On Monday, November 27, 2023, we lost a very dear friend, Kurt Trede.

Kurt has been a beloved part of our Audiology community for over 45 years. Many of us have stories about how and where we met Kurt, as he was one of the unforgettable ones. Kurt brought to our lives an abundance of sunshine, smiles, laughter, a willing listening ear, a genuine love of people, and a can-do, dedicated attitude that served us all well.

Whether you met Kurt when he worked for Acoustics Southwest, as one of the first representatives of the new hearing aid company Bernafon in the early 80s, or as the original Manager of Sales for Resound, and later at Oticon, and/or at his infamous "goat burying" parties of that era, one of the many Spring BBQs, or at a Shirkers meeting every Friday night at Mike & Charlie's in Austin years ago, you know the way he loved being with people. He was truly one of the good guys.

New CPT Codes for 2024: Fitting and Follow-up Services for Auditory Osseointegrated Devices Anna M. Jilla, Au.D., Ph.D. Jo Mayo Endowed Assistant Professor of Audiology Lamar University, Beaumont, Texas

Previously, no procedure codes existed for reporting services related to fitting, programming, verification, and follow-up for auditory osseointegrated devices (AODs). AODs come in various forms (surgical, nonsurgical, percutaneous, transcutaneous) and can be used for several indications such as conductive or mixed hearing losses or single-sided deafness.

With the implementation of new service codes for AODs, providers will no longer use 92700 (unlisted otorhinolaryngological procedure) for reporting services related to AOD fitting and follow-up. Beginning January 1, 2024, audiologists will use the following codes to report these services for AODs of any typesurgical, nonsurgical, percutaneous, transcutaneous.

Providers are reminded that timed codes follow the 51% rule where greater than 50% of the base time must be spent in procedure to report that code. For 92622, this means that a minimum of 31 minutes (i.e., >50% of 60 minutes) is needed to report that code. Procedures lasting less than 31 minutes should not be reported. For add-on units (92623), multiple units of this code may be reported, as appropriate. The timed add-on code (92623) should always be reported in conjunction with the base code (92622).

Start and stop times should be clearly documented in the clinical report. Time in procedure can include time spent in activating, fitting, programming, or verifying, but should not be used to report time spent in counseling (per CPT code definition).

92622 and 92623 should not be reported in conjunction with 92626 or 92627 as these are both timed codes. 92626 and 92627 remain available to report for any other pre-operative evaluations or on a separate day for post-operative evaluation.

Texas audiologists are encouraged to reach out to payers to assure appropriate updates to fee schedules and contracts. A letter template for payer advocacy is forthcoming and will be made available through the American Academy of Audiology (www.audiology.org).

New Auditory Osseointegrated Device Service Codes (effective January 1, 2024)	
CPT Code	Descriptor
92622	Diagnostic analysis, programming, and verification of an auditory osseointegrated sound processor, any type; first 60 minutes
92623	Diagnostic analysis, programming, and verification of an auditory osseointegrated sound processor, any type; each additional 15 minutes

Notes: Report each 15 minute increment in 92623 separately. 92623 is an add-on code and must be reported in conjunction with base service code (92622). Do not report 92622, 92623 in conjunction with 92626, 92627.





TAA 24th Annual Conference in San Marcos


