Q&A: 2024 Changes to Federal Employee Program (FEP) Hearing Aid Benefits

What changed for hearing aid claims in January 2024?

In early 2024, certain amendments were made to the Federal Employee Program (FEP) utilization management guidelines for Hearing Aids through federal plans coordinated by Blue Cross and Blue Shield (BCBS). These utilization management guidelines provide specifics on coverage requirements, such as demonstrating medical necessity or the need for prior approval or preauthorization.

Effective January 2024, there are now prior authorization (prior approval) requirements for reimbursement for prescription hearing aids under BCBS federal plans. These changes do not apply to over-the-counter hearing aids or personal sound amplification products; non-prescription hearing devices remain non-covered under the BCBS FEP program. This updated FEP guidance from BCBS notes that hearing aids without prior approval will not be covered in post-service review.

How do I submit for prior approval?

The process to obtain prior authorization seems to vary down to the state-level. Pre-authorizations have been obtained through health information exchanges and/or by faxing the pre-authorization form and supporting documentation to BCBS. Audiologists in Texas may consider using the Texas Standard Prior Authorization Form

(https://www.tdi.texas.gov/forms/lhlifehealth/nofr001.pdf) for their submissions.

Providers are still encouraged to also check with Blue Cross and Blue Shield FEP Provider Relations if other forms would be preferable or required.

What do I submit for prior approval?

With your prior approval form, be sure to also include: (1) audiologic report, (2) letter of medical necessity, and (3) copy of relevant office visit notes in support of medical necessity. A full list of medical necessity requirements can be found in the BCBS FEP utilization management guideline here: https://www.fepblue.org/-/media/PDFs/Medical-Policies/2024/January/UM-Guidelines/FEP-UM-Guideline-O05-Hearing-Aids-2024-benefit-update-PMPC-correction.pdf.

Briefly, these requirements note that hearing aids must be FDA-approved and dispensed with a prescription from a licensed healthcare provider (e.g., audiologist, physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant). Audiometric testing in support of medical necessity should have occurred within the six months prior to the hearing aid provision. Other documentation requirements (e.g., clinical appropriateness) are fully discussed and provided in the BCBS FEP utilization management guideline (see link above).

Are there any other medical necessity requirements?

Yes. The BCBS FEP utilization management guideline notes that air-conduction hearing aids are considered medically necessary for individuals with a moderate hearing loss (40 dB or greater pure-tone average). This 40 dB cutoff for medical necessity serves as the primary guidance, but the coverage policy also states "consideration should be given on an individual basis, for hearing loss of 40 decibels or less with a prescription from an audiologist."

What is the Texas Academy of Audiology doing to address these changes?

The Texas Academy of Audiology is working alongside other state organizations to discuss concerns about the hearing loss requirements for medical necessity. We are also working closely with national organizations to discuss concerns about administrative burden associated with prior approval requirements in healthcare. We will provide further updates as they become available. In the meantime, members are encouraged to contact







First "HearO of the Academy" Recipient named Dean of the Texas Senate

At the 2023 annual conference, the Texas Academy of Audiology awarded legendary **Texas Senator Judith Zaffirini** with the first HearO of the Academy award for her support of audiology legislation during the 88th Texas Legislative Session.

The HearO of the Academy award is presented to a non-audiologist for their exceptional support of the field of audiology and/or the patients we serve by focusing on issues that directly affect the profession or patients with hearing loss and balance disorders. The award confers an honorary TAA Lifetime Membership upon the recipient as an expression of the academy's gratitude and commitment to supporting patients with hearing and balance disorders across the lifespan.

Senator Judith Zaffirini (D-Laredo) is a trailblazing figure in Texas politics, serving as the first Hispanic woman elected to the Texas Senate. Representing the 21st Senatorial District since 1987, she is renowned for her advocacy in health and human services policy, particularly for vulnerable populations such as the very young, very old, very poor, veterans, and persons with disabilities. With an impeccable voting record and a staggering legislative output-including 1,388 bills and 38 substantive resolutions passed—she has solidified her bipartisan effectiveness. Recognized with over 1,200 awards and honors for her legislative achievements, Sen. Zaffirini's dedication to public service is matched only by her distinguished career as a communications specialist and educator, holding multiple degrees from UT-Austin and boasting 13 years of teaching experience. Adding to her distinguished list of accomplishments, on December 31, 2023 she was appointed as Dean of the Texas Senate-the first woman in Texas history to hold this position.






Attention All Pediatric Audiologists!
