Steps for Students:

Friday, October 18th: Student Poster Session:

Our poster session will feature posters highlighting either clinical cases or novel research projects from students of the Texas AuD programs or externs at Texas facilities.

Submissions are open only to student members of TAA.

Students must be available on Friday, Oct. 18, 2024 from 2:30-3:00PM for poster presentations at the conference.

Presentations should document research projects (including novel research, results from pilot studies, or systematic literature reviews) or clinical cases in the areas of hearing or balance science. Cash prizes awarded to first and second place posters.

Submission Guidelines:

- Research submissions must include the (1) title of poster, (2) names of all authors, (3) abstract of 75 words, and (4) multiple choice question for audience about the research. Clinical case study submissions must included (1) title of the case study, (2) name of the presenter, (3) summary of the case (75 words or less), and (4) multiple choice question for audience about the case
- · Submissions must include the contact information (email; phone number; university/externship facility affiliation; and physical address) of the primary author (i.e., the entrant)

Important Updates on TDLR Licensing Verification and Cognition Screenings


The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) recently adopted rule changes, published in the May 10, 2024, issue of the Texas Register. These changes include two significant updates that are particularly relevant to our profession.

First, the new rules introduce an online verification process for licensing, which is expected to reduce administrative delays and help new licensees begin providing services in Texas more quickly. Previously, licensees were required to provide written proof of licensure and good standing in other states during their application process. This requirement often increased the administrative burden on the licensing bureau and delayed the processing of new licenses in the state. The changes will now allow TDLR to reference online licensure verification systems from other states during the processing of new audiology licensure applications in Texas.

Second, the Department has proposed adding cognition screenings as part of a comprehensive communication evaluation for audiologists. The Texas Academy of Audiology (TAA), including our team, supported this change, emphasizing that cognition screenings are "part of a holistic communication evaluation." It was noted in the TDLR rulemaking process that these screenings are "not a medical evaluation or diagnosis." As such, cognition screenings should not be portrayed as diagnostic assessments for cognitive issues or decline. It's crucial for licensees to market these services truthfully and in alignment with existing ethical standards to avoid any misleading information. The TDLR Code of Ethics (Rule 111.152, Advertising) prohibits licensees from presenting false, misleading, deceptive, or non-verifiable information about their services.

These updates reflect the evolving nature of our practice, and we encourage all members to stay informed and compliant with the new rules.
