory" and/or "Other Listings." Go through each section and remember to click "Save" under each section that you update.
- 6) Done!
