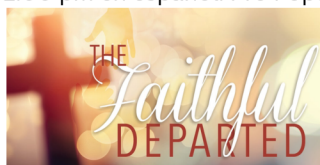

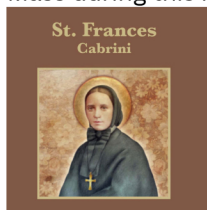

The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

John 2:13-22



When I was 22, I entered St. Peter's Basilica for the first time. It floored me. I could hardly take it in, its grandeur, majestic arches, vibrant colors, and the light that danced through its high windows. Somehow, amidst such splendor, I felt an overwhelming sense of belonging, as if I had finally come home.

Jesus reorients how we Catholics see sacred buildings. In today's Gospel he says, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:13-22). His riddle implies, shockingly, that his own body is now the fundamental dwelling place of God and humanity. The temple in Jerusalem has been superseded.

In our churches today – whether they mirror the basilica's grandeur or embrace humble simplicity – we experience architectural symbols of Christ's risen body. It is no accident we call them "churches": they make visible in brick-and-mortar Christ's body which is made up of the living stones we call Christians. Each church building, like St. John Lateran in Rome, or St. Peter's, or any other, is meant to be a vibrant sign of Christ's resurrected body. We should cherish and protect our churches as places where heaven touches earth, where we, as a community, are raised to the fullness of life in Christ. — Father John Muir

PROCLAIM THE FAITH YEAR 1 STUDY GUIDES

Monthly study guides can be used in personal prayer and for small group reflection.

NOVEMBER 2025

SCRIPTURE

Read 1 Cor 13:1-13

REFLECT:

1. This well-known passage from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians discusses love. From reading the passage, what do you think Christian love looks like? What are the false forms of love against which Paul cautions?
2. In verses 8-9, Paul talks about the enduring character of love. What do you think he means by this?
3. In verse 11, Paul talks about "putting away childish things" as he has grown into adulthood. In what ways is this applicable to our growth in Faith?

READ: A selection from *Via Fidelis* — Chapter 3

As we walk with a person in their journey of faith, we can gradually introduce them to Jesus and his good news: that Jesus is God, that he created us with great love, that he died on the cross and rose from the dead, and that in him we can have forgiveness and a new life!

This is "evangelization." We share Jesus with love and gentleness, in a manner adapted to that person's spiritual needs. As St. Paul reminds us, "love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends" (1 Cor 13:4-8).

Evangelization is not just for priests or church staff: it is for all of us! Jesus is counting on all of us to help everyone know and love him. It will not be easy, and will sometimes involve suffering, but we are offering what every person is truly longing for.

True joy is found in God. It is expressed by our faith in him. This joy comes from the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ. It is the answer to the deepest longing of the human heart and a foretaste here of the eternal joy that awaits those who love God. Our task is to accept this joy and share it with others, as St. John expressed: "I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete" (Jn 15:11).

REFLECT:

1. In this passage, the bishop discusses the gradualness of bringing someone to Christ by way of journeying together. How can we respond to this call in our own lives with the right balance of boldness and patience?
2. The bishop here reminds us that the call to evangelize is not simply for "priests and church staff" but for all of us. In what ways do we ourselves need to be reminded of this? How can we remind our fellow Catholics of this call?
3. In this selection, the bishop cites part of Paul's message to the Corinthians on love. Why is love something essential to the task of sharing the Gospel?

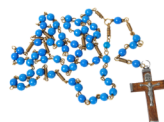

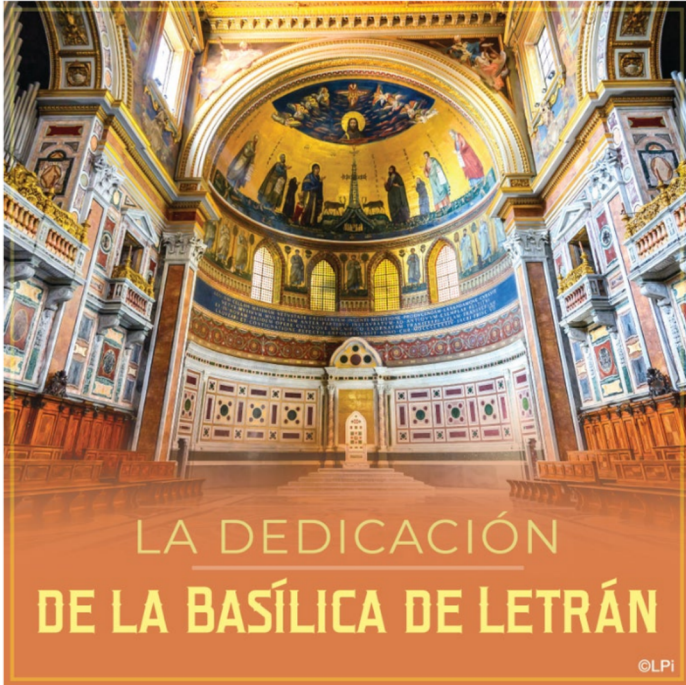

SAGRADA ESCRITURA

Leer 1 Corintios 13:1-13

REFLEXIÓN:

1. Este conocido pasaje de la Primera Carta de Pablo a los Corintios habla del amor. Al leerlo, ¿cómo crees que es el amor cristiano? ¿Cuáles son las falsas formas de amor contra las que Pablo advierte?
2. En los versículos 8 y 9, Pablo habla de la perdurabilidad del amor. ¿Qué crees que quiere decir con esto?
3. En el versículo 11, Pablo habla de “dejar atrás las cosas de niño” al llegar a la edad adulta. ¿Cómo se aplica esto a nuestro crecimiento en la fe?

LEER: Una selección de *Via Fidelis* — Capítulo 3

Mientras caminamos con una persona en su camino de fe, podemos presentarle gradualmente a Jesús y su buena noticia: que Jesús es Dios, que nos creó con gran amor, que murió en la cruz y resucitó de entre los muertos, y que en él podemos tener perdón y una nueva vida. Esto es la evangelización. Compartimos a Jesús con amor y dulzura, de una manera adaptada a las necesidades espirituales de cada persona. Como nos recuerda San Pablo: “El amor es paciente, es bondadoso, no es envidioso, ni jactancioso, ni arrogante, ni grosero. No insiste en su propio camino, no se irrita ni guarda rencor, no se alegra de la injusticia, sino que se alegra de la verdad. Todo lo sufre, todo lo cree, todo lo espera, todo lo soporta. El amor nunca se acaba” (1 Cor 13:4-8). La evangelización no es solo para sacerdotes o personal de la iglesia: ¡es para todos! Jesús cuenta con todos nosotros para que todos lo conozcan y lo amen. No será fácil, y a veces implicará sufrimiento, pero ofrecemos lo que cada persona anhela de verdad. La verdadera alegría se encuentra en Dios. Se expresa en nuestra fe en él. Esta alegría proviene de la Buena Nueva de la salvación en Jesucristo. Es la respuesta al anhelo más profundo del corazón humano y un anticipo de la alegría eterna que espera a quienes aman a Dios. Nuestra tarea es aceptar esta alegría y compartirla con los demás, como expresó San Juan: “Les he dicho estas cosas para que mi alegría esté en ustedes, y su alegría sea completa” (Jn 15,11).

REFLEXIÓN:

1. En este pasaje, el obispo analiza la gradualidad de acercar a alguien a Cristo mediante un camino compartido. ¿Cómo podemos responder a este llamado en nuestras propias vidas con el equilibrio adecuado de audacia y paciencia?
2. El obispo nos recuerda que el llamado a evangelizar no es solo para sacerdotes y personal de la iglesia, sino para todos nosotros. ¿De qué maneras necesitamos recordar esto? ¿Cómo podemos recordar este llamado a nuestros hermanos católicos?
3. En este pasaje, el obispo cita parte del mensaje de Pablo a los corintios sobre el amor. ¿Por qué es el amor algo esencial para compartir el Evangelio?
